

FCA to hear update on I-395 express lanes May 10

With construction on the I-395 express lanes slated to begin in July, representatives of the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and Transurban, the private sector partner in the project, will provide the Fairlington community with an update on the project at FCA's monthly meeting, May 10, at 7 pm in the Fairlington Community Center.

The first evidence of the project came in mid-March, with the nighttime closure of the HOV lanes several evenings. VDOT and Transurban said these lane closures were part of the "early work" to prepare for the construction activity that will begin this summer.

The I-395 express lanes project will extend the existing I-95 express lanes for eight miles north on I-395 to the D.C. line.

Components of the project include the following:

- Converting and upgrading the existing HOV lanes to toll express lanes
- Adding a third reversible lane from Edsall Rd. to just south of S. Eads St. near the Pentagon
- Improving the S. Eads St. interchange and transit and carpool access at the Pentagon
- Erecting sound walls to protect neighboring communities

Vehicles with three or more passengers would continue to use the express lanes for free, while vehicles with fewer people would pay a variable toll to use the express lanes. Toll pricing would depend on congestion on the road.

The additional lane will be added within the existing VDOT right-of-way and will not require the acquisition of major property adjacent to the corridor. In some instances, the installation of sound barriers may require a small addition to VDOT's right of way.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Fairlington Farmers Market opens for its third year on Sunday, May 7. The market is one of our community's great success stories. The return of all of last year's vendors, augmented by some new ones, testifies to the financial viability of the market. And the steady foot traffic each week demonstrates the neighborhood's embrace of this aspect of community life.

Benefits include easy access to fresh, locally grown produce and meats, support for local farmers, and healthier eating options. And since many of you walk to the market, it helps you meet your daily Fitbit quota.

But it's more than just quality products and enthusiastic vendors. The market is one of the major ways Fairlington residents visit with their neighbors. It's really become a community gathering place. One of my pleasures when I visit the market is just watching people stop and talk with each other. It definitely strengthens the sense of community.

Part of the market's magic lies in the fact that it's run by volunteers who live in Fairlington. That helps ensure that it's "our" market. The volunteers wear orange vests, so the next time you visit the market, take a minute to say thanks to them.

And also think about joining them. The market could use a few more people to help share the workload. You don't have to give a whole morning. Just a couple of hours each month would be helpful.

As we hoped when we launched the market planning effort five years ago, this is a neighborhood market, designed by and for people who live in Fairlington. It's kept the scale and feel of a neighborhood market, and hasn't created major problems of traffic or noise.

The market is operated by Field to Table, a non-profit that operates a couple of other markets in Arlington. Former Fairlington resident Rob Swennes is the sparkplug behind Field to Table and helped us realize our initial vision for a community market.

But the market does require money to cover a variety of expenses. And that's where the market's sponsors are key. FCA is a sponsor again this year, and most of last year's sponsors have renewed their commitment as well. Please support them, so that they can continue to support the market.

If you haven't yet checked out the market, I encourage you to do so. It's another of those special community attributes that makes Fairlington a great place to live.

It's a must-see: Take the Home and Garden Tour



The eighth biennial Home and Garden Tour, sponsored by the Fairlington Historical Society (FHS), will be held Saturday, May 13, from 11 am to 3 pm.

This year's tour features 10 homes and two gardens in North and South Fairlington that showcase a variety of renovated town- and apartment homes, including the rare Mt. Vernon model.

A peek into the present

The tour gives everyone a chance to do what we secretly all want to do—look inside our neighbors' properties to see what kinds of fabulous updates they have made. Many of the tour homes in the past have showcased unique kitchens where owners have removed walls, repositioned appliances, or built islands. Small bathrooms have been transformed into spa-like oases and tiny patios have been completely re-landscaped into beautiful outdoor sanctuaries.

The tour is a great chance for residents to get a first-hand look at finished renovation projects to gain fresh ideas and often meet the contractors who designed and executed the work.

A look at the past

The tour is a fundraiser for the FHS, a hidden treasure within our community that carries out the important work of preserving, protecting, providing awareness for, and promoting Fairlington's history. Organized in 2000, the FHS succeeded the Fairlington Historical Designation Committee, which had pursued and achieved Historic District status for Fairlington and placement on the Virginia Landmarks Register in December of 1998, and on the National Register of Historic Places in March of 1999.

"Receiving landmark status and historic district designation was an important achievement for Fairlington," notes FHS President, Terry Placek, "one largely accomplished by volunteers who painstakingly documented each structure and architectural detail in what was the largest housing complex in the country when it was built between 1942–44."

In 2003, Fairlington's 60th anniversary, the FHS re-published the definitive history of the community, a classic treasure of narratives and photographs, *Fairlington at 50: May 1943–May 1993*, written by the late Catherine D. Fellows and originally published by the FCA. The book was re-issued in 2012, following Fellows' death. Order forms are available on the FHS website.

FHS and FCA collaborate frequently on projects of historical and community-wide interest. Most recently, the two organizations have offered popular historic walking tours of the community—see the FHS website for the tour brochure.

Arlington County Board Member Katie Cristol visits FCA meeting

A small but engaged group of Fairlington residents turned out for the monthly FCA meeting on April 12. They were treated to candid remarks from a local celebrity: Arlington County Board Member Katie Cristol.

Cristol was elected to the five-member board in 2015 and currently serves as its Vice Chair. She is prominent in local Democratic party politics and helps to lead a wide array of initiatives, including the Arlington County Board and Arlington Public School's Joint Subcommittee on Facilities, the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission, and Project PEACE.


FCA President Guy Land, who has worked with Cristol on previous county projects, introduced her as "an exceptionally engaged, informed, and committed advocate." Land related the story of Cristol and her husband happily participating in the 2016 Fourth of July parade—albeit without much pomp or circumstance. "I am a fan of Fairlington," Cristol said, smiling.

Over the course of an informal 20-minute talk, Cristol offered both policy updates and personal anecdotes, often emphasizing the importance of political and social engagement to life in Arlington. She started with the state of the current county budget, which she described as "status quo" with two notable exceptions: Metro and public education. Both of these areas are experiencing major growing pains and will likely require increased funding.

Cristol noted that the county manager's proposed budget contains a two-cent increase in the property tax rate. The county board was to adopt the final budget in late April.

FCA Board Treasurer Ed Hilz capitalized on the Metro discussion to ask if the county board could influence improved bus service in Fairlington. A number of routes have been scaled back, or even cancelled, due to budget concerns or low ridership.

"We try to work across jurisdictions on issues like this," Cristol said, relating her experience with the Columbia Pike redevelopment project. But even board interest cannot guarantee any changes in a multilateral service resource like Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA).

(JFAC) project, specifically the redistribution (and reclamation) of public and private lands, and land use rules in general. Now these rules are getting a fresh look from Cristol and other board members, and in some interesting ways.

"This is something that we have been working on at many levels," Cristol stated. Citing a lack of quality childcare options, she suggested alleviating or adjusting land use rules in the county. This would, presumably, allow for future development or expansion of childcare

Abingdon school renovation project remains on track

The renovation and expansion of Abingdon Elementary School continues to be on schedule and on budget, Arlington Public Schools (APS) staff said at a briefing for the Fairlington community on April 4. "We're in a good position right now," Aji Robinson, the APS director for Abingdon, told the audience.

According to Robinson, all the foundations are complete, the new kitchen and cafeteria have been completed and are in use, the renovation of the existing classrooms on the north

side of the building has concluded, and the new gym will be complete in May.

Because all the foundation work has been done, APS will now do follow-up monitoring of the condo units adjacent to the property. An initial baseline assessment of those units was conducted last year before major construction began. Monitoring is slated for April 24 through May 24. Robinson pointed out that the contractor used auger piles rather driving piles, reducing the disruption to the neighbors.

Much of the work now is focused on the new three-story classroom addition on the north side of the building.

In response to audience questions about the removal of the "relocatables" (classroom trailers), Jeff Chambers, APS Director of Design and Construction, said that "the overall plan is to have no relocatables" at Abingdon. When those trailers will be removed depends on whether the construction work is completed on time for the opening of school in September.

Robinson cautioned, "We can't promise that the relocatables won't come back, but it is not likely in the near term." He noted that when the construction is completed, Abingdon will have excess student capacity and will continue to do so for several years, based on the most recent countywide enrollments projections.

The new capacity will be 725 students, but the projected maximum enrollment over the next five years is 680.

Chambers pointed out that projections call for an addi-

tional 6,000 students enrolled in Arlington schools in 10 years. Addressing that growth could require school boundary changes, and those might result in additional students at Abingdon.

Asked about the timetable for the restoration of the playing field, Robinson said that depends on the completion of the three-story addition. If the addition is completed on time, then restoration of the field would occur this fall, once the portable classrooms have been removed.

He explained that the key question is the paving of the track. Application of the asphalt is temperature-dependent and probably cannot be done after Thanksgiving.

Residents expressed concerns about construction workers parking on Fairlington streets. Robinson said the contractor is required to use parking spaces at Fairlington Presbyterian Church. He encouraged residents to write down the license plate numbers of workers who park on the street and report them.





Virginia elections coming up in May and June

May caucuses for Arlington County board and school board members kick off a busy election year in Virginia. In addition to these local contests, 2017 brings elections for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, and the Virginia House of Delegates (45th, 47th, 48th, and 49th Districts).

The Arlington County Democratic Committee (ACDC) will hold a caucus to select their nominee for county board and to endorse a candidate for school board. County board member Jay Fisette is not seeking re-election, and four candidates have qualified with the Democratic party for the nomination to replace him: Peter Fallon, Erik Gutshall, Kim Klingler, and Vivek Patil.

Under Virginia law, all school board candidates run as independents. Four candidates are seeking election to the school board position currently held by James Lander. In addition to Lander, the other candidates are Maura McMahon, Monique O'Grady, and Mike Webb.

At press time no Republicans had qualified for the county board. Audrey Clement is seeking election to the county board as an independent in the November election.

The Democratic party will hold an unassembled caucus, meaning voters show up and cast ballots but do not need to remain after they vote, on the following dates and locations:

- Tuesday, May 9, Key Elementary School, 2300 Key Blvd.—7 to 9 pm
- Thursday, May 11, Drew Model School, 3500 S. 23rd St.—7 to 9 pm
- Saturday, May 13, Washington-Lee High School, 1301 N. Stafford St.—11 am to 7 pm

In Alexandria, the local races on the ballot are for sheriff and commonwealth's attorney. There are no contested primaries for these offices.

Statewide primaries

Virginia is one of only two states (along with New Jersey) with gubernatorial races this year. Incumbent Governor Terry McAuliffe (D) is not eligible to run for re-election due to term limits established by the Virginia Constitution.

Democratic and Republican primaries will take place on Tuesday, June 13, from 6 am to 7 pm, at each of the Fairlington community centers (North Fairlington residents will once again vote at the Fairlington Villages Community Center, 3005 S. Abingdon St., due to ongoing construction at Abingdon Elementary).

Alexandria residents who live in Fairlington will vote in the statewide primaries at the NOVA Arts Center, 4915 E. Campus Dr.

The deadline to register to vote is May 22.

Because you do not register to vote by political party in Virginia, any voter may choose to vote in either primary. Voters make that choice when they check in at the polls, and they can only vote in one primary.

Democratic candidates for Governor are Lt. Governor Ralph Northam and former Congressman Tom Perriello. Republican candidates are GOP consultant Ed Gillespie, Prince William County Supervisor Corey Stewart, and Virginia State Senator Frank Wagner.

Virginia Delegate Mark Levine, who represents most of Fairlington, has no Democratic or Republican opposition. Neither does Charniele Herring, who represents the Alexandria part of Fairlington.

General elections will take place Tuesday, November 7. For more information, including a list of individuals who have filed documents to date indicating they intend to run for office, please visit vote.arlingtonva.us/elections/.


Fairlington streets on repaving list


The repaying season began in mid-March and ends in mid-October. A notice will be distributed to each residential address along the affected streets to notify them that their street has been selected for repaying. A door hanger, along with "No Parking" signs, will be distributed 24 to 48 hours prior to the start of the repaying operation.

Once the repaying has been completed, the county then repaints the areas that are available for on-street parking. In the past this has resulted in less space for onstreet parking.

facilities. A review certainly seems to be overdue: Arlington's childcare ordinance was last updated in 1981, according to ARLNow.com.

Cristol also pointed out that the JFAC approach is part of a larger effort to strengthen the collaboration between the county board and the school board, as well as better engage the public, in making decisions about the siting and use of public facilities, such as schools, bus parking lots, and other demands for public services.

A few residents raised concerns about immigration: specifically, the respect, protection, and safety afforded to immigrants in Arlington. "We have spent a lot of time trying to figure out what protections we can offer to immigrants here in the county," Cristol explained.

In March, she demonstrated her concern on this topic by joining 8th district U.S. Representative Don Beyer and others in public protest of new immigration restrictions. "We want to be a community that is safe and welcoming to everyone," she concluded.

One attendee asked about the ever-present helicopters in the skies over South Arlington. "It's such a quality-of-life issue," Cristol noted. She touted the efforts of Congressman Beyer in this regard, but confessed a certain amount of impotence in changing U.S. Department of Defense policies. The discussion ended with Cristol's promise to raise the issue with the county's federal liaison.

Other residents engaged the board member in a wide range of topics, including the smarter use of shared facilities, school expansion and siting, law enforcement approaches, gang activity, and community approaches to dog park planning.

President Land concluded the public portion of the meeting by thanking Cristol and presenting her with a Fairlington t-shirt. "You're now an honorary Fairlingtonian," he said. Cristol posed for photographs and spent a few more minutes discussing concerns with residents before departing.

The new lanes are expected to open the fall of 2019.

In February, Virginia accepted the formal proposal by Transurban to finance, design, build, maintain, and operate the express lanes. The agreement also calls for a dedicated minimum annual payment by Transurban of \$15 million for transit services and multimodal strategies.

An engineering assessment last year examined the potential noise impacts of the express lanes and concluded that sound walls were "feasible and reasonable." The study identified the units along the corridor that would be affected by possible increase in noise. Those residents will vote on whether they want sound walls. FCA expects to hold a meeting later this year to examine the sound wall options.

"Thunder" to roll along I-395 Memorial Day weekend

Hundreds of motorcycles are expected to roll along the I-395 HOV lanes May 28 on their way to the Pentagon for the Rolling Thunder 30th Anniversary Ride for Freedom.

Fairlington residents usually crowd along the S. Abingdon St. bridge to cheer the riders and wave American flags. In the past as many as an estimated 2,000 motorcycles have traveled along I-395 during the holiday weekend. The motorcycles usually pass by Fairlington sometime between 8:30 and 10 am. So listen for the sound of motorcycles or check Facebook

for updates. The procession of motorcycles normally lasts about 15 minutes.

Riders traditionally meet at Harley Davidson dealerships south of the beltway and then travel along I-95 and I-395 to the Pentagon. The formal Run goes from the Pentagon across Memorial Bridge to the area of the Lincoln and Vietnam Veterans Memorials.



DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



Strategic garden design

Before you visit a nursery to purchase your plants, think about where the plants will go in your patio. Look at your layout and think spatially when envisioning a design.

Window wells: While these are not very attractive, the black iron grate on top makes them passable. Around that industrial concrete wall, plant small evergreens to soften the look: Skimmia, Heather, Salvia, Lenten Rose, and Astilbe. Each of these will flower, and their habits stay 12 inches or smaller in height.

Stair banisters: More common in North Fairlington, these are ideal for a place to trail a vine. I was land-scaping on Capitol Hill last week and one townhome had Carolina jessamine (evergreen with yellow, trumpet-shaped flowers) growing on a short fence and the wrought-iron stair railing. It was just gorgeous. The vine is delicate so it won't encumber the stair area. Again, this idea softens the look on a functional element.

Stepping stones: Some small yards in Fairlington have flagstone paths from the edge of their balcony steps to the fence gate. To accent this path, you can plant the aforementioned small plants (see window wells) on the sides of the stone path. In addition, plant Moss, Sweet Alyssum, or ground Phlox between each stone. This outlines the stone and gives the path the feel of an English Garden.

Trees: Oftentimes trees give the appearance of "bare ankles," where

all the action is up high in branches, leaves, and flowers. What's left at the bottom is a barren trunk. In the ground, about two feet out from the trunk, plant an arc of four or five small evergreens that will highlight an otherwise empty space in your garden.

Excess shade from a tree can-

opy: Sometimes, a tree in your neighbor's patio or one outside your fence totally darkens your garden. This is beneficial for three reasons: There are plenty of shade-loving plants, the moisture from your soil won't evaporate as readily, and you can sit outside and not sweat in summer's humidity. Aucuba, Mahonia, Climbing Hydrangea, Camellia, Pieris, and Mountain Laurel prefer shade. All are evergreen except the Hydrangea. And each one flowers except the Aucuba.

Stone or brick patio: Hardscapes

are ideal for container plants. Terra cotta is modestly priced and looks much prettier than plastic models. Fill each pot with annuals and add in some variegated Ivy or Vinca vine inside the edges for a trailing effect. Impatiens prefer shade whereas Petunia, Marigold, and Begonia favor more sun. Visit the annuals section since there are many choices. Each plastic plant tag will tell you whether the plant needs sun or shade.

Low-maintenance/low-cost:

Ground cover fits this description perfectly since it demands little attention and expense. If you just want to cover the soil area and flowers aren't a priority, plant the following specimens and let them crawl: Ivy, Periwinkle, Pachysandra, Ajuga, and Euonymus 'Winter Creeper'.
