

Arlington County Police Department's (ACPD) Community
Engagement Division briefed
the Fairlington Citizens Association and residents at the June
monthly meeting. The presentation was led by Corporal Patrice

section and Park Shirlington), legislative updates, and warnings on potential scams. Officers also fielded specific questions from community members.

The Community Engagement Division, formally referred to as Community Outreach, was created two years ago under ACPD's new chief, Charles "Andy" Penn. Corporal Malone explained the 10-person team is intended to "create positive interactions first," with residents rather than the first time being a result of an emergency response. Community engagement ranges from civic association briefings to "Know your Rights" talks with youth.

A review of Fairlington's 2023 year-to-date (YTD) crime statistics revealed a 100 percent increase in domestic assault and battery (up from 6 to 12), 200 percent increase in identity theft (up from 3 to 9 cases), and 78 percent increase in larceny from auto (up from 9 to 16). The latter includes stolen car parts or property. Crime overall also increased not just in Fairlington, but countywide.

Malone acknowledged that one of the neighborhood's biggest concerns was the Bradlee Shopping Center, noting that it lies entirely within the City of Alexandria's jurisdiction. ACPD can only assist if Alexandria City police request it.

Bradlee Centrer's corollary crime effects have and may continue to spill into Fairlington. This includes this year's carjacking that ended up in abandoning a vehicle in Fairlington, a series of auto larcenies, and an attempted break-in. Officers suggested coordinating with Fairlington's closest civic association in Alexandria, which would be Seminary Hill, for better follow-up with Alexandria City police.

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Some Fairlington residents who are seeking routine Arlington County permits for improvements to their units have recently been required to request a waiver of the county's zoning rules that impose certain setback requirements for multi-family buildings.

Some Fairlington buildings do meet the set-back requirements, but many others do not. While the issue has been more prominent in the case of owners who want to install egress windows, the requirement applies also to any structural improvement, even if the improvement is entirely within the interior of the unit, such as moving a wall to open up a kitchen.

Before the county will give you a permit to move an interior wall, for example, you must first seek a waiver of the zoning setback requirement by petitioning the county's Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) and appearing before a BZA hearing.

While the zoning regulations are not new, the county has only recently started enforcing them against Fairlington owners, creating confusion and frustration on the part of owners and their contractors and adding several months and more expense to the cost of a renovation project.

This issue was first brought to FCA's attention late last year by a couple of contractors and real estate agents. The spring saw additional owners encounter this problem. FCA Board member Dianna Bentley has had several conversations with county staff on potential ways to solve this.

The Board of Zoning Appeals itself dislikes having to consider these waiver applications and has encouraged FCA to make the case directly to the county board. Some BZA members have warned that they may start voting against these Fairlington waivers—not because they disagree with them but as a way of getting the county board's attention.

There seems to be agreement that the zoning rules were issued after Fairlington was built and the drafters of the rules failed to protect Fairlington as a non-conforming property. There is also agreement that there is no way affected Fairlington units can come into compliance.

Because of the potential impact on Fairlington owners, FCA is working on a formal request to the county board for a solution that will lessen the burden on owners without unreasonably disrupting the county's larger zoning system. The application of the zoning rule to Fairlington is unreasonable and creates an unnecessary burden on our owners.

## Primary election sends mixed signals

The June 20 Democratic primary election in Arlington saw voters embrace somewhat different perspectives in the race for county board, while affirming the progressive focus on the incumbent Commonwealth's Attorney. In the first use of ranked-choice voting, voters selected Maureen Coffey and Susan Cunningham to be the Democratic candidates in November's general election for two slots on the Arlington County Board.

Descriptions of the race sometimes viewed the two of them as representing different perspectives in Arlington, with Cunningham raising questions about the board's approach to "missing middle" housing, while Coffey generally endorsed the policy. Some observers also saw generational issues at work, with Coffey (a renter living in Clarendon) bringing younger voters to the polls in the Rosslyn-Ballston Corridor and Crystal City, while Cunningham drew strong support in North Arlington.

Cunningham led after the first round of voting, but in succeeding rounds, Coffey narrowed that lead as the second-choice votes of Ionathan Dromgoole and Tony Weaver pushed her closer to Cunningham. When Julius "JD" Spain was eliminated, a significant chunk of secondchoice votes pushed Coffey over the top. After another round,

the elimination of Natalie Roy boosted Cunningham

into the top spot for the other slot.

Fresh off their victories, both Coffey and Cunningham dropped by the Fairlington Fourth of July parade and visited with Fairlington residents.

They will face independent Audrey Clement and Republican Juan Carlos Fierro in November.

Precinct totals in the first round of voting will not be available until August, so it is not currently possible to determine which candidates were Fairlingtonians, first choices. But an unofficial map from the county released a couple of days after the election indicated that Cunningham carried the South Fairlington precinct, while Coffey carried the Abingdon precinct.

In the heated race for Commonwealth's Attorney between incumbent Parisa Dehghani-Tafti and Josh Katcher, Dehghani-Tafti comfortably carried both Fairlington precincts, winning 58 percent of the vote in the South Fairlington precinct and 68 percent in the Abingdon precinct.

These percentages were higher than her county-wide total of 56 percent. Both candidates marshaled active campaigns in Fairlington.

In the race for sheriff, where long-time Sheriff Beth Arthur was not seeking re-election, the race in Fairlington was close between Jose Quiroz and Wanda Younger, just as it was across the county. Quiroz carried the South Fairlington precinct by 5 percentage points, while Younger eked out a narrow margin of less than 1 percent in the Abingdon precinct. Countywide Quiroz received 39.7 percent of the vote, compared to 33.9 percent for Younger. James Herring garnered 26.4 percent.

## FCA addresses neighborhood concerns with county permitting

The FCA board gathered virtually for its monthly meeting on Wednesday, July 12. A main topic of discussion were the increasing issues with Arlington county permitting and the headaches it has caused for neighborhood residents.

Dianna Bentley, who has served as the FCA point of contact on this issue, said that Fairlington has almost always experienced an easy permitting process for interior renovations. However, in the last two years, the county

has come into possession of the plats of the Fairlington buildings and are now reluctant to approve new permits without pursuing an additional variance.

"I met with representatives of the county earlier in the year and they told me that many of the permits that were approved before should not have been because they are nonconforming to building code," said Bentley.

Fairlington's buildings were built before many of the building code regulations were put into place.

Denied permits have halted renovation for many Fairlington residents. Affected homeowners have experienced added time and expense due to pausing construction and the additional fees required to seek a variance.

County officials have told Bentley that this would have to wait until next year because the current 2023 work plan does not include a study on Fairlington buildings.

Fairlington resident Andrew Horowitz shared his frustration with the county board members during the meeting.

"I attended the May BZA (Board of Zoning Appeals) meeting and the board members were very grumpy about my variance," he wrote. "They feel these variance requests are not appropriate for their board. They don't want to deal with them."

Other Fairlington residents have taken to the Fairlington Appreciation Society Facebook page to ask for advice and help on managing the denied permits.

"I am trying to remove the wall between the kitchen and dining room which I have seen done in tons of homes here. (I'm in a Clarendon I)," wrote one Fairling-



ton resident. "My permit was recently rejected by Arlington County and my contractor does not understand why or what we need to do next."

The reason for the denial is expressed as: Per Article 16: §16.2.3.A. - Repairs and alterations may be made to a nonconforming building or structure; provided, that no structural alteration shall be made except those required by law or ordinance, or as provided in §16.2. Repairs and alterations to a

nonconforming dwelling, building or structure not otherwise permitted under this Zoning Ordinance are prohibited, unless approved under a use permit or variance pursuant to sections §15.6.4 and §15.6.6.

FCA board member Julie Butler expressed concern that the difficulty in obtaining permits will lead to an increase in residents completing unapproved projects, which could lead to problems with health and safety of residents or the integrity of the condo buildings.

"We are creating conditions or an environment where the only solution is for people to take shortcuts,"

agreed FCA vice president Jenn Davies.

Acting in its official capacity as a county liaison, FCA is working on the pursuit of a zoning ordinance amendment that would streamline the permitting process.

The FCA board is working on drafting a letter enumerating the concerns with the current permitting process and plans to send it ahead of the September meeting of the Arlington county board.

# For the love of



## What happened to the bugs on the windshield?

Growing up, I remember my Dad spending weekends in the summer working on the lawn, using synthetic fertilizers and pesticides, getting rid of clover and all the other "weeds," bagging up the grass clippings and leaves for trash, and watering watering watering.

He worked hard for that velvety green expanse. I also remember so many fireflies in summer that we could run around with jars and catch them without trying, the air was filled with thousands of buzzing insects,

and on long drives, we had to get out to clean the bugs off the windshield. It has been a long time since we had to do that.

#### **Building habitat for insects** and other wildlife

I began to see our patio as a piece of a living ecosystem. We started pulling out the non-native invasive plants and replacing them with native plants.

We stopped using pesticides. We added bird baths, and in the fall we now leave the fallen leaves and dead stalks standing. More birds are visiting now, eating the bugs now living under the leaves. And there are more buzzing insects

### in the air. Wonderful!

Most of the green space across Fairlington's 300+ acres is covered with traditional lawn grass (a non-native import from Europe). The foundation beds are full of nonnative and invasive nandina, liriope, vinca, English ivy, and so many others.

More and more residents are working with boards and grounds committees to remove invasive plants, add natives, and reduce the use of pesticides in common areas. The changes in our patio took years, we couldn't spend all that money at once, and we had a few failures.

But now our patio contributes to the ecosystem around us. Tallamy has a vision of a Homegrown National Park, getting residents to convert private property into critically needed habitat—one yard at a time.

#### We depend on bugs!

My Dad inspired my love of gardening, and I've gardened all my life. As an adult I shared those "traditional" ideas. As recently as 15 years ago, there weren't any native plants in our patio garden. I did have nonnative invasive plants like nandina, burning bush, and butterfly bush.

I used synthetic fertilizers and pesticides, dumped liquid insecticides into the ground to kill "pests" on our tree, and used foggers to kill the mosquitoes. Then I watched a video with entomologist Doug Tallamy. He talked about his realization that no holes in his perfect (non-native) plants meant no insects were eating them.

He began to understand that having no native plants to eat would sooner or later mean no insects. Researchers talked about rapidly declining populations of insects around the world, which some called the "insect apocalypse." Tallamy explained that insects are the foundation of the ecosystem and that if we actually won our war on insects, we would be destroying the ecosystem we depend on.

The celebration was jointly sponsored by FCA and the Fairlington Villages condo association, whose community activities committee and management team coordinated the details.



## It's time for the Arlington County Fair

Starting a new gardening column is something I have looked forward to for a long time. It's not often I get a chance to reach out to a new audience. My name is Kirsten Conrad, and I serve the residents of Arlington County and the City of Alexandria as the Virginia Cooperative Extension Agriculture Natural Resources Agent.

I am still surprised by how many people do not know about Extension or what we do in our offices in the Fairlington Community Center. My program encompasses a broad range of subjects that include education on pesticide and fertilizer reduction, insect and disease pest management in the home and landscape, the use of native and non-native plants, tree and shrub pruning, along with soil health and nutrient management. I work with about 240 Master Gardener volunteers to do this work.

Since 2008, I have worked with the 230 Arlington Regional Master Naturalists on education for residents on invasive animals and plants, stream water quality and issues that surround deer, mosquito, and tick control. I also work with the Tree Stewards of Arlington and Alexandria on tree health and canopy preservation, and the Arlington Friends of Urban Agriculture on gardening and food production.

Future articles will focus on native plant profiles, maintenance tips and tricks, maybe a few design ideas, and of

course troubleshooting on problematic insects and landscape pests. Want to see something specific? Let me know.

The Arlington County Fair is one of our most important annual events that takes place inside and around the Thomas Jefferson Community Center on 2nd St. This year's fair will take place from August 16 to the 20th. https://www.arlingtoncountyfair.us/visit/#schedule Virginia Cooperative Extension has a huge presence at the Arlington County Fair.

Our Master Gardener volunteers are in charge of the Flower, Herb and Vegetable section of the Competitive Exhibits. You can enter your blue-ribbon tomato, zinnias, and basil (and photos, artwork, sewing, honey and baked goods too!) and get money premiums! There are adult and kids' divisions. Get started on your entries here: https://www.arlingtoncountyfair.us/participants/#competitive-exhibits.

In addition, Cooperative Extension will have tables in the vendors section with representatives from Energy Masters, Master Food Volunteers, 4H Youth Leadership Development, Master Naturalists, Master Gardeners, and Master Financial Volunteers.

August is when the perennials come out to play! In their prime are Coneflowers, Black eyed Susan, Beebalm, Salvia, and Hibiscus. You can prune the really tall late bloomers like Ironweed and Chrysanthemums to help control height and legginess. For a low maintenance native groundcover perennial for a small garden try Three-Leaved Stonecrop.




This low growing sedum is deer proof, tolerates some shade, and has no pests or diseases. Keep it happy by letting it dry out between waterings.

#### **August Garden Checklist**

To do:

- Keep watering your vegetable and flower crops! We recommend 1" per week for shrubs and trees too!
- ✓ Deadhead your summer flowering perennials and annuals to encourage continuing blooming. Chelsea chop your tall blooming perennials to do size control and manage their leggy-ness.

"A lot of bartenders, myself included, left the industry and took with them years of experience that would prove difficult to replace when bars eventually opened up," he said.


During this time, he discovered that there

He put his skills to the test writing a book called *The Jolly Bartender's Guide to Home Bartending*, named after his website: www.jollybartender.com. It is focused on helping amateur cocktail enthusiasts easily re-create high-level cocktails at home.

"Space is limited in Fairlington homes, but it isn't necessary to build a twelve-seat bar in your basement," he said. "You want a selection of spirits and other ingredients that will make your home bar flexible enough to make almost any recipe included in the book, but let your tastes be your guide."

Wilkinson plans to host a tasting and a book-signing event in Fairlington in the coming months. Read the

#### **Q&A** with Nathan Wilkinson

What ingredients would you recommend for a bar starter kit?

If you are talking tools and glassware I have a few recommendations for a starter kit. Look for a mixing tools kit with a bar spoon, a jigger that measures quarter, half, one, and one and a half ounces. The shaker should be a cobbler shaker (3 pieces including a strainer, not 2.) You will also need a mixing glass and Hawthorne strainer. For glassware, I recommend 4 of each of the following glasses: Old Fashioned, Collins or highball, cocktail (martini glass), and red wine glasses. I recommend shopping at World Market or discount stores where you can buy other specialty glasses individually.

What is one common misconception about cocktails that you think people have?

The biggest misconception I see that people have about a home bar is that it has to resemble a restaurant bar. Restaurants are all about speed and service. So they have many more glasses, larger containers, shakers big enough to make four of the same cocktail at a time, and dozens of flavors of vodka. This isn't practical in a home. The tools aren't ergonomic for single cocktail use; and you should only buy the flavors of vodka you will definitely use, keeping in mind that there are simple ways to infuse natural flavors into vodka to get what you need.


What is your personal favorite cocktail recipe for the summer months?

A great cocktail for summer is the Daisy. It can be made with any base spirit from whiskey, rum and gin to brandy, vodka and pisco. It's fizzy and tart and strong enough to satisfy the experienced drinkers but very approachable for novices.

3 oz. gin, whiskey, rum or vodka 1 oz. lemon juice 1 tbsp. grenadine 1 tsp. sugar syurp sparkling water orange slice

Combine base spirit, lemon juice and syrups in a shaker with ice. Shake and strain into a chilled Collins glass. Top with sparkling water and stir. Garnish with an orange slice.

ACPD stressed the importance of reporting destruction of property, such as slashed tires.

"We don't know, what we don't know," Malone said, adding that this can limit ACPD's investigative work to establish patterns. Filing a report can be done online or by phone.

Officers also urged people to call the non-emergency line, 703-558-2222, for example if you hear a scream or hear a car accident and only call 911 for an active threat or true emergency.

One resident noted that of the 105 cases reported in Fairlington in 2023 YTD, only 10.5 percent resulted in an arrest. He felt that the number was low. Corporal Malone responded that in order to pursue an investigation, there needs to be evidentiary value and the victim has the right to prosecute or not.

Staffing shortages continue to exist and this is consistent with police departments nationwide. As Commander Congiliaro noted, "County is working with us to increase salaries. Hopefully down the road, staffing will return to what it normally is."

ACPD encouraged residents to reduce crimes of opportunity by developing safety checks like the "9 p.m. routine" of checking locks, closing and locking windows, and securing bikes and other valuables rather than leaving them outdoors.

They also recommended Fairlington residents look into Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) such as motion sensored lights, cameras and Ring doorbells. Officers noted that the neighborhood watch signs do not usually work. They did acknowledge that the older car alarms that make a lot of noise are a deterrent, also joking that the best car theft prevention

was a vehicle with manual transmission.

Corporal Malone provided legislative updates, including no use of tobacco or marijuana for children under the age of 21. Recreational marijuana is legal in owned multifamily dwellings. Renters would need permission from landlords.

Smoking on a balcony or patio is legal, but may violate homeowner association rules. Smoking marijuana on the street will result in a \$25 traffic summons. Smoking marijuana in a car is not illegal, but can result in a DUI, if operating a vehicle.

A few residents inquired about traffic safety in the neighborhood. Corporal Malone reiterated staffing shortages that limit ACPD's ability to regularly enforce. "Speed cameras are coming," to school zones and construction zones, she noted.

Of particular interest was parking enforcement on the 30th Rd. circle during Abingdon's drop off arrival time. Officers noted that drop-off parking/traffic is not unique to Fairlington and it happens at almost every school.

ACPD recommended contacting the Special Operations Section (SOS) to lodge a complaint and request increased patrol. Again, it was mentioned that there were limited hours and staffing for this.

FCA President Guy Land asked what types of crimes Fairlingtonians should be on the lookout for. Officers answered that phone scams were of concern, including calls involving Bitcoin, arrest warrants, and gift cards. "Do not listen to any request to transfer money."

At the conclusion of the briefing, FCA thanked ACPD's Community Engagement Division for their thoughtful responses and hard work serving the Arlington community.


