All blood collected will remain at the hospital to support children with cancer, sickle cell disease, surgeries, and other chronic illnesses.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Exciting things are happening at the WETA building in Shirlington.

If you've driven through Shirlington in the past month, you have no doubt seen the construction

activity there. WETA is expanding its building to move its production facilities from the other side of Four Mile Run and bring everything under one roof.

This is about more than just providing a facelift for the building and relocating some employees. According to WETA Chief Operating Officer Jason Daisey, the goal is to create a modern media facility. Right here in Shirlington.

WETA's presence has always been one of the special treasures of Shirlington. But when the construction and renovation project is completed, it will provide a new sense of vibrancy in our neighborhood.

When you take friends for an early evening meal at Carlyle, you can point across the street and tell them that the station's popular weekday evening program *PBS NewsHour* is originating from Shirlington.

WETA expects to use their expanded building to better engage the community.

Plans call for a large ground-level window that opens onto a bank of video screens, giving the public a sense of the production and broadcast activity going on inside. That will be much more lively than today's staid conventional office building.

While WETA already has a vigorous outreach program of working with area schools, the station expects to boost that by welcoming students to their new building. You can already imagine the vitality that flows from students visiting the facility and learning about digital production.

And, of course, there's the greater likelihood of encountering some of the station's on-air personalities on the sidewalk.

Station leaders are also talking about ways to enhance public art in connection with the building—or, through conversations with Arlington County, the pedestrian bridge across Shirley highway.

With the "new" WETA at one end and Signature Theatre at the other, Campbell Ave. can become a key center of arts and culture in Arlington.

That's good for us in Fairlington. FCA was pleased to support WETA's application when it came before the county board last year. The station has been a good neighbor. We look forward to the new energy that will flow through Shirlington when this project is completed in 2023.

Arlington continues strong Democratic tradition despite Republican victories

Fairlington's two precincts joined other Arlington voters in affirming Arlington's reputation as a strongly Democratic county in last month's election. While Republican Glenn Youngkin narrowly carried the state, Democrat Terry McAuliffe handily won in Arlington, getting over 75 percent of the vote—close to the 80 percent that Joe Biden received last year.

Voters in Arlington and Alexandria elected Alexandria Vice-Mayor Elizabeth Bennett-Parker to the Virginia House of Delegates, giving her 75 percent of the vote. Four Arlington precincts, including the two that serve Fairlington, are in that legislative district.

Bennett-Parker was frequently seen knocking on doors in Fairlington. She visited the Fairlington Farmers Market the Sunday before the election and dropped by both Fairlington precincts on election day.

Delegate Charniele Herring, who represents the Fairlington residents who live in Alexandria, ran unopposed.

County voters returned incumbent Takis Karantonis to the county board, giving him 60 percent of the vote. First time candidate Mary Kadera, who won the endorsement of county Democrats this summer, was elected to the vacancy on the school board, getting almost 78 percent of the vote.

Voters overwhelmingly approved the four bond issues that were on the county ballot.

Because the mail and early voting ballots are not



allocated to individual precincts, it is not possible to determine precisely how Fairlingtonians voted. But the same-day voting generally followed the larger countywide pattern, though same-day voting tended to be a bit more Republican than the early vote.

At the Fairlington precinct, which votes at the Fairlington Community Center, McAuliffe received 72 percent of the same-day vote. At the Abingdon precinct, which includes not only North Fairlington but also residents of adjacent communities, McAuliffe won 74 percent of the vote.

Parker-Bennett drew 72 percent of the vote in the Fairlington precinct and 74 percent of the vote in the Abingdon precinct.

While turnout was about 27,000 less than last year, it was nevertheless up significantly over the statewide election in 2017.

- 7. Right on S. Wakefield St.
- 8. Left onto S. 36th St., crossing over S. Utah St. and S. Taylor St.

- 9. Left onto S. Stafford St. at the traffic circle
- 10. At the traffic circle closer to community center, left onto S. 34th St.
- 11. Right onto S. Utah St., continuing past S. 32nd Rd.
- 12. Right onto S. 32nd St. (passing Utah field and park)
- 13. Right onto S. Stafford St., continuing to the Fairlington Community Center parking lot for a 15-minute stop (3308 S. Stafford St.)
- 14. Return to Fire Station 9

WETA begins Shirlington expansion project

Construction is well underway for the expansion and renovation of public television station WETA's building on Campbell Ave. in Shirlington. The bulk of the building addition is expected to be completed by August of next year, with the internal renovation being completed by January 2023.

WETA Chief Operating Officer Jason Daisey briefed the Fairlington community on the work at FCA's virtual monthly meeting on November 10.

The project will renovate 90,000 square feet of office space in the current office tower and add additional space by converting the patio area between the current building and the parking garage to a four-story structure connected to the office building.

The expansion will enable WETA to retire its aging and obsolete production facility on S. 27th St. near Jennie Dean Park and move all of its production activities to a new studio in Shirlington. WETA produces the weekday *PBS NewsHour* program and Friday evening's *Washington Week in Review*.

WETA will sell the property that now houses the production facilities to Arlington County, which plans to demolish the building and use the property to enhance the offerings of Jennie Dean Park. The park is currently being renovated. These actions are consistent with the larger plan for Four Mile Run Valley that the county board approved a couple of years ago.

All WETA employees will then be located at the building on Campbell Ave. Daisey projects that when the consolidation is completed, roughly 350 employees will work in the Shirlington building.

FCA supported WETA's request to the county for increased density to accommodate the consolidation of its activities at one site.

The most immediate impact on Shirlington traffic will be temporary street or lane closures to allow the installation of new underground power lines around the perimeter of the building. Work began on that in early November and is expected to be completed by the December holidays.

It is being done one small section at a time to minimize the impact on traffic flow. "Road closures will be phased," Daisey said.

"We're committed to keeping the area around the facility as safe and accessible as it can be" during the construction, Daisey told the FCA Board. "We're trying to impact the local community as little as possible," he said, stressing the importance of trying to

maintain pedestrian access around the construction site.

In response to a question from FCA Treasurer Ed Hilz, Daisey stated that the parking garage would not be changed as part of the project. It would still be available to the public after hours.

One aspect of the new addition will be a street-level window that looks onto a video wall showing broadcast or production activities inside the building.

Daisey noted that the building would have space conducive to events for donors and the general public. He also reaffirmed the station's commitment to working with area schools. "Our goal is to connect more with the community than ever before," he said.

County makes Fairlington street improvements

Arlington county work crews began work in November on two Fairlington street improvement projects—the intersection of 34th St. and 36th St. and Abingdon St. between 31st Rd. and 31st St.

At the intersection of 34th St. and 36th St., the Department of Environmental Service shortened the crosswalk by extending both corners, making the turn radius from 34th on to 36th sharper.

The extended corners, and relocated sidewalk, replaced the bollards that had been installed at the intersection last December. The bollards were intended to be temporary.

The improvement was designed to improve safety. In the past, residents noted that cars would often turn onto 36th St. at a high rate of speed after crossing the Abingdon St. bridge.

The improved intersection was the result of an FCA effort that started roughly two years ago to enhance walkability and safety in the neighborhood.

The improvements on Abingdon St. are likewise designed to improve walkability by installing a sidewalk at street level on the north side of Abingdon St. between 31st Rd. and 31st St. Before beginning the sidewalk installation, which includes and gutter work, the county had to relocate the water main in that block.

This project is a part of the county's Neighborhood Conservation program. FCA supported the sidewalk installation.

Winter interest in your garden

Winters can be long and gray, but your patio garden can diminish that dreariness and be transformed into a place of natural beauty. Remember that winter interest does not have to be all about evergreens.

Look at spent flowers and grasses and see them for their sculptural forms. The dried seed heads not only bring beauty to the garden, but they also provide food and cover for birds and wildlife. When left standing, dried flower stalks and stems can be as striking as the bare trees in winter.

What is more interesting to look at on a dreary day than songbirds enjoying the seeds in your garden? Small birds like chickadees and goldfinches often perch right on the seed heads, while larger birds forage for seeds on the ground.

Native perennials provide a cornucopia of seeds for our wintering songbirds plus architectural beauty. Gold-finches love purple coneflower (Echinacea purpurea) seed heads. Coastal Joe-pye-weed (Eutrochium dubnium) not only provides seeds but is also a larval host for moths. New York ironweed (Vernonia noveboracensis) has seed clusters that persist into winter. Coreopsis and orange coneflower (Rudbeckia fulgida) seeds are also bird favorites.

Sedges and grasses, whether evergreen or not, provide structure and texture in winter. Most of these plants prefer sun, but some will tolerate shade. Plantain-leaved sedge (Carex plantaginea) is evergreen and a good alternative to liriope. Little blue stem (Schizachyrium scoparium), switchgrass (Panicum virgatum), Indian grass (Sorghastrum nutans), and pink muhly grass (Muhlenbergia capillaris) all will add texture and structure to your winter gardens. Plus, some of these grasses provide seeds for the birds in winter and are larval host plants for butterflies.

Evergreens add a pop of color to your winter garden. If you have a shady garden, evergreen plants such as Christmas ferns (Polystichum acrostichoides) and marginal wood ferns (Dryopteris marginalis) are beautiful all winter with their tall graceful fronds.

There are several evergreen native ground covers that are good replacements for non-native invasive plants such as English ivy, periwinkle, Japanese pachysandra, or liriope. Native plants, such as Allegheny spurge (Pachysandra procumbens), golden ragwort (Packera aurea), wild pink (Silene caroliniana), and hairy alumroot (Heuchera villosa) will give a splash of color to your winter garden.

Plants with winter interest are noted for their ability to brighten and add flare to a landscape during the coldest months. Some are noted for their berries, some for their bark, and some for other reasons but all will add interest during those otherwise stark times of the year. Lucky for us, sprinkled throughout Fairlington's common areas, you can find many plants with winter interest.



Pedestrian safety

The article, "Recent collisions raise concerns about neighborhood pedestrian-vehicle safety," in the previous All Fairlington Bulletin brings to mind that pedestrians need to play an active role in keeping themselves and others safe. The "pedestrians rule" mindset is not only dangerous (it puts people and dogs at unnecessary risk and will do nothing to reverse a situation in which a dog or person is injured or killed and has no place in creating a safe environment), but it is incorrect as well (pedestrians have rules/laws they need to follow)—as George Castanza said, "We live in a society!"

Dogs and children are at particular risk since they're low to the ground (not all cars have backup cameras) and are often ahead of the walker/parent. A driver will

not be able to see them when looking out the rear window to back up. Those using the lots as walk-throughs also should consider the emotional trauma someone who hits a person or dog will experience.

The parking lot is intended for cars and the ramps at either end are intended for those with disabilities (e.g., those who need wheelchairs), not strollers, to be able to access the lot; nor are they shortcuts from one portion of the sidewalk to another. Fairlington spent a lot of money on fixing our sidewalks so we have a safe place to walk/run. Besides, most of us are getting exercise (for ourselves or our furry friends), so why shortchange yourself! Get in those extra steps and keep you and everyone else safe - physically and emotionally!


School board pauses elementary school boundary proposals

At the November 3 Arlington School Board meeting, Superintendent Francisco Durán recommended postponing the 2021 fall boundary process that would have impacted Abingdon's attendance zone.

The decision was made in part because Abingdon had lower than expected enrollment numbers. The school board also cited the opportunity to look at Abingdon and Drew in the larger context of all elementary school boundaries.

According to the press release, "Taking a pause for the elementary school level allows

staff to review the planning units assigned to Abingdon and Drew comprehensively with all other schools as part of a broader elementary boundary process, versus only considering two elementary schools in isolation."

A larger boundary process will take place in 2022 including at-capacity elementary schools Glebe and Hoffman Boston.

The Superintendent did recommend proceeding with the new boundary adjustments for middle school students attending Gunston, who would move to Kenmore, and for high school students attending Wakefield, who would move to Washington-Liberty.

Gunston and Wakefield are the largest middle and high schools respectively in the

County. While Gunston and Wakefield are Fairlington's zoned schools, the proposed changes would not impact any Fairlington students.



DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



Tom and Ron's iconic Fairlington garden

By now, most South Fairlingtonians have noticed the lush garden along the home front of Tom and Ron on S. 34th Street. If you haven't, walk 200 yards from S. Wakefield Street (toward the bridge) and look to your left.

The couple has lived here since 1995 and was recommended to our neighborhood by Chuck Edwards, long-time South Fairlington resident and former landscape & grounds manager for the Meadows (the village tucked inside S. Stafford St., S. 35th St., S. Utah St. and S. 34th St.).

Year by year, the pair has improved their English-style border landscape by adding new plantings that pose as a mini arboretum: beautyberry, Mexican cigar, nandina, lenten rose, kerria, fern, winterberry, arborvitae, Korean mum, magnolia, sweet box, turtlehead, hydrangea, Japanese forest grass, tulip, hosta, euonymus green spire, veronica, and mondo grass. I've missed a few but you get the drift.

They worked with the Mews board on planting designs and installation and visited local nurseries to learn about the culture and habits of various specimens.

"We get all kinds of feedback from passersby," Ron said. "They ask questions, bring relatives and children. A few have said, "You have no idea how your garden makes us feel."

I can attest. In my 30 years of landscaping Fairlington patios, countless times I hear from my customers, "I can't remember the name of the

plant but do you know who maintains that gorgeous garden along the home front on S. 34th Street?"

Actually, the horticulture and landscaping skills of Tom were honed at an early age.

"When I was young, my aunt in Warrenton shared her gardening magazines with me," he said. "And then she'd share slips and volunteer plants with me."

A few years ago, Ron decided to promote Tom's work. A self-made web designer, he created www.fair-lington.org and devised a link called "Tom's Garden." In it are color photographs of their Fairlington garden depicting vivid floral and leaf colors.

And in 2006, their garden was featured in a summer issue of *Washington Gardener* magazine.

They not only designed their garden, they do the dirty work as well.

Often, you'll see them out front weeding, pruning, and watering no matter the weather.


"It's a release for me," Tom said. "Like Zen."

For years, they had their share of indoor work—Ron at the Internal Revenue Service and Treasury Department and Tom as an English teacher in Prince William and Fauquier counties. So, the outdoor maintenance is a godsend for the retired couple.

And their designing doesn't end at the front door. Inside their home is a vintage collection of furniture and paintings. One couch with cranberry-colored cushioning dates from the late 1800s. When they're not admiring their antiques or thinking of the next plant to install outside, they enjoy the company of their gray cat, Sammy.


