PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

While December brings Santa to the neighborhood, it also brings FCA's annual meeting. That's where we elect board members and officers for the coming year and hear from you what you would like us to focus on.

All owners and residents in Fairlington are automatically members of FCA, so you don't need to pay membership dues or sign up to come. Just show up. This year's meeting is Wednesday, December 13, at 7 p.m. in room 100 of the Fairlington Community Center.

More importantly, consider helping with FCA's work. There are several ways you can give back to your community through FCA.

First, serve on the FCA board. That's a great way to help shape the organization's priorities. Board terms are one year, so you could try it out for a year and not feel tied to a multi-year commitment. All board members are volunteers. You don't get paid for it—at least not in money-but you do get the satisfaction of making an important contribution to Fairlington.

One board member has already indicated he will not be able to serve another year, so there's at least one opening. And a couple of other current board members are undecided. That means you don't have to worry about trying push aside someone who is already on the board.

We are exploring ways to keep the time commitment manageable, such as reducing the number of meetings each year and doing more of our work electronically. We know everyone has multiple obligations.

Second, volunteer to help with one of our activities, such as the Fourth of July celebration (jointly sponsored with Fairlington Villages), family movie night, or Santa's visit on the fire truck. We need helpers.

FCA has two broad goals: to be the voice of Fairlington to local elected officials and their staffs—such as our work on preserving Park Shirl-ington as affordable housing and tackling a weird zoning issue that adversely affects some Fairlington homeowners—and to support activities that foster a vibrant sense of community, enhancing the value of living in this neighborhood.

I thank this year's board for their great work on these things. I encourage you to consider joining them next year. Shoot me an email to let me know you'd like to help out. Hope to see you on December 13.

- 7. Depart school parking lot, left onto S. Abingdon St. cross bridge onto S. 34th St.
- 8. Turn right on S. Wakefield St.

- 9. Turn left onto S. 36th St., cross over S. Utah St. and S. Taylor St.
- 10. Left onto S. Stafford St.
- 11. At the traffic circle, left onto S. 34th St.

For the love of NATURE



Helping our smaller neighbors survive winter

It's December, time to get out the winter jackets and warm up the apple cider. For humans, that is.

The inhabitants of our natural world use other strategies to survive winter's cold, some pretty ingenious. But as we have paved or grassed over critical habitat, replaced the native plants that provide food for caterpillars with non-native plants that don't, cleaned up fallen leaves and flower stems that provide shelter or food, used more chemicals in our gardens, and added artificial lights to the night sky—we have made survival more challenging.

how many birds migrated over Arlington the night before at birdcast.info. On November 1, per birdcast.info, 234,000 birds migrated over Arlington County. They included dark-eyed Juncos, warblers, wrens, sparrows, vireo, grebes, and brown creepers.

To survive the dangerous migration journey, they need dark to navigate and they need food and water along the way. Birds staying local need water too. Many animals need insulation (fat, fur, or feathers) to survive. Birds fluff feathers and roost together to stay warm.

Here are some of nature's survival tactics and how we can help:

Eastern monarchs migrate thousands of miles to central Mexico, starting north again in March, laying single eggs on milkweed plants along the way. Most insects stay local, however. Some overwinter as larvae under fallen leaves or other cover, like the woolly bear caterpillar.

Others replace the water in their bodies with glycerol, a kind of "antifreeze." Fireflies overwinter as larvae in the soil under leaf litter or other cover. Nymphs of dragon-flies, mayflies, and stoneflies live in streams or other water, sometimes under ice, though the pollution is too much for certain species. Praying mantises overwinter as eggs laid on twigs, stalks, and leaves.

Some insects overwinter as pupa in a chrysalis, attached to stems or branches of plants that will provide food for the emerging caterpillar. Some bees nest in dead flower stems left standing over winter. Bumble bee queens overwinter as adults, burrowing into the soil under leaves. Lady beetle adults shelter in tree holes, and under leaf litter, logs, or rocks, and in soil. Amphibians and reptiles rely on their environment to maintain body temperatures. When it gets cold, some species conserve energy by slowing their metabolism and remaining still. Wood frogs actually stop their hearts, stop breathing, and freeze, and then thaw out in spring. Many amphibians survive in dens, caves, hollow logs, old rodent tunnels, or under leaves.

We can help:

- Plant native plants, including milkweeds, and leave flower stalks standing in winter.
- Leave fallen leaves, branches, and logs.
- Put water out, even just a dog bowl of water.
- Turn off our outdoor lights or use motion detection lights or timers.
- Keep cats, which kill billions of birds each year, inside.
- Minimize or eliminate chemicals in our gardens and leave some soil in patios to absorb stormwater, keeping more of it out of streams.





Art Truck makes season's last visit to Fairlington

What makes a good community? How are you a good neighbor? These were some of the questions visitors to the Fairlington Farmers Market were invited to answer by writing on a temporary wooden fence installed at the market in late October as part of the Arlington Art Truck's "Fences to Benches" interactive art project.

Created by local artist Michael Verdon, the fence is designed to invoke separation and privacy, but also foster a conversation about access and equality and overcoming barriers.

Using markers of various colors, dozens of Fairlingtonians shared their ideas on what it means to be a good neighbor directly on the fence. Eventually the fences will be converted into 48 linear feet of communitydecorated public picnic benches placed in selected locations around the county. The writings on the boards will be weather-sealed and on display for all to contemplate. The project particularly encourages a conversation about Arlington's Racial History Timelines work.

Fairlington was one of the Arlington Art Truck's eight stops across the county that featured Fences to Benches. Other stops included the Rosslyn Jazz Festival, Green Valley Day, HB Woodlawn Middle School, and the Langston-Brown Community Center.





FROM THE PILE

Plants with Winter interest

Winter is coming and it is traditionally a drab grey time of year that is often wet and not a particularly inviting time to be out in the garden. But I am here to challenge you that does not have to be ugly!

In addition to overwintering annuals like pansies (*viola spp.*), and perennials like late winter blooming hellebores (*helleborus spp.*), the ornamental grasses, sedums, rudbeckias, and echinaceas have attractive seedheads that are attractive all winter long and that in some cases will attract songbirds looking for seeds to feed on.

Here are some ideas on woody shrubs that you can put into a small landscape to add pizzaz and some brightness to get us through until the Spring growing season.

Winterberry (*Ilex verticillata*): This deciduous holly produces vibrant red berries that persist through the winter.

Camellia (*camellia spp.*): Known for their beautiful, waxy flowers, some camellia varieties bloom in the winter.

Witch hazel (*hamamelis spp.*): These shrubs produce unique, spidery flowers in late winter, adding a touch of color to the landscape.

Winter daphne (*daphne odora*): This evergreen shrub produces fragrant pink or white flowers in late winter.

Japanese andromeda (*pieris japonica*): With cascading clusters of bell-shaped flowers, this evergreen adds interest to the winter garden.

Red twig dogwood (*cornus sericea*): Known for its bright red stems, this deciduous shrub provides winter color, especially against a backdrop

Remember to consider factors such as soil type, sunlight, and water availability when selecting plants for your garden.

Environmentally aware gardeners strive to achieve at least 70 percent native plants, but there are many non native plants that are not invasive.

Fairlington voters follow county trend

November's general election produced no surprises in either Arlington or Fairlington, with Democratic candidates receiving roughly the same share of the vote in Fairlington as they did countywide. Republican and independent candidates drew less than 20 percent of the vote in a low-turnout election.

Voters elected Maureen Coffey and Susan Cunningham to the two vacant seats on the Arlington County Board and chose incumbents Sen. Barbara Favola and Del. Alfonso Lopez to represent the Fairlington part of Arlington in the General Assembly in Richmond.

According to preliminary and unofficial totals, Cunningham received 43,664 votes countywide, outpacing Coffey's 39,890. That pattern held in South Fairlington, where Cunningham got 783 votes to Coffey's 774. But in North Fairlington Coffey edged out Cunningham, 737 to 783.

Independent Audrey Clement and Republican Juan Carolos Fierro were well back, with Fierro getting 238 votes and Clement 220 votes in South Fairlington and Fierro receiving 197 and Clement getting 192 in the Abingdon precinct.

Clement, who had run for the county board a number of times previously, had made opposition to the county's new "missing middle" (Expanded Housing Options) policy the centerpiece of her campaign.

Because there were two vacancies, the top two votegetters were elected.

Miranda Turner was elected to the school board. James Vell Rives had suspended his campaign earlier in the year.

Most county officials, such as clerk of court, commonwealth's attorney, commissioner of revenue, sheriff, and treasurer, were elected without opposition.

Sen. Barbara Favola's vote in the two Fairlington precincts was near her countywide tally of roughly 81 percent, compared to Republican David Henshaw's 19 percent.

Del. Alfonso Lopez had a countywide vote of 83 percent over Republican Major Mike Webb. Lopez ran up a similar margin in the Fairlington precincts.

In the Alexandria portion of Fairlington, incumbent Adam Ebbin was comfortably re-elected to the State Senate. Del. Charniele Herring faced no opposition.

The South Fairlington precinct consists exclusively of Fairlington residents, while the Abingdon precinct overs North Fairlington residents as well as residents of adjacent apartment and condo communities. Early inperson and mail voting is not recorded by precinct, so the precinct numbers reflect the totals of those people who voted on November 7.

Only 36 percent of Arlington's roughly 175,000 registered voters cast ballots in the election.


