Town hall features questions about proposed Potomac Yard sports complex

Economic impact and quality of life issues, including traffic and housing, dominated an early January town hall discussion of the proposed Potomac Yard arena and entertainment complex that would become the home of the Washington Capitals hockey team and Washington Wizards basketball team.

In a session coordinated by the Del Ray Civic Association, Sen. Adam Ebbin and Del. Elizabeth Bennett-Parker heard citizen concerns and responded to questions about the proposed new development.

Alexandria Mayor Justin Wilson joined in the conversation, while Stephanie Landrum, CEO of the Alexandria Economic Development Partnership, explained many of the details of the proposal.

The two state legislators pointed out that the package is premised on the creation by the Virginia General Assembly of a Virginia Sports and Entertainment Authority that would own the arena property and lease it to Monumental Sports and Entertainment (owner of the Capitals and Wizards), issuing tax-exempt bonds to finance much of the cost of the \$2 billion project.

The sports and entertainment authority would own the property next to the new Virginia Tech campus that is under construction. The site would have

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What are the implications for Fairlington in the proposal to create a new sports and entertainment venue at Potomac Yard? That's a question many of you have been asking since Gov. Glenn Youngkin and Monumental Sports and Entertainment CEO Ted Leonsis announced a proposal to move the Washington Capitals and the Wizards from D.C. to a new arena in Potomac Yard.

Traffic issues are the concern I've heard about most, and that topic figured prominently in a Del Ray town hall with state Sen. Adam Ebbin and Del. Elizabeth Bennet-Parker in early January. The two legislators represent the Potomac Yard area.

As a neighboring civic association, which also covers a part of Alexandria, FCA was invited to join the Zoom of the town hall meeting.

Ebbin and Bennett-Parker previously represented Fairlington, but under last year's redistricting Ebbin only represents the part of Fairlington that is in Alexandria and Bennett-Parker no longer represents any part of Fairlington. Both have previously spoken at FCA meetings and FCA has enjoyed a good relationship with them.

The traffic concerns stem from both the crowds getting to and from games at the new arena (as well as a proposed concert venue right next to it) and the additional development that will occur on the property where the Target and other stores now sit. That parcel is slated to have a mix of residential, retail businesses, and hotels. Increased congestion along Route 1 and I-395 would be a likely result.

A major transportation study is underway, and the results were expected to be released in late January. Possible projects include improvements to the I-395 and Glebe Rd. interchange and upgrades to the intersections along Glebe between 395 and Route 1. Traffic planners are also looking at adding turn lanes along Route 1 at Potomac Yard.

Another transportation question is the ability of Metro to handle the increased volume. Ebbin and Bennett-Parker have stressed that the state will need to commit to robust funding of Metro as a condition of their support for the arena project.

FCA will be monitoring the Potomac Yard proposal. We will be contacting Sen. Barbara Favola and Del. Alfonso Lopez, who now represent Fairlington, to make sure they are attuned to the potential impacts on Fairlington. I welcome your thoughts as well.

Fairlington mail carriers celebrated for exceptional service



Our Fairlington mail carriers received well-deserved recognition last month as they were honored by the Postmaster for outstanding service during the demanding Christmas season. Their commendable achievement—a staggering 99.7 per-

cent on-time delivery rate—earned them a prestigious trophy and certificate from the Postmaster as tokens of appreciation.

It is the United States Postal Service policy not to publically share the names or photos of our local mail carriers but many Fairlington residents know them by name and regularly greet them on their rounds.

Amidst the accolades, our local postal service faces imminent changes as the number of mail carriers is set

to decrease from fourteen to twelve effective January 22. This reduction in workforce is expected to place additional responsibilities on the remaining carriers, who will need to absorb the extra work to ensure smooth delivery of mail.

One of the local carriers spoke with a Fairlington resident about the forthcoming changes and expressed a willingness to adapt to the changes but highlighted the challenge of adjusting to the increased workload. He mentioned that it might take a few weeks for the carriers to navigate the new courtyards efficiently and familiarize themselves with the names and addresses of the new customers they will be serving.

As our mail carriers navigate these changes, let's support them by expressing our gratitude for their steadfast commitment to our neighborhood.

The FCA Board has selected Sarah Hazlett to fill the remaining board vacancy that went unfilled at the December annual meeting. A North Fairlington owner since August 2023, Hazlett said she hopes "to have an impact on the community as a new resident" and bring that perspective to FCA's work.

She noted that while she is relatively new to Fairlington, she has been a resident of Arlington since 2011, most recently as a resident of Arlington Village.

In other action in its January virtual meeting, the board appointed former FCA Treasurer Ed Hilz as its representative to the Arlington Neighborhoods Advisory Committee, with new board member Scudder Wagg as its alternate representative.

The Advisory Committee makes recommendations to the county board on the use of bond funds that are reserved for improvements in neighborhoods. The installation last year of the sidewalk along Abingdon St. between 31st Rd. and 31st St. was a Fairlington project recommended by the Advisory Committee.

The board also designated its officers to be representatives to the Arlington County Civic Federation and chose Fairlington Villages condo secretary Melanie Alvord as its representative to the Alexandria Federation of Civic Associations. Alvord lives in the Alexandria portion of North Fairlington.

FCA maintains membership in both organizations as a way of strengthening its participation in discussions of Arlington and Alexandria issues.


The library is located at 4200 Campbell Ave. in the heart of Shirlington. It is part of the Arlington Public Library System.



Doug Tallamy: From theory to practice

Last month we explored Doug Tallamy's idea of native plant "corridors" as an extension of regional park land. These provide additional food and shelter for a greater diversity of animals.

Do these efforts actually help? A few years ago, Lisa Schulte Moore won a MacArthur Genius Grant for Prairie Strips. In Iowa, these were planted in corn fields in between rows of corn. All were planted with native grasses and flowers from the prairie representing 10 percent of the field. The results were less erosion, runoff, and greater pollination.

Tallamy's corridor idea reduces lawn by creating native landscapes where grass once grew. If more people did this,

there would be corridors between parklands that would support greater biodiversity, connect our fragmented woodlands, and allow for species migration. The biggest problem, he admitted, is changing the public aesthetic from useless lawns to active natural areas: the homegrown national park.

Does this work? To find out, I reached out to Nate Erwin, who studied under Tallamy and is now a "bugscpaping" landscaper.

Sue: I know that you studied under Doug when you were in college. How have his ideas changed from then to today?

Nate: Dr. Tallamy is an outstanding insect behaviorist. His studies of insects and the natural world have evolved over time as happens with any good biologist. I think Rachel Carson's statement about biologists sums up Tallamy very nicely:

There is one quality that characterizes all of us who deal with the sciences of the earth and its life—we are never bored. We can't be.

There is always something new to be investigated.

Tallamy continues to learn more about the natural

world with his research and advocacy for its preservation.

Sue: How long have you been creating bugscapes?

Nate: I've been having fun with seeing how many insects I can attract and maintain in my own gardens wherever I've lived since the 1980s. I really started getting serious about it when I bought my house in 1997 and could plant and experiment without worrying about landlords. In 2013 I became selfemployed, making "bugscaping" just a part of my business activities. Tallamy's publications have helped fuel my business. Today, it's the bulk of my work.

Sue: As a scientist, what have you discovered after planting native plants?

Nate: It is so gratifying to see the insects and birds that start showing up after a planting becomes established as well as the clients' excitement of observing these animals for the first time. Caterpillars feeding on plants, a variety of insects nectaring on flowers of trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants, and birds feeding on berries and insects on the plants are just some of the interactions that people get to experience in their own backyards.

It's only February, and usually the time that gardeners of all kinds begin looking at plant catalogs and thinking ahead to spring. Consider adding native plants to your patio and community gardens this year to create a corridor. Then join other Fairlington neighbors and register your plantings on the Homegrown National Park website.

an arena for Capitals and Wizards games, along with a performing arts venue, Monumental corporate offices, a sports network studio, and a practice facility.

JBG Smith would own the property where the Potomac Yard stores (such as Target and Best Buy) are located. In a later phase, it would feature residential, retail, restaurant, and hotel businesses. It would be financed largely by private investment, though there would be Alexandria financial participation for a potential school on the site.

According to Landrum, the project will generate \$12 billion in positive economic impact for the Commonwealth and the City of Alexandria after debt servicing, including \$4.7 billion in new tax revenues.

Landrum noted that dedicated revenues from the arena and entertainment property would be used to pay off the bonds. She said the agreement was structured in a way that the modeling indicates revenues will be twice what is needed to pay off the bonds. The state and the city would be on the hook for bond payments only if revenues were off the projection by more than 50 percent. The costs would be split if there were a shortfall.

A number of town hall questions raised transportation concerns. According to Ebbin, a major transportation study is being conducted by the state and is tentatively scheduled for release in January.

Potential transportation projects under consideration include a number of improvements along Route 1 (such as the addition of turn lanes at multiple intersections), additional VRE/Amtrak connections, Potomac Yard Metro station mitigation, and improvements to the I-395 and Glebe Road interchange. Another option includes investment in real-time transit technology that can encourage fans to use public transit and carpool.

Landrum suggested that the transportation improvements would likely cost \$200 million.

Discussion of the proposal will be a major part of this year's agenda for the General Assembly in Richmond. The legislative session began January 10 and will conclude in mid-March.

Ebbin noted that the proposal has drawn mixed reactions from both fellow legislators and from his constituents. While saying she wants to get more information, Bennett-Parker said that if the vote were taken that night, she would oppose it. But she made clear that was not necessarily her final position.

Ebbin stressed that state financial support for Metro would be essential if the proposal were to get his support. Bennett-Parker agreed on the importance of Metro funding. "This project doesn't work without the Metro and so [I'm] wanting to see a commitment from the state for how that will be funded," she said.

"Transportation is probably the number one quality of life concern that I've heard about from the residents who have written to me, and it'll be really key to me in making my final decision," Ebbin said.

Bennett-Parker likewise noted the impact on traffic along Route 1 and in neighborhoods in the general area of the arena. She pointed out that she lives closer to the arena site than any other member of the General Assembly.

Residents also raised questions about the impact of the development on housing affordability and whether the project would have an impact on local taxes.

If the General Assembly does create the sports and entertainment authority, the focus will then shift to the City of Alexandria, which will oversee the normal local questions of design, massing, zoning, and safety.

Both legislators expressed a desire to know more about the details of the proposal and the underlying analysis, along with the results of the major transportation study.

Did you know that Abingdon Elementary was a segregated school in its first years? Black students were not allowed to enroll; Black students living in South Arlington attended Drew Elementary. Abingdon remained segregated long after the Supreme Court's 1954 ban on segregation in public schools, and Arlington's 1959 integration of Stratford Junior High, because the apartment complexes that constituted Abingdon's attendance zone were openly discriminatory. The Fair Housing Act of 1968 affirmed that housing discrimination was illegal, which paved the way for the first three Black students to attend Abingdon in 1968. One of these students stated that her time at Abingdon was difficult, but we know little else about Abingdon's integration. Do you remember this time in Abingdon history? 



