It is heartwarming to see rising "kindergardeners" pick and enjoy garden fresh tomatoes after their summer popsicle playdate where they meet future classmates, and to see kids impressed with the baby watermelons and pumpkins growing along the garden fence, or watch a teacher release a new butterfly with her students.

The school garden has been a culmination of many kind people and organizations (for example, Friends of Urban Agriculture, Virginia Cooperative Extension, Boy Scouts, and the Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia) who volunteer to support our humble garden.

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Last month's annual meeting saw the retirement of long-time FCA Treasurer Ed Hilz. A Fairlington resident since 1975, Ed has been a key participant in activities in our neighborhood for over 40 years.

Indeed, Ed had a hand in creating FCA in the late 1970s as Fairlington was getting established as a condo community in place of a rental community. Early on he understood the importance of having an organization that could speak on behalf of the larger Fairlington neighborhood—and not just the individual condo associations—about common issues that affected both North and South Fairlington, particularly when it came to Arlington county decisions.

He likewise saw the value of having the *All Fairlington Bulletin* as a vehicle for disseminating news about activities in Fairlington, using it to help foster a robust sense of community across the condo associations.

FCA has had a variety of strong leaders through years—folks like Paul Ferguson, Nancy Hunt, and the late Sam Anthony—but Ed has been the anchor of consistency and continuity across multiple leadership personalities and styles.

Ed's commitment, energy, and insight are a major reason that FCA is a thriving organization today that enjoys the respect of Arlington county officials and has the financial resources to support activities like last month's Santa Ride or last fall's family movie night.

Ed has also represented Fairlington on several county advisory committees, such as the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee (NCAC), which establishes priorities for the use of county bond funds for small neighborhood improvement projects. He helped shape the 1987 Fairlington-Shirlington Neighborhood Conservation Plan and led the 2012 update of that plan. He expects to continue to serve on the NCAC.

Ed and his wife Adrian (and son Corey) were among the early families that settled into this new condo community as it was being established—you could call them Fairlington's pioneer families—and stayed, invested in making it a real community, and guided it as it reached maturity and experienced demographic change.

Ed's dedication to Fairlington is beyond question. His commitment to the work of FCA has enabled it to survive and flourish. Our community is a better place because of his efforts. Thanks, Ed, for a job well done for Fairlington.

### Save the Date for the Fairlington 5K

The 8th Annual Fairlington 5K & Family Fun Run is scheduled to take place Saturday, April 29. The family-friendly race, which began in 2014, supports research into a cure for 14-year old Fairlington resident Ellie McGinn, who was born with a rare brain and spinal cord disease known as LBSL. LBSL slowly robs children of their ability to walk, stand, and coordinate all movements.

To date, the 5K and its accompanying Silent Auction have raised over \$130,000 for research into a cure for

the genetic condition. A portion of the proceeds also goes to support physical education activities at Abingdon Elementary School.

### Annual meeting elects new FCA board

Fairlington residents elected a new member to the FCA board and promoted another board member to treasurer at the association's annual meeting on December 14.

North Fairlington resident Todd Delp was approved for a vacant slot on the board, while current board member Paulin Leonida was selected as treasurer, replacing longtime treasurer Ed Hilz, who did not seek re-election.

Fairlingtonians re-elected Guy Land as president, Jennifer Davies as vice president, and Jennifer Clardy Chalmers as secretary. Incumbents Lydia Redway, Donald Staren-Doby, Julie Butler, and Dianna Bentley were re-elected as directors.

Officers and directors serve one-year terms and receive no compensation for their work.

Delp has been a Fairlington resident since 2021. He previously served a term as a member of the board of the Fairlington Villages condo association. He and his wife have two children.

Leonida, a Fairlington resident since 2020, has a diverse background of financial management, including work with international nonprofit organizations. She currently works for the Arlington County Department of Human Services.

During the annual meeting, president Land summarized the major activities of 2022: engaging with county officials and leaders; focusing on safety and security;

addressing development and affordable housing issues; promoting diversity, equity, and inclusion; building relationships with neighborhood organizations.

He also highlighted FCA's role in enhancing community life in Fairlington by sponsoring events like the Fairlington 5K, the July 4th parade (in partnership with Fairlington Villages), family movie night, neighborhood blood drives, and supporting the Fairlington Farmers Market.

For 2023, Land noted FCA's support for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Community Service in conjunction with the Abingdon Elementary PTA; continued conversations on diversity, equity, and inclusion; and sponsorship of the 2023 Fairlington 5K.

# Speeding, inflation, egress windows drive discussion in quarterly Presidents meeting

The following were the main topics discussed at the recent meeting of the Fairlington presidents.

Conversations continue with the City of Alexandria about excessive vehicle exhaust noise and speeding along King St. Fairlington Villages' president spoke with a member of the City's Transportation and Environmental Services office who stated that Alexandria was planning to install speed feedback signs along King St., between Quaker Ln and Beauregard St. Fairlington residents are encouraged to contact the city via the Alex311 app or via the web site at www.alexandriava.gov/ Alex311 to report incidents of speeding or excessive vehicle exhaust noise.

ing more electric vehicles in existence and younger residents moving into Fairlington. The question was raised as to whether it is fair to add the high cost of electric vehicle chargers to the condo fee now when very few residents have an electric vehicle.

**Egress windows**—Most Presidents agreed that installing egress windows from basements are for safety reasons. It's important that co-owners follow condo rules when installing an egress window and sign an agreement/ waiver that, if the window causes damage to the unit/building, the co-owner is responsible. The egress window conveys when the unit sells and

the new owner takes on the liability and responsibility.

Please contact your association's president if you have topics pertaining to Fairlington that the presidents might discuss at a future meeting.

**Financial reserves**—In order to maintain costly aging facilities and common areas, the associations rely on reserve funding. The amount set aside each year is based on the association's reserve study and on its bylaws.

Reserves cover resent and anticipated cost increases for contractors, services, materials. All agree that costs are rising due to inflation, Covid circumstances, the war in Ukraine, etc. This will inevitably drive up condo fees to cover the unexpected costs.

County permit issues—Most, if not all, of Fairlington's associations have experienced time lags or problems getting permits approved for time-sensitive projects. For the past two years, applications for permits had to be submitted online. Only recently has the permit office reopened two days per week. Arlington now has a Resident Ombudsman and Director of Constituent Services to facilitate communication between county residents and Arlington County departments. He is Benjamin Aiken and can be reached at baiken@arlingtonva. us and at 703-228-1762.

Electric charging stations—The Commons has two working chargers for their residents and two that will be open to Fairlington residents once installed and live. The Meadows will be installing one dual charging pedestal in 2023. Funding for the project was approved at the Annual Meeting in October. The Glen set up a committee to research the feasibility and location(s) for chargers. Most associations are planning for the future, envision-

### Lawn care alternative trials underway in Fairlington Villages

Changing aesthetics and residents' concerns have resulted in lawn-care alternative trials in Fairlington Villages, where an estimated 19 acres is lawn:

- **No treatment site**—Treatments have not been used (beyond aeration and seeding) for close to a decade over safety concerns for young children in the area around the toddler playground, management office, and main tennis courts—these locations are grouped together on S. Abington Street.
- **Organics trial**—The board of directors approved a pilot project to investigate the use of organic products in lieu of man-made (synthetic) products for lawn-care based on resident requests for organics and perception that they are safer. Organics are being applied in the fall as post emergent treatments for weeds and as fertilizer. The goals are twofold: to see if organics are as effective as the current process or effective enough to satisfy residents; and to determine if the results are worth the cost, as these are significantly more expensive than synthetic products. This pilot site is directly across from the management office and is bound by South 29th, Abingdon, and 30th streets, and parking lot 38.
- **No chemicals trial**—Most recently, the Board approved another pilot at the request of residents in the Ward 1 area who are concerned about safety and health of children and pets who frequently play in these open grassy areas. No chemicals of any kind will be applied, including fertilizers, in the area that is east of Abingdon St., south of 31st Street, and near I-395..

The management company, grounds committee, and board will monitor all trial sites and residents' comments/feedback on these locations before deciding to end, continue, or to expand the pilots.

Encouraging all-grass lawns requires quite a bit of care and feeding, time, and money. These methods are

employed currently in Fairlington Villages throughout the property:

- **Keeping weeds from growing in the first place** by limiting bare soil areas in which weeds (anything other than grass) easily grow. This is accomplished by aerating the soil and seeding bare areas with new grass each fall.
- Herbicides are used in the spring to prevent weed growth (pre-emergent) as they will grow despite best efforts. Different herbicides are applied in the fall to kill the weeds that do grow (post emergent).
- Nourishing the grass with several techniques. Mulching mowers leave grass cuttings on the lawn, adding natural and free nitrogen. The same mowers mulch leaves in the fall; leaves are also a natural and free fertilizer. Additional nutrients, as indicated by soil tests taken throughout the property, are added through chemical fertilizers in the spring and fall.

# DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



# Planting your backyard winter wonderland

A gardener's challenge is having beauty in the winter landscape. Few specimens flower from December into March but there are some with winter pizzazz.

A customer of mine, Joan, never steps outside in winter. There's no need. From her kitchen or dining room, she looks through windows to admire a stand of camellia I planted years ago.

At the back fence are three camellia, each with a different flower color – red, pink and white. Tying them together are yellow eyes, a trademark of camellia. This plant is a vertical grower with scant width. Its branches are sturdy and need no support. The "winter-blooming" camellia shows its flowers from December into April.

Think about planting a few at your back fence so you can enjoy what she does in the colder months.

At the corner of South 36th and South Wakefield Streets is mahonia. This 6-foot-tall evergreen shows yellow flowers from December into March. In a bed to the right of the mailbox, there are three waving to you with sprays of fragrant yellow flowers atop its branches. Foliage is acuminate like a holly. In winter, some leaves mutate to an orange or purple.

Winterberry is a must-have for your winter garden. There used to be a few at the Fairlington Community Center but they disappeared during construction a couple years ago. This

is the only deciduous holly. When it drops its leaves, red drupes cluster on thin branches. If one isn't familiar with this plant, he or she would think someone hung red ornaments.

If you have a raised bed in your Fairlington patio (such as a tiered structure like Wes has in his "Commons" patio) think about planting winter jasmine. It's an evergreen with drooping branches that become filled with nickel-sized, yellow flowers in winter. If you drive down Braddock Rd. you will see it on the left atop an 8-foot-tall stone wall. It's about 200 yards shy of the canon on the median at Russell Rd. I planted winter jasmine atop a raised brick bed for Pat in her "green" patio years ago. Every winter, she's presented with a yellow waterfall.

Another winter-flowering specimen is fragrant daphne. It is 3-feet-tall with a similar width. The flowers are 2-inches wide and pinkish-white. With this in your winter garden, you can enjoy your coffee or tea outside for sweet sniff, quite similar to the gardenia flower.

While gardening at Penny's, I saw a chrysanthemum flowering in December! It had not been pruned (May is the usual time) so it was leggy (4-feet-long) but in full flower. So, when you buy mums next fall, plant them in the soil against a small, wood trellis. Avoid pruning the following May. Tie the branches to the trellis. Then come winter, you'll have a stand of colorful mum.




