Show your patriotic colors on July 4

After a two-year COVID hiatus, the Fairlington Fourth of July parade returns in person this month. A true neighborhood celebration, the parade is made up of individuals and families on bikes and scooters, in wagons, and on foot. The parade is also dog-friendly, and many people bring their four-legged friends to join in the festivities.

Jointly sponsored by FCA and the Fairlington Vil-

lages condo association, the parade lines up at 9:45 a.m. next to the old fire station at 3116 S. Abingdon St. and steps off at 10 a.m. It marches up Abingdon to the parking lot of the Fairlington Villages Community Center, 3005 S. Abingdon St., where "breakfast sausages" (also known as hot dogs) and cold drinks await.

The parade is open to anyone who wants to march, but there is also plenty of room for spectators along the route, waving flags and cheering the marchers on. While not a requirement, wearing red, white, and blue is definitely encouraged. And you can show your creativity in outfitting kids, bikes, and pets in patriotic attire.

A police escort will lead the marchers along the parade route (and the intersection at Abingdon and 31st St. will be closed temporarily while the parade passes through).

Fire Station 9, which now serves Fairlington, plans to send a fire truck to join the celebration, unless it is called away to respond to an emergency.

The post-parade refreshments offer a great chance to meet neighbors. There will also be water tattoos for kids.

The parade and post-parade celebration are only possible through the work of many dedicated volunteers in the Fairlington community. More volunteers are needed to help with the July 4 activities. Please e-mail activities@fairlingtonvillages.com if you can help out.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"The community is the heart of the library," says Miguel Ruiz, the director of the Shirlington Library, a branch of the Arlington Public Library. Ruiz and his colleague Vicky McCaffrey made a visit to the Fairlington Farmers Market last month and received a warm welcome from market customers.

Their appearance built on a conversation the FCA Board had with Ruiz and McCaffrey in December, when they expressed an interest in more closely connecting with Fairlington. We started thinking about ways to accomplish that, to the benefit of both of our organizations. We quickly connected them with the volunteer committee that runs the market, which seized on the opportunity to have them as a market guest.

Last month's visit to the market, the first of at least three planned for this season, also offered an opportunity for Ruiz to meet the new Abingdon Elementary PTA President Sharon Burd, a North Fairlington resident, and her husband Dan, who is the PTA Secretary. They immediately began talking about stronger collaboration between the PTA and the library.

"The real work and joy is in the community," Ruiz explains. "For those of us who work in public libraries—yes, we work for the county, but we also have kids, we have pets, we go to the same grocery stores and parks like everyone else. We are part of the community."

Shirlington Library is a valuable asset to Fairlington that we should take better advantage of. It can be a great resource for so many of our families.

This illustrates another of FCA's roles—connecting Fairlington residents and organizations with county resources and opportunities.

Ruiz is also interested in serving diverse populations. An immigrant himself, he has a particular desire to address the challenges facing immigrant families. All of that fits nicely with the diverse student population at Abingdon Elementary and the needs of the residents of Park Shirlington, which is part of FCA's service area. It also can complement the diversity, equity, and inclusion conversations that FCA has been fostering in Fairlington.

In the coming months, we will be exploring additional ways we can partner with the Shirlington Library to enhance life in Fairlington. We welcome your suggestions. In the meantime, I encourage you to check out the library yourself. It has a lot to offer.

Arlington county police brief community about local crime, staffing shortages

The Arlington county police department (ACPD) is experiencing a considerable staffing shortage, as officers assigned to the Fairlington area have reduced from five to two over the past three years, according to a briefing by ACPD during the monthly FCA meeting in June. Cor. Mark Francis and Lt. Eliseo Pilco presented.

"It's a recruitment and retention issue," said Lt. Pilco, "Officers only have just now been approved for a raise that was long overdue. We are authorized to have 375 officers in the county but we are barely at 300."

The presentation, which included a summary of 2022 crime statistics in the Fairlington and Shirlington area, showed that calls for service have increased 25 percent

over 2021. This number does not necessarily reflect an increase in crimes committed, since many calls for service do not end in arrest or a crime report.

Fairlington also experiences spillover from crime in other jurisdictions because of its close proximity to I-395, Alexandria, and Arlandria. The recent vehicle chase which ended in North Fairlington is an example of this kind of incident, although the crime itself was committed elsewhere.

The county has seen specific increases in crimes including domestic assault and larceny from vehicles.

Of particular interest to Fairlington residents has been the recent thefts of catalytic converters from vehicles in the neighborhood. Criminals can sell these converters from anywhere between \$200 and \$5000 due to the valuable metals they contain. The Toyota Prius is currently the most frequently targeted vehicle.

Col. Francis said that while there is no way to guarantee that you will not become a victim of crime, you can make it less likely.

"I hate talking about prevention, because there are no guarantees, anyone can become a victim of crime," said Francis, adding that he was a victim of a break-in to his personal car a few months back. "The goal is to make it as hard for these criminals as possible."

The vast majority of the vehicle tampering and theft is

Debut novelist and Fairlington resident signs books at weekly market

Sunday, May 15 was a special day at the farmers market as Fairlingtonians came to support one of their own, Fairlington resident and debut novelist of *Freewater*, Amina Luqman-Dawson.

Her eloquent, powerful, and vibrant storytelling chronicles the journey of two children who find a maroon community after escaping slavery.

If you aren't familiar with the story of maroons, you're not alone.

"I was inspired by the amazing history of maroons in the Americas," Luqman-Dawson said. "Maroons are people who escaped enslavement and managed to live free and clandestine lives in the American wilderness. I hadn't learned about maroons when I was young and it felt like a fresh way to spark a new conversation around the topic of slavery. It creates a wonderful narrative about resistance, hope, and courage."

Luqman-Dawson was also inspired by her son and the opportunity to write for other children, so the presence

of young readers at the book signing was especially fun to see.

When asked why she tailored the book to a young audience, Amina said, "The best reading in my life took place during my middle school years. It's when I first learned to lose myself in a book. I also learned that I had the power to read whatever I wanted, and that's what I did. The idea of writing for other kids at that same stage in their lives feels like a privilege."

The book was a 20-year labor of love for Amina and she shared advice for aspiring novelists.

"Writing is hard work, but as long as the process feels gratifying and moves you, don't give up," she said.

Her dedication to the project has earned her an appearance on NPR's program, Here & Now, selection by Entertainment Weekly as a Black History Month pick, and a fan club of Fairlington supporters.

market committee is exploring the option of adding another visit later in the fall.

The appearance at the farmers market is part of the library's larger effort to connect with the surrounding neighborhood.

"Our role is to facilitate the use of library and community resources using an equity lens that is representative of the communities we serve and are a part of," said Ruiz.

The library is located at 4200 Campbell Ave. in the heart of Shirlington. It is part of the Arlington Public Library





Trees: one of our neighborhood's most valuable assets

This is the time of year one can really appreciate a tree—the shade, the cool air under the tree, and of course, the shape and form that adds beauty to the landscape. The green space and mature trees of Fairlington are hallmarks of the community. While enormous credit goes to those who planted our trees that are majestic giants today, credit is also due to Fairlington gardening committees and boards that have supported new tree plantings over the years.

Arlington County Tree Canopy Fund

In recent years, Fairlington has taken advantage of a wonderful program called the Tree Canopy Fund (TCF) offered by Arlington County. The goal of the fund is to increase Arlington County's tree canopy.

Through this program, private property owners, including condo associations, can apply to have native trees planted on their property free of charge.

Fun tree facts

• Imagine something that takes carbon dioxide out of the air, puts oxygen into the air, runs entirely by solar energy, and needs minimal care. You got it. It's a tree!

Most of Fairlington's trees are native species, which is

a good thing. They evolved together with other plants,

insects, and wildlife and so are adapted to the soil and

climate. Our trees are a critical part of our ecosystem.

- The shade of mature trees may reduce air temperatures 9 to 13 degrees F on a hot summer day.
- Trees play an important role in slowing down and absorbing rainwater, which helps improve water quality and reduce stormwater runoff.
- A common misconception is that root growth mirrors the growth of a tree's crown. A tree's root system can extend horizontally up to three times wider than the canopy.
- About 90 percent of the water and mineral absorption of a tree takes place within a foot of the ground surface.

Some tips on tree care

Planting a tree is an investment in the future since it takes decades for a tree to grow and mature. Here are some tips to protect your investment.

- Water a new tree regularly, especially during the first two to three years after planting.
- To water, place a hose a foot from the trunk and turn the water on at a trickle. Let it run for about an hour. Do this every three to four days during periods without significant rainfall. Watering gators or bags also work well. Fill them once a week.
- Critical nutrients flow in a layer immediately under the bark of a tree from the roots to the leafy crown and vice versa. It is important to protect the bark from damage. Staking a new tree and a providing a wide circle of mulch will help keep mowers and weed-whackers away from the trunk.

Fairlington presidents welcome non-profit supporting independence for seniors

The Fairlington Presidents met for their quarterly meeting and discussed the following topics:

Arlington Neighborhood Village (ANV)—Jeanne Radday, the Member Services Manager of ANV, presented a comprehensive summary of the mission and goals of this non-profit, all-volunteer organization.

ANV provides the "extra help" older adults need to continue living in their own homes as they age—safely, independently, and with an enhanced quality of life. As we age, simple tasks (driving, shopping, changing a light bulb) become tricky, or even hazardous. ANV volunteers provide that extra help; a ride to a medical appointment, the grocery store or bank; running an errand to pick up a prescription; helping with technology; or being a friendly visitor, walking buddy, or phone contact.

Since 2014, ANV has grown from an idea between friends to a thriving village with over 355 members, one third of which are lowerincome seniors. More than 200

active volunteers directly serve members ranging in age from 58 to 100. When Covid-19 struck, ANV quickly retooled to help support Arlington seniors, operating continuously through the pandemic.

In 2021, ANV volunteers fulfilled 2,680 requests, almost half of which were round trip rides to medical appointments or the grocery store; drove 30,000 miles at their own expense; and donated 8,611 hours. In January of 2022, ANV volunteers received a COVID Heroes award from the Arlington County Board for their steadfast commitment to helping seniors get through the pandemic safely.

ANV's long-term vision is to become an "essential" service for Arlington seniors aging in place in all parts of the county and at all income levels. ANV welcomes your

Condo fees—Given inflation and aging infrastructure, the likelihood of condo fee increases is on all Fairlington residents' minds. Condo fees ensure the associations can perform required maintenance and services to keep the communities safe and beautiful. The master deed of each association stipulates how the condo fee is to be assessed. In most cases, the fee is based on the percentage of ownership of each condo model. The presidents discussed how best to manage the impact of increases and engaging with residents.

Vehicle exhaust noise—Vehicle exhaust noise along King Street and Quaker Lane has become a nuisance. The Virginia legislature passed legislation HB 632 that allows local authorities to pass ordinances making excessive exhaust noise a primary offense and permitting law enforcement to ticket drivers. The law goes into effect on July 1, 2022.

Board meetings still virtual—Most association board meetings are still virtual. It was noted that many associations have seen an increase in positive participation in board meetings thanks to the virtual format. The few rude interruptions during some meetings has led to measures being taken to curtail the disturbances.

Little libraries—It was suggested that it might be useful to all Fairlington residents if a "little library" be set up at the South Fairlington community center. As most of the associations already have a little library in their common area, it was deemed unnecessary to pursue the idea.

The Presidents will meet again in the fall.

Arlington Art Truck exhibit highlights clothing consciousness

The Arlington Art Truck visited Fairlington on a farmer's market Sunday in June to highlight the fact our fashion choices matter more than we think.

Did you know that since the advent of petroleum-based textiles many clothing items will live longer lives than the original wearers? That's right, some textiles can take over 200 years to decompose.

Laure Drogoul, a Baltimore-based artist and Professor at Maryland Institute College of Art, knows this and her exhibit on the Arlington Art Truck takes the viewer on a textile journey that spans about 170,000 years!

The exhibit, called From Our Waist to Waste: Is Fashion Sustainable (?), shows the evolution of clothing and how the switch from natural fibers like cotton to synthetic materials like polyester and spandex have made clothing part of the global non-biodegradable, landfill problem.

This wasn't another first-world, feel-bad, admonishment though. The artist's intent is very clear throughout the exhibit; shop carefully and mindfully, donate with intent, reuse, recycle, and repurpose.

Environmental stewardship is everyone's responsibility and Arlington County and the greater Fairlington community takes this responsibility seriously. We recycle everything that we can in our neighborhood recycling program and many of us still take glass items to the Arlington Trades Center for a more earth-friendly footprint.

The partnership of Drogoul and the Textile Studio of Arlington Cultural Affairs/Arlington Arts has taken another strong step in ensuring that our community can make mindful decisions about things that matter. This type of social responsibility has been a hallmark of Arlington County and the local communities.

Tip 1: Calculate your household's greenhouse gas footprint. The average greenhouse gas footprint for each American is 8–16 tons per year, one of the highest rates in the world. How does your own footprint compare? Get a sense of which of your daily activities contribute to greenhouse gas emissions to understand new behaviors you can adopt to fight climate change. Tip 2: Reduce energy consumption using "smart" power strips. Generating electricity and heat by burning fossil fuels produces a significant percentage of greenhouse gasses. About a quarter of all residential electricity consumption comes from devices in sleep power mode; this is known as vampire energy consumption and costs an estimated \$19 billion per year. A simple and inexpensive way to save energy is to use smart power strips. A smart power strip automatically shuts off power to a device—such as your printer, computer, or television—when it detects the device has gone into sleep mode. This could reduce your household energy consumption by as much as 10 percent.


System.

juveniles, high school students, many of them repeat offenders because the standard for making arrests and detention for juveniles is much higher.

This makes initiatives like ACPD's youth outreach program all the more important, as the key to preventing this type of crime is early intervention with at-risk teens. Another key topic of discussion centered on the new muffler noise law that will go in to effect in July of this year.

Francis says the county does not yet have a plan for exercising this new authority, but there is one under development.

Enforcing this law is difficult given that noisy cars are often long gone by the time police could arrive at the scene. Given current police staffing challenges, Francis said he did not envision this being a top priority for law enforcement in the near future.

The police representatives closed the presentation by reminding all Fairlington residents to reach out with any ideas or concerns.

"Many great ideas about how to solve policing problems come from community suggestions, not from the police themselves," said Francis.





DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



What the eyes cannot see: the feels and smells of the garden

In any garden, there is much to savor besides seeing a red rose in full bloom. If you know someone who cannot see, invite him or her to your Fairlington garden after you've planted some of the following specimens. These plants appeal more to the senses of touch and smell than sight.

Lamb's Ear is a ground cover with a velvety leaf. Fine hair covers the entire leaf's surface. Once you feel it, you'll know why the plant received its nickname.

Sedum comes in many cultivars but `Autumn Rose' has a rubbery leaf. Pinch the succulent and it feels like you're touching the sole of your sneaker.

Juniper has bristly foliage. It feels like you're rubbing your hand along a hairbrush or pet comb. Brush your hand against the leaves and feel its unique texture.

Red-Hot Poker has a flower in the shape of a mini football. Ever squeeze a Nerf ball? Well, softly grabbing the flower of this perennial feels the same way.

Daphne odora's fragrant flower will make your day, even on a rainy Monday. Daphne blooms in winter and resembles the magnolia and gardenia flower with its potent fragrance. Nudge your nose onto the dome-shaped flower and you'll inhale pure sweetness.

Fern has lace-like fronds. Open your hand near the base of the plant.

Make a fist around a frond and move your fist to the end of the stem. It will feel like handling a lace scarf or doily.

Pyracantha has it all. The 2-3-inchlong appendages (what I call 'prickers') are sharp but interesting. Touch them carefully. Then there are the berries, which form in autumn. Close your fist gently against a clump of fruit and it'll feel like you have a handful of grapes.

Columbine has a unique flower. How so? The stamens protrude from the center like a giraffe's eyelashes. The flower petals open wide like the end of a trumpet. Run your thumb over the flower and feel its delicate parts.

Clematis is a vine with a 5-inchwide flower. What's more gorgeous is the bud. Turn your pinky finger sideways and pinch it. It's 'mushy' like the Clematis bud. It even has very fine hair covering its almond-shape.

Yucca has the sharpest leaf tip of any plant. Gently touch it with the tip of your index finger and it'll feel like you're touching the point of a sword.

River birch is a tree with exfoliating bark along its trunks. Take your open hand and then close it over a trunk. It'll feel like you're making a fist over a pile of potato chips.

Catalpa is a tree with elongated fruit pods. They are on the median strips at the corner of South Utah Street and South 32nd Road. These pods are 14-inches long, smooth with a sharp point at the tip. No other fruit is as long or as pointed.


