Celebrate July 4 in festive Fairlington style

As in years past, July 4 means it is time for the annual Fairlington Independence Day parade. One of Fairlington's most popular events, the parade is jointly sponsored by Fairlington Villages and the Fairlington Citizens Association (FCA).

A true neighborhood celebration, the parade is made up of individuals and families on bikes and scooters, in wagons, and on foot. The parade is also dog-friendly, and many

people bring their four-legged friends to join in the festivities.

The parade itself is open to anyone who wants to march. If you want to participate, be sure to meet at the old Fairlington fire station at 3116 S. Abingdon St. by 9:45 a.m. so there is adequate time to line up. The parade will step off at 10 a.m. sharp! While not a requirement, wearing red, white, and blue is definitely encouraged.

As they are waiting for the parade to start, neighbors may pass the time by admiring one another's efforts to festoon their bikes, scooters, and strollers with patriotic streamers, garlands, and pennants. Don't forget to bring American flags to wave as you stroll. And if you don't want to march, you can certainly stand along the sidewalk and cheer the marchers on.

This year we anticipate the return of the popular fifer duo, dressed in traditional colonial garb. Fire Station 9 has agreed to provide a fire truck if it's not required to respond to an emergency. Arlington County Police Department officers on motorcycles will lead off the parade.

The parade marches along Abingdon St. from the old fire station to the Fairlington Villages Community Center parking lot, 3005 S. Abingdon St. There are lots of spots along Abingdon St. between 30th Rd. and 31st St. for spectators to watch, wave, and cheer as the parade passes by.

Following the parade, there is a community-wide celebration at the Fairlington Villages Community Center parking lot with free hot dogs ("breakfast sandwiches") and cold drinks. A bake sale benefitting the Arlington Food Assistance Center will be available to satisfy your sweet tooth.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Arlington County Board will lose two strong and skilled members this year with the retirements of Katie Cristol and Christian Dorsey. Both have been good friends of Fairlington throughout their service on the board.

July 4 will mark Katie's last day on the board. She will become CEO of the Tysons Community Alliance, a new nonprofit public-private partnership created to boost the continued residential and economic growth of the Fairfax County community. She's particularly well-suited for that.

But it will feel a bit strange for Katie not to be at the Fairlington Fourth of July parade. Both before COVID and after, she and her family—initially just Katie and her husband and Bear (their dog) but subsequently including her son—were regulars at this community celebration.

Often she didn't formally speak; she just showed up and quietly mingled with the crowd. That's the kind of unpretentious, but engaged, leadership that has made her such an effective voice on the board.

But she was more formally engaged with Fairlington as well, speaking at several of FCA's monthly meetings, attending events at the Fairlington Community Center, and helping us with things like the Fairlington Farmers Market. She was always thoughtful and knowledgeable. Quite simply, she was a valuable advocate for our neighborhood.

Christian also was readily available in Fairlington. He was always quick to accept our invitation to speak at FCA meetings, and he focused on the details of activities around our neighborhood, such as improvements in Shirlington and the preservation of affordable housing at Park Shirlington.

Sometimes during county board meetings where the topic was some other county issue, I have heard Christian talk with personal knowledge about things in Fairlington. It's that kind of familiarity with our community that made him such a thoughtful leader.

Finally, it has been a personal pleasure to work with both of them, knowing that they would respectfully hear our concerns and carefully consider them, even if they occasionally might come out differently on the merits. You can't ask for more from elected officials.

In November Arlington voters will select their successors. I hope the new members will be as engaged and committed to Fairlington as their predecessors have been. Thank you, Katie and Christian.

Police brief neighborhood leaders on increasing violence at Bradlee Center

Representatives of Alexandria and Arlington County Police met with the Fairlington Council of Presidents in late May to brief the community on updates regarding the uptick in violence at Bradlee Center, the closest shopping center to Fairlington.

In the past year, Bradlee Center has experienced a fatal stabbing of a high school student, a shooting that damaged property, and numerous reports of fighting and vandalism.

Cpt. Courtney Ballantine, the head of the Alexandria community engagement division, was joined by Arlington's Cpl. Malone and Lt. Proud, the latter of whom lives in Fairlington Villages.

"This is not a police department only fix, not an ACPS only fix," he said. The solution needs to come from the entire community, he suggested, including an increase in after-school programs for students and mentoring opportunities.

Currently there are two off-duty Alexandria police officers monitoring Bradlee Center during weekday school hours. They are paid for by the owner of the shopping center and do have the power to make arrests.

Alexandria High School has also changed its procedures from releasing all students at once for lunch, to now releasing them for staggered lunch breaks. Students are no longer permitted to go off-site for lunch.

These changes do not eliminate all opportunities for loitering and crime, as many students utilize the DASH bus stop across the street from McDonalds. This is one of the major arteries for students traveling to Alexandria High School or Minne Howard, and would cause too much disruption to be moved, according to DASH.

Ballantine also said that much of the problem stems from the aftermath of pandemic policies that left many children without structure or supervision.

"Kids forgot how to be students. Parents aren't where they need to be and kids are on their own," he said.

It is also a commonly-known phenomenon that businesses tend not to want to press charges against students for shoplifting. In some cases, that's not a local decision; it's a company-wide decision. The costs of staff time in showing up in court to press charges lead companies to decline to press charges for small incidents and this opens the door to would-be thieves.

Alexandria city has set up an informal working group involving the school, the police department, and the business property owner.

Later in June, Cpl. Malone also addressed the Fairlington community about crime and safety in the neighborhood - including incidents of larceny from autos in Fairlington (5 stolen airbags from Hondas), bitcoin scams, and the use of cameras, particularly models that could fit Fairlington's architecture.

Pedestrian safety at the forefront of recent county talks

Fairlingtonians are fortunate to live in a pedestrian friendly community. It is one of the many reasons that some people choose to call Fairlington home. At the same time, Fairlington has a lot of vehicular traffic including resident's coming and going, Metrobus routes, school buses, and nonresidential traffic transiting the roads within our community.

Sometimes, especially when both vehicle and pedestrian traffic are at peak levels, this can present challenges and safety concerns.

One such concern that was recently brought to the Fairlington Citizen Association's (FCA) attention, is regarding safety at the pedestrian crossing on S. Abingdon Street (next to the Fairlington Villages Community Center and tennis courts), specifically when parents and children are walking to and from Abingdon Elementary School.

As residents may recall, this crossing has had a School

include:

Crossing Guard assigned to this location in the past, but does not currently. Also, the Arlington County Department of Environmental Services conducted a review of this crossing in 2021 and made subsequent safety enhancements.

In response to the recent concern that was brought to the FCA's attention, the FCA has initiated outreach to Arlington County to inquire about potential safety measures for the S. Abingdon Street crosswalk.

Through these conversations, the FCA has learned of several key points regarding the S. Abingdon Street crosswalk. Some of these findings

In 2021, Arlington County enhanced the crosswalk with an in-street pedestrian crossing bollard and relocated the school crossing signs to within the curb extension

Everyone loves fireflies

Fireflies (which are actually beetles) are fascinating creatures that light up our nights and bring a sense of magic and mystery to our environment. There are over 2,000 different firefly species around the world, and they are found on every continent except Antarctica.

Over the years, there has been a decrease in the number of fireflies. Scientist attribute the firefly population decline to artificial light pollution, pesticides, and habitat loss. The good news is that each of us can take steps to protect the firefly at each stage of their life cycle in our patios and common grounds by improving and increasing their natural habitat.

Firefly life cycle

The firefly life cycle begins with an egg deposited in the soil or near the soil surface. Fireflies prefer moist soils and will often choose to place their eggs under leaf litter, where the soil is less likely to dry out.

After about three or four weeks the firefly eggs hatch and the larva look somewhat wormlike. The firefly larvae usually live in the soil and hunt slugs, snails, worms and other insects. Larvae emerge from their eggs in late summer and live through the winter before pupation in the spring. Some species may spend two winters before pupating.

During the pupal stage, the larva undergoes a remarkable transformation where its body is broken down, and special groups of transformative cells are activated to change the insect from a larva into its adult form.

When the adult firefly emerges, its only real purpose is to reproduce. Not all fireflies feed as adults - some simply mate, produce offspring, and die. But when adults do feed, they are usually predacious and hunt other insects. Fireflies flash to find a mate, using a species-specific pattern to locate compatible individuals of the opposite sex.

The complete life cycle can take anywhere from a couple of months to two or three years, with the majority of the life cycle spent as larvae in the ground.

Improve and increase firefly natural habitat

Leave the leaves in your patio and use them like Mother Nature would, as mulch, and give the fireflies a place to lay their eggs. Lobby to have your association leave the leaves in the foundation beds instead of removing them in fall and spring.

Do not apply lawn chemicals and broad-spectrum pesticides, which kill the fireflies in all stages. Firefly larvae eat other undesirable insects, so they are one of nature's pest controls. If mosquitos are the problem, use a fan outside as mosquitos can't fly in the wind. Mosquitos do not venture far from home and cannot reproduce without standing water. Remove all sources of standing water in your area.


Keep nighttime lighting to a minimum to help the fireflies find each other to mate. Turn lights off if you are not on your patio. Use motion-sensor lights to reduce light pollution.

areas on both sides of the street.

The crosswalk does not currently qualify for the deployment of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB), primarily because RRFB resources are limited and placement is prioritized at existing crossing locations along multi-lane arterial roadways.

Requests for an assigned School Crossing Guard can be submitted to the Arlington County Police Department. However, there may be current staffing shortages that could impact the ACPD's ability to assign a crossing guard to this location.

In addition to these findings, the FCA consulted with the Arlington County Vision Zero Program to learn about possible safety solutions. Through this outreach, the FCA learned that Abington Elementary School and the surrounding community is slated for a school zone retrofit that will take place sometime in 2024. The retrofit process is as follows:

1) Review the street segments to confirm candidates for

dynamic (flashing beacon) or static (permanent 20 mph signs) school zones—this includes coordination with any ongoing projects or investigations.

- 2) Meet with staff at Abingdon Elementary School to confirm the segments and identify other safety needs/locations within their school zone.
- 3) Create an engineering plan with new signage, pavement markings, and other identified tools or features.
- 4) Install the improvements.

In an effort to keep the Fairlington community informed regarding the school zone retrofit, the FCA has invited a Vision Zero Program representative to present to the FCA board sometime in late 2023. The meeting and presentation date remains TBD, but will be open to all Fairlington residents. Please stay tuned as the FCA will provide more information regarding this meeting/presentation once the details are confirmed.

FCA to examine county permitting process

A number of Fairlington residents and their contractors have discovered that they now need to get a zoning waiver from Arlington County for structural changes within their units, ranging from installing egress windows to relocating interior walls.

Recent meetings of the county's Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) have considered waiver requests from Fairlington residents. Many Fairlington units do not satisfy the setback requirement under the county zoning ordinance, though the ordinance was adopted subsequent to the completion of Fairlington as a housing development.

In a May meeting of the BZA a couple of BZA members expressed irritation that they were having to consider these waiver requests and warned that they may start voting against approving them as a way to encourage the county to change the rule as it applies to Fairlington.

At its July virtual meeting FCA will consider this matter and discuss what steps FCA should take to address this problem.

Fairlington Presidents meet for a quarterly update

The neighborhood association presidents met with Arlington and Alexandria executives and police regarding incidents and deteriorating safety at Bradlee Shopping Center. In attendance were Libby Garvey, Vice Chair, Arlington County Board; Guy Land, President, FCA; Lt. Steven Proud and Corporal Patrice Malone, Arlington County Police; and Captain Courtney Ballantine, Alexandria Police Department.

The Fairlington presidents meet every quarter to discuss pressing issues related to the neighborhood in order to ensure healthy communication between the different associations.

Capt. Ballantine offered the following updates regarding the Bradlee Center incidents:

- It was requested that Alexandria City High School stagger the end of school day to decrease the number of kids at Bradlee at any given time. Open lunch is no longer allowed because once the kids leave the campus they don't return.
- The kids mostly spend their money at the Bradlee McDonald's. Thus, McDonald's originally hired a private security guard during the school day to keep the peace but now have hired an off-duty police officer.

- Alexandria students ride the Dash bus between school and Bradlee...for free. The police department has suggested that the Dash bus not stop at Bradlee during school opening and closing times.
- Most of the problems have occurred in a 'post-pandemic' world in which parents have multiple jobs and kids are left unsupervised.
- Safeway, Walgreens, and other stores are seeing brazen shoplifting but not prosecuting under certain dollar amounts due to corporate policies.

Lt. Steven Proud and Corporal Patrice Malone discussed crime statistics and safety in Fairlington. They noted that the County is down almost 100 officers. They recommended that residents be alert and do the following to deter crime in the area:

- If you see something, say something.
- Keep car doors locked; don't leave keys or items visible in car; park in lighted area when possible.
- Keep your outside house lights on at night.
- Install security cameras as permitted by association rules.
- Police can come and do a security assessment.




