Virginia Delegate David Englin, whose 45th district seat represents parts of Alexandria, Fairfax, and Arlington, including Fairlington, will review the 2011 General Assembly session that concluded in March, when state lawmakers addressed nearly 2,000 pieces of legislation. (For bill tracking, go online to the Legislative Information System, www.lis.virginia. gov.) And he can provide an insider's assessment of the once-every-ten-years special redistricting session that followed the regular GA session, including news of re-drawn 31st and 32nd Senate districts. Now serving his second term in the Virginia House of Delegates, Englin will stand for re-election (currently unopposed) in November.

Some of the successful legislative initiatives that Del. Englin describes from this year's legislative session include:

- Repeal of the accelerated sales tax: It was a state budget "gimmick" that shifted money between fiscal years, and it placed a cash-flow burden on small businesses by requiring them to remit sales taxes to the state before having collected that revenue from their customers. The final budget eliminated the tax for 80 percent of Virginia businesses.
- Streamlining business paperwork: The legislation moved Virginia in the direction of "one-stop shopping" for business paperwork by allowing businesses to register with Commissioners of Revenue or local finance departments—rather than the state—to collect sales taxes at the same time they file other necessary forms.
- Virginia Cider Act: The act creates an economic development opportunity for Virginia apple growers and cider producers by allowing naturally fermented cider without artificial caps on alcohol content. "According to industry experts, the Virginia Cider Act opens the door for Virginia to become the world's leading producer of traditional hard cider (the kind George Washington and Thomas Jefferson served at their dinner tables) and it creates new opportunities to attract tourism dollars to the Commonwealth."

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Getting Osama Bin Laden is a Fairlington issue, too

There's a long lead time for a monthly newsletter, so I'm writing this several weeks before you're reading it. As I sit here, I'm looking at the front page of the *Washington Post* and just about every page-one story is about the successful mission to get Bin Laden, which happened last week.

I know this column is supposed to be about Fairlington issues, but 9/11 and its aftermath *is* a Fairlington issue. Here's why I say this: Fairlington has a unique relationship with the Pentagon and our military in general. Built to accommodate the housing needs of World War II Americans in uniform, Fairlington continues to welcome many military families as neighbors.

Many Fairlington residents were at the Pentagon on 9/11. I myself was on the platform at the Pentagon Metro station when the airplane hit the other side of the building. My experience is nothing compared to other Fairlington residents who were much closer to where the Pentagon was hit. And that's not even to mention our neighbors who have been deployed in the two wars that have come since 9/11.

I had one neighbor who was a Lieutenant Colonel in the Air Force at the time. Her office was destroyed by the attack on the Pentagon, but luckily she was on travel and not there. It was a couple of days, however, before we were all sure she was okay.

Another neighbor is an officer with the D.C. Metropolitan Police Department, and for months after 9/11 he put in backbreaking overtime that no amount of money can compensate for. And we've all been reminded that the toll of answering the call to duty weighs not just on the individual, but on families as well.

In the years since 9/11, Fairlington families have consistently seen loved ones go off to Afghanistan and Iraq, sometimes on very little notice. As neighbors, we can't help but know the toll it takes on our friends and neighbors. We try to help out as best we can, but the families' burden is still heavy.

So the amazing mission to get Bin Laden is a real boost for Fairlington. It's symbolic, true—but it's also very real. The feeling as I'm sitting here looking at the *Post* is simply overwhelming. I realize it will be several weeks before you read this, but I'm betting it will still feel the same.

# Libby Garvey tells the story of Wakefield

At the FCA meeting in May, APS School Board chair Libby Garvey updated residents on construction plans for the new Wakefield High School, and she wow'd the crowd with a display of hot-off-the-presses design schematics for the dazzling new school. While classes continue in the old, 1950s-era building, the new school, with an innovative geo-thermal heating system and allnew-everything, will be built on the current park-

ing lot and playing fields. Starting this month with a groundbreaking ceremony on June 9, construction will begin in earnest on July 1, and neighbors will watch the new school go up at the corner of S. George Mason Drive and Dinwiddie Street. When construction is completed, the old building will be torn down to make way for bigger and better playing fields.

The story behind Wakefield is as impressive as the new school promises to be. With Arlington's other two high schools renovated, Wakefield was "next up" for improvements almost ten years ago. Garvey, who has served on the School Board for 14 years, worried that funds and resolve would run out before the county got to Wakefield. Sure enough, questions about funding slowed the project when the economy was booming and construction costs were very expensive; projections had a new Wakefield as something to be considered for 2014. But Garvey persevered, pushing to complete, at

BRAC update: A change in the National Defense Authorization Act moving through Congress in mid-May would allow the Secretary of Defense the power to delay seven BRAC moves for a year. Congressman Jim Moran (D-Va.), who represents Alexandria where the Mark Center is located, said he requested that one of those delays include the complex on I-395, where many have predicted gridlock by September when 6,400 new DoD employees are scheduled to arrive. The proposed delay would "give us a year's reprieve," said Moran. The ultimate decision rests with the Secretary of Defense.

least, the new school's design phase. (Garvey, unfazed by less than fullthroated endorsement from county colleagues, and accustomed to budget wrangling, dismissed the opposition she faced as mere predictable "fussing.") Then the recession hit and threatened all capital projects. It also brought an opportunity. As the bottom fell out of the construction market in 2008, the School Board, with Wakefield designs in hand, was prepared to

move on contracting for the new building. Financing was key: Ultimately the new Wakefield, built now, will cost \$30 million less than what was originally projected for building earlier or later.



# Notify the county of address changes to receive real estate tax bills

Real estate property tax bills were sent out around May 15 for first-installment payments due on June 15 (second-installment bills will be sent out around September 5 for payments due on October 5). If your mailing address has changed, you must notify Arlington's Department of Real Estate Assessment. Failure to do so means you may not receive future tax bills—which, in turn, could mean penalties and interest applied to delinquent taxes. DREA maintains a form for change of address notification (with instructions for completion and filing deadlines included) available for download on the county Web site. In addition, you can receive the form from DREA by requesting it: by mail or in person at 2100 Clarendon Blvd. #611 Arlington, VA 22201; by phone at 703-228-3920; by e-mail at realog2@arlingtonva.us. # Fatal bike accident on Mother's Day—a reminder to cycle safely



Arlington police investigated a fatal traffic accident, which occurred when a bicyclist collided with a vehicle on May 8 in the 4000 block of Four Mile Run Drive. Investigation revealed that an adult man was riding his bicycle south (downhill) on Walter Reed Drive and turned right onto the access road of Four Mile Run. It appears that when the bike rider turned onto the access/

service road, he crossed into oncoming traffic and struck an occupied vehicle in the oncoming lane of traffic. The driver of the vehicle stayed at the scene; the bicyclist was transported to a local hospital and pronounced dead.

The county's Traffic Engineering and Operations bureau said that changes to the steep stretch of S. Walter Reed were already planned before the accident occurred. Work scheduled to begin this summer would add safety improvements to Walter Reed between S. Pollard Street and Four Mile Run, which include:

- Removing the slip lane right-hand turn onto the service road
- Replacing the painted asphalt medians with planted, landscaped medians
- Curb extensions, or "nubs," and raised pedestrian islands at Quincy, Quebec, and Pollard Streets
- Six foot curb extension on the east side of Walter Reed at the W&OD Trail crosswalk
- Additional signage for drivers approaching the W&OD Trail crosswalk
- A parking lane stripe and "sharrow" markings to the downhill lanes (the uphill lanes already have a dedicated bike lane and a parking stripe).

# No grilling on balconies

The Fire Department wants to remind residents of apartments, condos, duplexes, and multi-family dwellings that open-flame cooking on balconies is extremely dangerous—also, a Class 1 misdemeanor. Because of the public-safety danger, laws against apartment grilling are strict. Anyone caught grilling illegally in Arlington can face up to one year in jail or a \$2,500 fine. According to ACFD: No charcoal cooker, brazier, hibachi, grill, or any gasoline (or other flammable or combustible liquid or liquefied petroleum gas) -fired stove or similar device...shall be ignited or used on the balconies of apartment buildings, stacked units, or other structures with similar occupancy. ACFD recommends using an electric grill instead. Editor's note: Some people say the regulation's language is confusing; others complain that a townhouse's wood deck is surely more flammable than a north Fairlington balcony made of concrete with steel railings. Nevertheless, per Arlington fire regulations, grilling is not allowed on balconies.

# Crime stopper—your cell phone

On May 11, the Arlington County Police Department reports, they received a call about a man exposing himself in view of children near Tyrol Hill Park. Police arrested the suspect, who was charged with Indecent Liberties with Children and held without bond. Third District Commander Captain Brett Butler noted that the original call was made by a witness who observed the suspect exposing himself and called police right away—which allowed police to locate the man a short distance away. Captain Butler underscored the timely reminder that citizens should always have their cell phones with them. And he recommends you program the ACPD nonemergency number into your phone—703-558-2222.

Utah and 34th Streets, repair work on a defect in the new sewer line continued in May, with completion expected by June. Part 2 of the county's sanitary sewer improvement project will consist of

the installation of a new 12-inch sewer line along S. Utah, running north from S. 32nd Road to the Utah Park area. The work is expected to begin this summer.

# DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



# View eyesores as opportunities

Eliminating eyesores, inside or out, is the first step for any successful design. This means removing clutter and masking distracting elements. The key to masking is "Be subtle." Be too obvious that you're hiding something and it really beckons. Here's how to make your Fairlington front garden bed or patio garden eyesore-free:

Window well: Aluminum and usually rusted, the window well's look could be improved by spray-painting the curved frame black to match the half-moon grill cover. Better yet, circle that frame with evergreen ground cover. Its foliage shields the frame and lets your eye move to the attractive iron rail. Ground cover suggestions: liriope, lenten rose, coral bells, skimmia, heather, crimson pygmy barberry, or leucothoe.

Electric meter: You'll usually find

it two to three feet above ground and between the dining room window and fence. Plant a vertical specimen in this corner and you'll hide the meter and white downspout. The meter "disappears" and the downspout's dominance is mitigated. Try planting a nandina, camellia, or photinia. All are evergreen and flower.

Concrete stoop: It's there and not going anywhere. Soften the edges with a one-foot-tall ground cover with pendulous foliage. The leaves drape over the stoop edge and take your eye off its right angles (to my eye, unsightly elements in any garden). Day lily foliage is perfect here since the sword-like leaves reach two feet long.

**A/C unit:** It's unwise to blanket it with a plant or small fence since this decreases air flow. But a subtle

planting here moves your eye off this "metal box." Euonymus "Green Spire," dwarf nandina, pieris, mountain laurel, or Scotch broom situate well here since each grows three to four feet tall with minimal width.

Wood fence: Even when new, it's dominant and stark. Vertical plants minimize the fence's height and length. Plant a camellia, holly "Steeds," juniper "Skyrocket," nandina, or arborvitae to invite "green" into this "woodscape."

**Concrete patio:** Lining the edges is a way to bring your eye away from the sheer mass of the surfacing material (9 x 12 feet). Any ground cover aforementioned will work. If you want to totally "eliminate" it, paint the surface to match the building's brick or cover it with brick or flagstone.

Balcony understory: Often used as a "storage" site for undesirables, it can be hidden with latticework painted black to match the balcony frame and iron railing. Or plant three to four-foot-tall evergreens along the outer edge. This "brings" the railing into the landscape since your eye is pulled from the shrub branches, upward.

**Clean out:** It's that white plastic pipe port sitting six inches above ground in your front shrub bed. Any one-foot-tall ground cover (see above) will effectively hide it.




chance to find support and friendship.
