At the Fairlington Citizens Association (FCA) monthly meeting on April 14, members of the Arlington County Police Department's (ACPD) community outreach team provided an overview of the county's neighborhood crime statistics and addressed specific crime concerns in Fairlington. The presentation was led by Captain Scott Linder and Sergeant Jasmine Senn, as well as several members of the team.



Captain Scott Linder offers analysis on neighborhood crime and the best ways to prevent becoming a victim of crime in 2021.

Overall, crimes reported in Fairlington have declined in 2021

relative to 2020. The greatest threat to the community remains larceny from auto (breaking into cars that are usually left unlocked).

Sgt. Senn stressed the importance of making sure car doors are locked at night and valuables on patios secured, noting that the majority of crimes were ones of opportunity. County-wide the largest crime threat, car-jacking in the Crystal City / Pentagon City area, had declined significantly due to a new safety strategy put in place this year.

The ACPD representatives acknowledged neighborhood-wide concerns that occurred over the past year including graffiti, white supremacist stickers on public property, and the suspicious gray jeep incidents. A valuable takeaway from the discussion was guidance on when to call the police to make a report and when to submit reports online.

As a general rule, if an incident has already happened, like vandalism, residents are encouraged to submit a report online. If an incident is happening in real time (e.g., someone in the process of spray-painting or a suspicious vehicle following someone), residents should call.

Capt. Linder noted that reports of suspicious activity can be subjective. He made it clear that suspicion should be based on "the activity and not the person."

The presentation drew participation and questions from residents who

How can FCA add value to your Fairlington experience?

Are there problems you want us to tackle? Topics you want us to examine? What about activities to address needs that you and your neighbors share? Community conversations you want us to lead? Information you want about things that affect the neighborhood?

This month we will be hosting an online survey to learn your ideas on ways we can enhance the quality of life in our community. You can find it on our website or our Facebook page.

The board looks carefully at the results of the surveys. A couple of years ago our survey showed that many of you wanted us to focus more on the arts. As a result, last fall we sponsored our first-ever outdoor concert, featuring the Alexandria Symphony brass quintet. Roughly a hundred of you—socially distanced and masked—turned out, making it a huge success.

And the Fairlington Farmers Market, now a neighborhood institution, grew out of the results of an FCA survey in 2013.

FCA's work falls into three broad categories: providing the collective voice of Fairlington to local elected officials and policy makers; keeping you informed on things that could have specific effects on Fairlington; and sponsoring activities to strengthen the sense of community that makes Fairlington special.

What's the difference between FCA and your condo association? The condo association, to which you pay condo fees, focuses on the maintenance of your building and the general common property that surrounds it. The condo association promulgates and enforces rules on things such as pools, trash, signs, and architectural changes.

Arlington County (and the City of Alexandria as well) turns to FCA for the community's views on county policies, local infrastructure needs, and permits for specific activities or real estate development proposals.

Because we cover all of North and South Fairlington, as well as Park Shirlington and Shirlington House, we can sponsor activities that reach across all of the larger community. We can facilitate collaboration among the condo boards and their committees.



# Clothes dryer ignites in North Fairlington condo

The second-floor unit of an apartment building on Abingdon St. caught fire on Tuesday, March 16 around noon. The Arlington County Fire Department responded within minutes and sent 35 fire fighters, multiple fire trucks, an ambulance, and the fire marshal, which is standard procedure for a one-alarm fire. There were no injuries.

The fire was caused by the owners' clothing dryer. Antoine Hart II, deputy fire marshal for Arlington county, offered advice to homeowners and renters on preventing dryer fires.

The most important thing you can do is clean your lint trap—the mesh or screen trap located (on most models) below the dryer door—after every use, says Hart. He also recommends having the hose that leads from the dryer to the outside vent cleaned by a professional company once a year.

It is important to hire a reputable company to perform any work or maintenance on your dryer. Check that the service provider is licensed, bonded and insured. A good dryer vent company will also perform a mechanical inspection, check the electrical connection as well as

clean the lint trap and dryer hose.

Hart also warns to never put anything in the dryer that has chemicals, gasoline or any elements that could cause spontaneous combustion when heated. Always wash items that contain flammable residue first before putting them in the dryer.

### Free clothing swap offers community options to reduce waste

Dozens of Fairlington neighbors attended the second annual free clothing swap in the North Fairlington Community Center parking lot on Saturday, April 10. Participants donated used and outgrown items and browsed racks of others' clothing ready for a new home.

Clothing and household items are often overlooked as a category for recycling but the growth of initiatives like the Fairlington free clothing swap offers an opportunity to reduce clothing waste and save money.

North Fairlington resident Kristin Johnson organized the first swap in September 2020 in response to the cancellation of popular consignment sales due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The idea prompted dozens of Fairlingtonians to participate in donating and picking up clothing items. The Fairlington Villages condo association generously offered free use of the community center parking lot.

"The success of the swap is really a testament to this incredible community," said Johnson. "The people are

what make Fairlington great."

The first swap included women and children's clothes only and the second swap was expanded to include a small section of men's clothing as well.

Consignment sales and swaps are an especially attractive option for mothers of young children as growing children often require new sizes every four-six months. Rather than tossing nearly new clothing in a mass donation bin, or throwing it away, moms can swap

the too-small clothes for a new set in the right size.

The clothing swap plans to re-occur on a biannual basis in the fall and spring and requests for donations will be announced several weeks before. Other opportunities for free giving in the neighborhood include joining your local Buy Nothing group (https://buynothingproject.org/), or offering items for free pickup on your neighborhood Facebook group.

### Retiring AFB carrier remembers Fairlington in the baby boom

John Wertime remembers his first paper route in the early 1950s delivering local Arlington papers and *The Washington Post* throughout Fairlington, then a flat, treeless apartment community for government employees and military.

Up until a few months ago, Wertime continued his news route tradition over the last decade, delivering the *All Fairlington Bulletin (AFB)* to residents of Fairlington Meadows.

"Once a paper boy, always a paper boy," he said, chuckling. "I enjoyed delivering the *Bulletin* for the exercise and the chance to connect with neighbors."

Wertime remembers being on a waiting list to move into Fairlington in 1946, after his family was stationed in the area due to his father's World War II position with the Office of Strategic Services.

position with the Office of Strategic Services (a forerunner of the CIA.)

"We moved to an Arlington unit in South Fairlington just before Christmas of 1946," he recalled. "I was 5 years old."

The Fairlington of Wertime's childhood was bursting with children as the post-war baby boom reached its peak. He remembers attending elementary school at the building that is now the Fairlington Community Center.

"We had an incredible number of neighborhood playmates," said Wertime. "My mother had a cowbell she would ring in the afternoons to call me and my three brothers home for dinner."

Wertime moved away from Fairlington for his undergraduate and graduate studies and then lived in Iran for several years before returning in 1976 to raise his own family.

"When my wife and I were looking for a place to live after returning to the states, I introduced her to Fairlington and she fell in love," he said. "This place is like an island of calm and peace."

Wertime's daughter took on the role of delivering the AFB as a teen and he continued her delivery route when she went away to college. Wertime retired

as a carrier in March due to a medical condition.

The distribution manager for the AFB, Noemi Riviera, is also slated to retire this summer after more than 20 years of service. She will be replaced by Sarah Lloyd who lives in Fairlington Glen.

### Fairlington Architect's Map Reproduction—Now Available



The original map was probably prepared c. 1943 by the architect Kenneth Franzheim for the Defense Homes Corporation and subsequently revised for Fairmac, the firm that managed the post-World War II rental community from 1947-1972.

The map was updated by CBI Fairmac, the firm that oversaw its conversion to condominiums in 1972-1978, and later revised by the Fairlington Historical Society (FHS) to better define the villages.

It may feel like there are more cicadas than stars in the sky. After spending 17 years underground, they crawl to the surface one night, climb a stalk, and break out of their skin. Imagine what it must be like seeing daylight for the first time.

Their skin is actually an exoskeleton. That's right, insects, as well as many of their relatives, have an external skel-

eton. Cicada shells are easy to collect and examine. The best part is that the two front legs are sharp enough to attach to clothing, so they can be worn as a pin.

First of all, know that cicadas will not hurt you. They are large and clumsy, but not dangerous. They are part of the *Phylum Arthropoda* (jointed legs), the class *Insecta* (six-legged arthropods), and the suborder, *Hemiptera*, (sucking mouthparts). Their wings are sometimes called "roof like," since they look like a roof over their bodies when they are at rest. All members of this order are plant eaters.

Adult insects have three body sections, a head, thorax, and abdomen. These cicadas have two red eyes, as well as three smaller eyes on what you might think of as its nose. A large sucking mouth acts like a straw. The thorax is next. Six legs attach to it as well as four wings. Finally the abdomen, where a person can determine the males from females. On the male, you will find two panels called tymbals that beat like drums. That noise helps females find them. The female has a large needle

near the end of her abdomen called an ovipositor. Eventually she uses it to lay eggs into skinny tree branches.

This is why they have emerged; find a mate, mate, and lay eggs. Mission accomplished. Eggs are laid in thin tree branches, a process that kills the wood. When the eggs hatch the nymphs drop from the branch, crawl into the soil, and live among the tree roots for 17 years. Living there helps to aerate the soil for the trees, and for that the trees lose a few small branches.

Some people think the cicadas cause tree damage, and that can happen to younger, vulnerable trees. Small plants and trees can be covered with lightweight garden fabric for protection. Keep in mind that trees and cicadas evolved together.

The biggest beneficiary of the cicada emergence is other wildlife such as birds and mammals. This feast only arrives every 17 years, and who could pass up such a delicious meal?

By mid-June the 17-year cicadas will be gone. But not to worry, annual cicadas will fill the air with their calls later this summer.

### School board caucus launches 2021 election season

Arlington county Democrats will kick off the 2021 election season with an online balloting platform to determine whom the party will endorse for the Arlington School Board in the November general election. Voting will take place from Monday, May 17, through Sunday, May 23. In Virginia all school board candidates run as independents.

Two candidates met the March 1 deadline to be considered for an endorsement from Arlington Democrats: Miranda Turner and Mary Kadera. They are vying to replace current school board chair Monique O'Grady, who chose not to seek re-election.

According to county Democrats, the Internet-based platform, Democracy Live, will facilitate safe voting under COVID-19 conditions by enabling voters to cast ballots securely from their computers, tablets, or smartphones. Voting will be open 24/7 during the week of caucus voting and the platform will be mobile device compatible.

At press time county Republicans had not announced plans for endorsing in the school board race.

May also brings the deadline for registering to vote in the June 8 Democratic primary, which will see elections for Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, state Delegate, Arlington County Board, and Alexandria Mayor and City Council.

The registration deadline for the June primary is May 17. Residents may register online, by mail, or in person at the office of voter registration in Arlington (or Alexandria for Alexandria residents).

Absentee voting is available by mail or in-person. Forms for requesting absentee ballots may be obtained online at https://vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation.

The Republican party did not call for any primary elections in Arlington. County Republicans will attend a state convention, held at multiple sites, on May 8 to select candidates for statewide offices. The deadline for registering to attend the convention was April 12.

One resident asked about how police handled calls that might not meet the criteria of criminal behavior, but could be characterized as neighbor disagreement or offense.

Sgt. Senn explained that "when we get a call, we come," but that is not necessarily the best or most appropriate action. She encouraged residents to exercise alternatives to calling police.

Ultimately, if offi-

cers are unsure whether to respond to a call, they must engage their supervisor to make the decision of whether or not they are dispatched.

"People don't always know the right people to call." Sgt. Senn commented that sometimes it is a question of educating people before they act. "We are the last ones that should be invited to the party."

ACPD has guidance on whether a call to the police is merited. More info can be found at https://police.arlingtonva.us/online-police-reporting-system/

Another resident expressed concern over packages being stolen from porches. ACPD responded that usually this was a larger issue during the holiday season. If concerns persist, including "porch pick-up" buy/sell/trade items, residents should let their neighbors know that people may be coming to collect items.

With respect to observing speeding cars and properly using stop signs, residents can report traffic violations to 703-558-2222. Should it be warranted, ACPD will post electronic messaging boards in high traffic areas to increase driver awareness.

ACPD concluded by reassuring residents that Fairlington is a safe community and stating that they would be pleased to attend other meetings in the future.

If you ever have a dryer fire at your house, you should call 911 immediately. Pull the fire alarm (if there is one) to notify your neighbors and leave the building as quickly as possible. Be sure to close any doors behind you when you leave. An open door can accelerate air flow and make the fire much worse.

Here are some warning signs that signal you may have a problem with your dryer: loads take longer time to dry than expected, items are unusually hot to the touch when they come out of the dryer, or laundry is overheated or scorched after drying.





# DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



# Bring your spring a splash of color

Good riddance to the blustery winds and rains of April. I'll let the Temptations usher in our first warm month of Spring with lyrics from the 1965 hit, "My Girl."

"When it's cold outside, I've got the month of May.

I've got so much honey, the bees envy me.

I've got a sweeter song than the birds in the trees."

With flowers blooming, pollinators like bumblebees and butterflies are visiting newly opened buds to dine on nectar. Robins are hopping along in search of earthworms. Doves are peacefully nesting. Cardinals are calling out to females with their "chew-chew-chewing."

April can be hit or miss for landscaping. Plant inventories at local nurseries either are limited or crammed into heated, tarp-enclosed bubbles. Annual flowers don't arrive until late April. But this month, the plants you seek are on display.

Bulbous flowers are the first to appear. Crocus shows in March, far ahead of daffodil, hyacinth, tulip, and grape hyacinth. If you want color in early spring, plant these in the fall when Indian summer has passed. Annuals live from late April until the first frost in December. They display color for over seven months and then say "Goodbye" forever. Perennials return each year but have a dormancy period (when they look frail or they totally wither)

during winter. Some perennials are "tender" meaning they are intolerant of brutal winters.

Know if and when your patio receives sunlight. Morning sun is modest but afternoon is intense. A south-facing garden receives hotter sun than one facing north. Partial shade means there's a tree canopy nearby which filters the sun. Or maybe there is a "McMansion" next door which shields the sun.

One way to design a garden is to examine plant categories. This equips you with a practical shopping list. Type these phrases in an online search engine: sun-loving perennials, shade perennials, plants for full sun, plants for shade, small trees for patio gardens, ground cover (these grow horizontally, covering the soil area), evergreen trees, and ornamental (flowering) trees.


Think also about what will best fit your lifestyle. If your patio gets full sun, faces west and you travel a good deal, you will need drought-tolerant plants. Look at the pictures and read about each specimen. Mature height is important to note since it may be different from its size at the nursery.

If you seek various colors or prefer a monochromatic look, type your choice in an online window. For example, look up "red-flowering plants." When designing, don't forget about the foliage. Variegated leaves are beautiful. This means a line of color exists around the edge of a leaf or a splash of color covering the leaf.

Variegation comes in white (euonymus japonicus), ivory, yellow (aucuba), shades of green (hosta), and even pink (Wintercreeper euonymus). Simple leaf variegation can brighten a garden in heavy shade. Plus, it's always creative to have plants with leaves that aren't your ordinary green.






