County board chair Cristol to address FCA in-person May 11

Katie Cristol, chair of the Arlington County Board, will visit with Fairlington residents at the monthly meeting of the Fairlington Citizens Association (FCA) May 11. Marking a return to in-person FCA meetings, she will speak to the community in the Fairlington Community Center (FCC), 3308 S. Stafford St.

The meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in Room 100. All Fairlington residents and owners are invited to attend.

Cristol, who is in her second term as board chair, is no stranger

to Fairlington, having spoken to FCA in 2017, attended several Fairlington Fourth of July parades (sometimes with her husband, young son, and dog Bear), and made a number of visits to the Fairlington Farmers Market.

She was first elected to the county board in 2015 and was comfortably reelected in 2019.

Cristol is the co-chair of Arlington's Project PEACE, an interagency collaboration to address domestic and sexual violence in our community. Regionally, she represents Arlington on the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority and the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission, of which she is immediate past chair.

In declaring her priorities for Arlington earlier this year, Cristol highlighted increasing the quantity and quality of affordable housing; improving access to high quality, affordable childcare; and providing family-supporting wages for workers.

She called for a more racially equitable Arlington and for making climate action not a group of specific projects but a lens through which all the county's actions are viewed.

"What these two values—sustainability and equity—have in common,"

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The arrival of spring brings an explosion of activities in Fairlington. Just looking at some things that are on tap for the coming month suggests what a vibrant neighborhood this is.

The Fairlington Farmers Market returns for an 8th season on May 1. This has become a key component of life in Fairlington. Last year was the market's most successful ever, and the volunteer committee that oversees the market expect this year's to be even more popular.

Most of your favorite vendors are back for another year, reflecting the fact that the market is both a successful business activity and a great community gathering space.

FCA is pleased to again be a financial sponsor of the market. We took the lead in creating the market a decade ago and believe it continues to be a valuable asset for our community.

After two years off because of COVID, the popular Fairlington 5K Fun Run/Walk will course through the neighborhood on May 7. Registrations have already set a record, but there's still time to sign up if you haven't already done so. FCA is a financial sponsor.

This is truly a neighborhood activity in every respect. Most of the runners either live in Fairlington or are friends of Fairlingtonians.

The race benefits the physical education activities at Abingdon Elementary, and the proceeds also fund A Cure for Ellie, an organization that supports research on a cure for a 13-year-old Fairlington resident who was born with a rare and degenerative brain and spinal cord condition.

Please note that there will be temporary street closures, monitored by police, during the race.

After a COVID hiatus, the Fairlington Villages Spring Yard Sale will entertain shoppers on April 30. Vendors are limited to North Fairlington residents, but the sale welcomes customers from everywhere.

Finally, the summer swim season is almost on us. Most of the condo pools will open by Memorial Day—check the times and rules for your individual condo association.

Registration is now open for FINS (Fairlingtonians Interested in Neighborhood Swimming). As the number of kids in Fairlington has grown, so has participation in this program that builds skills and fosters camaraderie.

There are great opportunities to join your neighbors for fun activities. I hope to see you at some of them.



Fairlington 5K poised to set registrant record


As of mid-April, nearly 500 people have already registered for the Fairlington 5K set for May 7, 8:30 a.m. at Abingdon Elementary School. There is still time to sign up, and day-of registrations will be accepted from 7 to 7:45 a.m. on race day.

The special K-9 category, sponsored by the Animal Welfare League of Arlington will also take place on race day. There will be music, food, and even a special visit from a Disney character.







Local legislators report on General Assembly session

Policy and political differences between Democratic legislators and Republican Governor Glenn Youngkin marked many of the actions in the Virginia General Assembly this spring, according to Sen. Adam Ebbin and Del. Elizabeth Bennett-Parker.

The two legislators, who represent Fairlington in Richmond, visited with the FCA board in April, discussing highlights of the recent session. Both are Democrats.

Policy differences were particularly apparent in the big picture debates over the state budget, with the Republicancontrolled House of Delegates following the Governor's lead, while

the Democratic-controlled Senate approved a different plan.

Because legislators had not agreed on a final budget before the statutory end of the session, the General Assembly was scheduled to reconvene at the end of April to reach a final agreement.

"The Senate budget was more prudent," Ebbin said, noting its funding for mental health and addiction services, increased education funding, and more state support for affordable housing.

Bennett-Parker likewise emphasized the importance of teacher funding, saying that she hopes the final budget agreement will provide a teacher pay raise of 10 percent over the next two years.

The budgets also differed in how they proposed to deal with taxes. Gov. Youngkin proposed entirely eliminating the grocery tax, while the Senate budget would eliminate the state tax on groceries but not touch the local tax.

Fairlington's legislators expressed concern about eliminating the local tax without at the same time identifying a long-term replacement for that revenue for local governments. They said this could be an area for bipartisan agreement in the future.

Tax differences also included the Governor's proposal for a "gas tax holiday." In March Youngkin proposed to

temporarily eliminate the state's Motor Vehicle Fuels Tax for the months of May, June, and July.

Both Ebbin and Bennett-Parker pointed out that the gas tax funds critical transportation infrastructure, and they expressed concern about the impact of the proposal on road maintenance and transit.

Turning to particular pieces of legislation, Ebbin mentioned a bill to outlaw ghost guns, which passed the Senate but died in the House.

Ebbin also stated his support for legislation that would make loud mufflers a primary offense. When asked about how this fit with a larger effort to eliminate primary offenses that could potentially disproportionately affect minorities because of the discretion provided local law enforcement officers, Ebbin said this was the only one that directly impacted other people.

In response to a question from a resident about solitary confinement, Ebbin said he had visited the state's solitary confinement facility and supported ending solitary confinement.

Addressing legislative redistricting, both Ebbin and Bennett-Parker said that their new districts would not include Fairlington. The state supreme court imposed new district boundaries late last year when a bipartisan redistricting commission failed to agree upon a plan.

Reflecting some of the partisan tensions, Ebbin said that 10 of his bills had passed, but the governor had vetoed nine of them, even though six of those were identical to House-passed bills that the governor signed. Traditionally, the governor signs both bills when they are identical.

Ebbin chairs the Senate Privileges and Elections Committee, which considers most of the governor's cabinet appointments. The committee rejected the governor's nomination of Andrew Wheeler to be Secretary of Natural and Historic Resources. Wheeler had been the head of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency under President Trump.

Both legislators appeared troubled by what they perceived as more partisan moves by Gov. Youngkin in April, which they said marked a departure from general practice in past administrations.

"I hope he'll realize he's governor of all the people," Bennett-Parker said.



Fairlington FINS registration begins May 1

Build your child's confidence and comfort in the water while reviewing some basic water safety and stroke skills with FINS (Fairlingtonians Interested in Neighborhood Swimming). The FINS program is a regular summer fixture in Fairlington and is a fun way for kids to strengthen swim skills. It also encourages camaraderie and good sportsmanship.

FINS runs for three weeks from July 11 to 29, and consists of four 30-minute lessons Monday through Thursday and one

fun group swim meet each Friday. The program rotates weekly between three different condominium association pools in South Fairlington. Lessons are meant to supplement, not replace, swimming instruction programs. Instructors encourage young kids to enjoy swimming, take turns in lap lanes, and play water games safely.

Important pool safety and capability concepts, like treading water, front and back floating, lap lane protocols, straight-leg kicking, and swimming with faces submerged are taught; proper stroke techniques are introduced to stronger and older swimmers. The cost for the three-week summer session and t-shirt is \$75 per child.

The program is open to only to Fairlington resident

children five to ten years of age (rising kindergarten through rising fifth grade). To request a registration form for the July 2022 program or to ask additional questions, email fairlingtonfins. swim@gmail.com. Registration for returning participants and age-related siblings will be May 1 to 15. Registration for new participants will be May 16 to 30. If the number of registrations exceeds open slots, participants will be selected by a random lottery in June.

For the program to be successful, we are also looking for 2–3 parents or other adults to assist with the daily coordination of the swimmers. The requirement is 2 hours a day, 4–6 p.m., Monday–Thursday and 1.5 hours on Fridays, 6-7:30 p.m. for these 3 weeks in July.

We are also looking for high school or college students with strong swimming skills and ability to work with children who are interested in being instructors for these 3 weeks in July, pay is \$15–20 per hour.

Looking forward to a fun summer swimming in the Fairlington pools!

Past issues of *the Bulletin* have examined private real estate development in the general Fairlington area. This month's issue looks at a planned public construction project near Fairlington.

City of Alexandria officials held a late March ground-breaking for the construction of a second campus for Alexandria City High School on the current site of the Minnie Howard School behind Bradlee Center. The Alexandria City Council approved the necessary permitting for the project in January.

The current school building will remain in operation while the new school is built to the east. The new school building will be where the athletic facilities currently exist. Once the new building is complete, the old Minnie Howard building will be removed and replaced with new athletic facilities, recreational amenities, bus loop, and parking.

The current Alexandria City High School Building will be known as the King Street Campus, while the new building will be called the Minnie Howard campus. The two campuses are intended to function as one high school with students in all four grades attending each campus.

Currently the Minnie Howard school serves only 9th grade students, while students in grades 10 through 12 attend the King Street campus. When construction is complete, Minnie Howard will serve students in all four grades and will have significantly increased classroom capacity.

Designed to accommodate 1600 students in grades 9 through 12, the new facility will be a five-story structure that responds to the pressing need for additional high school classroom space as Alexandria continues to experience a substantial growth in student enrollment.

Alexandria City High School offers 400 courses and has space for approximately 3800 students between its two major campuses. By 2025, Alexandria City Public Schools

(ACPS) anticipates there will be 5,000 high school students.

In addition to classrooms and athletic facilities, the site will contain office space for Alexandria's Department of Community and Human Services, a Teen Wellness Center, and an early childhood learning center.

Several attributes are envisioned for community use, including an indoor, regulation-sized swimming pool and training pool, as well as a multi-purpose field, tennis/pickle ball courts,

basketball courts, and outdoor space for school and community use. A path will encompass the athletic areas, providing an on-site loop for walking and running.

A new and enhanced streetscape along Braddock Rd. will include wider sidewalks, landscaping, and double rows of trees. The plan calls for planting 45 new trees along the street frontage. The city's landscape guidelines prioritize the use of native plants.

The building is designed to meet LEED Gold and Net Zero standards for energy conservation.

The City and ACPS evaluated the property for affordable housing but concluded that the property was too small to accommodate additional development beyond the existing and potential future needs directly associated with the school's academic and recreational requirements.

In order to retain use of the existing school for as long as needed and not have to relocate students, the existing open space and recreational areas will be graded for construction of the new school, starting this spring.

Staff note that construction management is a concern for the community. "It is a priority for both ACPS and the City to minimize impacts on the neighborhood and maintain a functioning school throughout the duration

Wanted: Native shrubs to bring back pollinators

May is when all life returns at once in a sensual overload. Flowers in all assortments, shapes, aromas, and hues. A circle completes and begins again. Or does it? What is the reason for a flower? A flower's purpose it to create a seed, but to do that, pollinators are needed.

So where are all the pollinators? Maybe stories about missing bees have caught your eye. We have fewer because the native plants they look for are no longer here. They have been replaced with plants from around the globe. After Rachael

Carson's novel, Silent Spring, about the effect of pesticides on plants and wildlife, there was a push to use shrubs that were not subject to insect infestation. The result was that landscapers and homeowners began to buy multitudes of non-native and often invasive plants.

How do we change this? When shrubs need replacing at the Mews, we have tried to use native plants when possible (though sometimes a boxwood is the only thing that will do).

What are some of these native shrubs?

Southern Wax Myrtle—One side of the Mews property aligns with King St. During fence replacement a few years ago, a decision was made to get rid of the Redtipped Photinia that had become an eyesore. Worse yet, a new land survey moved our boundary inward. Some Eastern Red Cedars that were once on Fairlington land were now in Alexandria. Southern Wax Myrtles were planted on the inside of our new fence line as a Photinia replacement and have gone gangbusters. The first ones planted are now about 8 feet tall and green year-round, and they block light and noise from King Street as well as absorb water run-off.

Witch Hazel—If you desire a winter blooming shrub, this one is the perfect replacement for Mahonia. A native plant that produces flowers after the leaves are gone.

Steeplebush—One of these has just been planted in the Mews as a substitute for Butterfly bush. Yes, Butterfly bush attracts insects who take the nectar, but will never lay their eggs, so that butterfly won't be able to propagate. Steeplebush produces pink flowers from July to September and actually hosts several

native butterfly species.

Virginia Sweetspire—Everyone has favorites and this is one is a real winner. It's a great replacement for burning bush. Beautiful white spires of flowers appear in June and then red, orange, and purple foliage appear into the fall and early winter. I have seen places in Arlington where several are planted together and the effect is wonderful.

Common Ninebark - It is the perfect replacement for Nandina. White flowers produce a cascade in the spring, followed by bird edible seeds, and lovely fall color.


There is one in the Mews, but hopefully there will be more soon.

of the project," declared the staff memo to the city council that accompanied the permitting recommendation.

Construction is budgeted at \$177.4 million.

Occupancy of the new school is planned for summer 2024. Full completion of the entire project is expected by spring 2025.

ACPS briefed FCA twice as the project was being developed.



DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



An argument in favor of white

Colors seem to get all of the attention in a garden. Everyone I visit with has a favorite color. And some folks despise certain colors.

Ignored but noble in the garden is white, being achromatic or without hue. White objects scatter or reflect visible wavelengths of sunlight instead of absorbing the spectrum's colors.

Enough science. Let's look at some beautiful specimens that flower in white.

Pieris: Its flowers dangle in clumps in early March from fragile reddish stems. It's the first-flowering shrub you will notice at the nursery. Fragrant and shaped like the flower of Lily of the Valley, the pieris flower hangs in clusters like jewels on a necklace. The pieris shrub has lanceshaped foliage that radiates out from the main branch. Leaf color ranges from lime to hunter green. The evergreen habit is irregular, featuring branches that lean in different directions.

Gardenia: A true white flower with a pale, yellow eye, it's maybe the most fragrant flower. It has layers of petals in a rounded form—much like a rose. My mother, who lived in Fairlington for nearly 30 years, cared for one in her garden. She wrapped it in burlap come winter so ice and snow didn't damage the plant.

Candytuft: Speaking of true white, this summer-flowering perennial has such vivid, white blooms, one

will notice it from yards away. Candytuft has so many blooms, the basal foliage is almost hidden. Resembling a carnation, these domed-shaped, fragrant flowers show in late spring and summer.

Climbing Hydrangea: This woody vine—it has exfoliating bark on the branches—offers white flowers in summer. It has an espaliering habit so it looks best on a trellis. The flowers are flat and wide that encircle a yellowish eye. The leaves are beneath the blooms and resemble a viburnum leaf with an undulating margin and recessed veins.

Southern Magnolia: Think dwarf for your Fairlington patio. "Little Gem" is the most popular and available one at local nurseries. Like the parent plant, it has large, cup-shaped, white flowers in summer. A yellow eye fills the center

of this fragrant bloom. The leaves are leather-like, thick, long and oval (like a football). The fruit of a Southern Magnolia is an aggregate filled with red seeds (like the fruit of a dogwood tree) that attracts birds at meal time.

Fall-blooming Clematis: Just like candytuft's bloom fill the plant's habit, this vine is floriferous. How much? It resembles a white blanket covering the fence façade in autumn. We know what the summer-blooming clematis looks like with its 4-inch-wide purple, pink or white flowers. But the fall-blooming clematis has fragrant blooms in the shape of an airplane propeller or dragonfly. Four, long petals (like your pinky finger) radiate from the flower's center.




