PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

For the first time since before COVID, the popular Fairlington Home & Garden Tour returns on Saturday, May 11. Sponsored by the Fairlington Historical Society (FHS), the tour offers the chance to see

creative ways some of your neighbors have updated the interiors of their

It's also one of those rare activities that gets residents from North and South Fairlington out exploring each others' courtyards. One of my delights during prior tours was watching the literally hundreds of tourgoers wander around the community, trying to figure out where the units on the "other" side of Fairlington were located.

This year's tour coincides with the 25th anniversary of Fairlington being listed on the National Register of Historic Places, maintained by the U.S. Department of the Interior. That designation was achieved in March 1999. Fairlington had already been listed on the Virginia Landmarks Register, the state equivalent of the federal designation, in December 1998. Historic designation has continued to be one of the values real estate agents highlight when they advertise Fairlington units.

The effort to secure historic designation laid the foundation for the creation of the Fairlington Historical Society, as interested residents, with support from FCA and several of the condo associations, tackled the arduous task of documenting Fairlington's history. This included photographing all the buildings to demonstrate the preservation of the architectural features that marked Fairlington's construction in the early 1940s.

FHS has continued to play an important role in the life of Fairlington. It published Fairlington at 50—and the updated 60th anniversary edition—the go-to source for information on the history of Fairlington. For the holidays, FHS markets the Fairlington ornament, produced jointly with FCA. FHS also conducts oral history interviews, collects artifacts from our past, and fosters conversations about our rich heritage.

The tour displays how homeowners are keeping their units contemporary while the buildings remain consistent with the original Williamsburg style. That underscores why FCA is urging the Arlington County Board to address a zoning issue that is adding time and expense for some Fairlington owners who want to modernize the interiors of their units.

FHS is a valuable Fairlington organization. I encourage you to consider joining. https://www.fairlingtonhistoricalsociety.org/. In the meantime, I hope to encounter you on the tour on May 11.

FCA sends King Street project concerns to Alexandria City

The Fairlington Citizens Association shared resident feedback with the City of Alexandria regarding the King Street-Bradlee Safety and Mobility Enhancements Project. The project, which plans to improve King Street between N. Quaker Lane and Menokin Drive, recently completed its second phase of com-

munity feedback. This phase sought input on three alternative designs for King Street and the access road.

FCA submitted a letter to the City highlighting ideas and concerns raised by Fairlington residents about the King Street corridor. The letter detailed issues around King Street including: long waits for pedestrians, narrow sidewalks, inadequate bicycle facilities, limited amenities at bus stops, poor aesthetics and unattractive swales in the medians, and poor drainage conditions on the north side of King Street where stormwater runoff enters the Fairlington Mews, Arbor, and Glen properties.

The letter also noted challenges for buses turning into and out of the access road. FCA encouraged the City to address signal timing and missing crosswalks at intersections with this project.

provided feedback on the proposed alternative designs. This feedback included concerns about access to the Safeway and surrounding businesses, as those entrances and exits were not illustrated in the concept designs.

Additionally, FCA

The letter also explained that the one-way access road alternatives would make it more difficult to access Bradlee from North Fairlington, and likely would increase traffic through South Fairlington as a result. FCA encouraged the City to explore a complete remake of King Street which would remove the access road entirely.

The letter reiterated feedback that FCA has shared with the City in the past about the need for stormwater management and landscaping improvements along King Street. It emphasized the importance of ensuring that stormwater management plans will minimize run-off impacting the adjacent Fairlington properties. Early voting begins in May for June's dual primary

In-person early voting for Virginia's June 18 dual primary kicks off on May 3, for both local and statewide elections.

Earlier this year, Arlington County Board Chair Libby Garvey announced her retirement at the end of this term. Candidates in the Democratic primary for her open seat are: James A. DeVita, Julie E. Farnam, Tenley D. Peterson, Natalie U. Roy, and Julius D. "JD" Spain, Sr.

Candidates in the Republican primary for U.S. Senate are: Hung Cao, Jonathan W. Emord, Edward C. "Eddie" Garcia, Jr., Scott Thomas Parkinson, and C.L. "Chuck" Smith, Jr. The winner of the June 18 primary will face Democratic Sen. Tim Kaine, who is the only candidate on the ballot in his party's primary and therefore automatically moves to the general election.

Voters can request mail-in ballots, which must be post-marked on-or-before June 18 and received by 12 p.m. on June 21.

Voters in the City of Alexandria, which encompasses part of Fairlington, will also cast their ballots on June 18, choosing from a field of 11 council candidates and three mayoral candidates.



Invasive big-headed ants and English ivy

The Washington Post recently published an article titled "In Kenya, the king of the jungle faces a new challenge - ants." Turns out that big-headed ants (BHA), which are not native to Kenya, are responsible for an "ecological chain reaction." In the early 2000s, the BHA landed in Kenya hiding in goods from a foreign port or carried by an unwitting tourist.

So how can an ant (a little bigger than the width of a nickel) upset the food chain for a lion? To explain, let's start from the top of the food chain and work backwards. Lions use whistling thorn acacia trees as cover when hunting zebras. The lion

hides behind the acacia trees waiting for the zebra to get close before giving chase.

The acacia trees provide food for elephants and giraffes. As a defense against these animals with large appetites, the acacia tree has a symbiotic relationship with the acacia ant. The tree provides the ant with both shelter and nectar for food in exchange for protection. The acacia ant will swarm into the nostrils of the herbivore feeding on the tree and bite the animal as it feeds. The animal will move to a less painful food source thereby leaving the acacia tree to thrive and provide cover for the lions.

This is where the BHA upsets the food chain. BHAs kill the native acacia ants thereby leaving the acacia trees vulnerable to herbivores such as elephants who will knock the trees down, destroying the lions' cover. Without the acacia trees for cover, the lions have had to find a new food source not dependent on concealment. Lions have turned to African buffalo, which fight back,

so cover is less important. Five to 10 lions are needed to kill a buffalo instead of the one to two required to kill a zebra.

Imagine that this small invasive organism, an ant, has upset the food chain for lions in the same way an invasive plant can upset the food chain for insects and birds in our neighborhood parks and woods. For example, the ubiquitous English ivy is one such organism. It is spread by vines and by birds, who eat the berries and deposit them in another location.

When English ivy covers the forest floor, it chokes out the

native plants (a food source for insects and birds), eliminating biodiversity; and when it climbs a tree, it harms the tree and eventually kills it. Trees provide so many benefits such as wildlife habitat, wildlife food, absorbing stormwater, to cooling the environment. English ivy provides resting spots for mosquitos on hot days or hides puddles, where they breed. Do we want more mosquitos?

Volunteers around the DMV, of which I am one, spend endless hours pulling English ivy from our parks and community gardens. If you have English ivy in your patio, please remove it. If you have English ivy on your community grounds, you can ask your Board to remove it or offer to do it yourself. Fairlington FINS program seeks new swimmers

Build your child's confidence and comfort in the water while reviewing some basic water safety and stroke skills with FINS (Fairlingtonians Interested in Neighborhood Swimming). The FINS program is a regular summer fixture in Fairlington and is a fun way for kids to strengthen swim skills. It also encourages camaraderie and good sportsmanship.

FINS runs for three weeks from July 8 to July 26, and consists of four 30-minute lessons Monday through Thursday and one fun group swim meet each Friday. The program rotates weekly between three dif-

ferent condominium association pools in South Fairlington. Lessons are meant to supplement, not replace, swimming instruction programs. Instructors encourage young kids to enjoy swimming, take turns in lap lanes, and play water games safely.

Important pool safety and capability concepts, like treading water, front and back floating, lap lane protocols, straight-leg kicking, and swimming with faces submerged

Democrats to select school board candidates

Four candidates are seeking the endorsement of Arlington County Democrats in the race to fill two slots on the Arlington School Board. Voting will take place across three days in May. Under Virginia law, school board elections are non-partisan, but candidates often seek the formal endorsement of political parties.

Kathleen Clark, Larry Fishtahler, Chen Ling, and Zuraya Tapia-Hadley are seeking positions that are being vacated by current School Board Chair Cristina Diaz-Torres and Vice Chair David Priddy, who announced earlier this year that they would not be seeking re-election.

Voters may request an electronic ballot through Thursday, May 9. Electronic ballots will be sent out starting at 10 a.m. on April 20 and can be completed any time until 6 p.m. on Saturday, May 11.

In-person voting for the Democratic endorsement will occur at three caucuses: Sunday, May 5, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., at Washington-Liberty High School, 1301 N. Stafford St.; Wednesday, May 8, 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., at Hoffman-Boston Elementary School, 1415 S. Queen St.;

Saturday, May 11, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., at Dr. Charles R. Drew Elementary School, 3500 S. 23rd St.

Clark is the vice-chair of the 2024-30 Arlington Public Schools Strategic Plan steering committee and served six years on the Special Education PTA. Fishtahler, a previous candidate for the school board, once led the Advisory Council on Instruction and the County Council of PTAs.

Ling is the parent of a third grader at Ashlawn Elementary School and the director of engineering at a Fortune 500 company. Tapia-Hadley is the senior director of public affairs for Spanish-language media company TelevisaUnivision and a Virginia Public Access Project board member.

The party will use ranked-choice voting to determine the candidates who win the Democratic endorsement. Those candidates will be joined on the general election ballot in November by Fairlington resident James Vell Rives, who has run previously for the school board.
