Paul Ferguson briefs FCA on court clerk's responsibilities

At the FCA October meeting, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Arlington County, Paul Ferguson, drew on fond memories living in both North and South Fairlington, of buying his first unit on the bottom of S. Buchanan St., meeting his future wife (also a resident at the time), and raising a family. While no longer a resident, he still owns a property in the neighborhood and "hopes to return to Fairlington" at some point.

Ferguson, who has served as County Clerk since 2008, provided a broad overview of the services and duties his office provides for Arlington

County and City of Falls Church residents. The Clerk of the Circuit Court is an elected constitutional office in each county and large city in Virginia and performs more varied functions than any other office in the Commonwealth. This includes the issuance of marriage certificates and the filing of wills and probate services, divorce records, and all property titles dating back to Arlington's establishment as a County.

Ferguson, an advocate for smarter gun control, commented that his views had modified regarding concealed weapons since taking office. He noted that those who take the time to apply for concealed handgun permits tended to be more responsible with firearms.

The County Clerk's office also oversees jury duty. Every year, Arlington County and Falls Church residents are randomly selected to serve on a jury pool. If residents do ultimately serve on a jury, they will not be placed in subsequent jury pools for three years.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Fairlington has escaped the housing policy debate that is roiling the normally calm political waters of Arlington—the heated discussion of "missing middle" housing. It's one of the most passionate and

acrimonious debates the county has seen in years.

The debate has splintered usual alliances. It triggers questions about managing growth, about preserving the character of neighborhoods, about increasing the stock of housing, and about enabling Arlington's low-wage workers to live in the county. It pits some commonly accepted values against each other.

"Missing middle" generally refers to the range of housing types that come between single-family detached homes and mid-to-high-rise apartment buildings. Examples include duplexes, triplexes, and townhomes. In this context housing types do not correlate with a specific income bracket.

The proposals under debate usually envision the addition of housing, such as duplexes, in neighborhoods that are characterized by single-family homes. Advocates see this "up-zoning" as an effective way of increasing the stock of housing and accommodating Arlington's growth. Opponents see in it the destruction of traditional neighborhoods for minimal benefit.

Fairlington itself is an example of missing middle housing. That's the reason we've avoided being drawn into the larger county debate. We already offer the townhouse and low-rise environment that housing advocates would like to see more of.

Fairlington is located in the sweet spot of housing in Arlington. It provides sought-after missing middle housing, and it's also near apartments that are committed as affordable housing to serve lower-income families.

At its October meeting the Arlington County Board approved the final piece of the financing package to facilitate the acquisition and renovation of the Park Shirlington apartments on 31st St.

As part of this agreement, the owner has committed to maintain the property (294 apartments) as affordable housing for 75 years. That means that the units must be affordable to households earning up to 60 percent of the area median income.

In late September Wesley Housing cut the ribbon on a new affordable housing development, Waypoint at Fairlington, next to Fairlington Presbyterian Church. That adds another 81 units to the neighborhood inventory of housing that can be affordable for low-wage workers.

FCA supported both of these developments, as we think having a good mix of housing choices nearby enriches our community.

General election slated for November 8

After seven weeks of early absentee voting, Tuesday, November 8 brings the general election day for in-person voting.

South Fairlington residents vote at the Fairlington Community Center, 3008 S. Stafford St. North Fairlington residents who live in Arlington vote at Abingdon Elementary School, while those who live in Alexandria vote at the NOVA Arts Center, 4915 East Campus Dr. Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Residents may still vote absentee, either by mail or in-person. Mail ballots must be received

by 7 p.m. on November 8. The deadline for requesting a ballot by mail was October 28. The deadline to vote inperson absentee is 5 p.m. on Saturday, November 5.

Arlington and Alexandria residents will both cast ballots for the 8th district congressional office.

Voters will choose among Democratic incumbent Don Beyer, Republican Karina Lipsman, and Independent Teddy Fikre. Arlington residents will also be selecting a member of the county board, electing a new school board member, and casting votes on six bond issues.

In the county board race, incumbent Democrat Matt di Ferranti faces a challenge from Independents Audrey Clement and Adam Theo.

The contest for school board features Bethany Sutton and James "Vell" Rives. Incumbent Barbara Kanninen chose not to seek re-election.

The largest of the bond issues is \$177 million for significant improvements to the county's wastewater treatment, water, and sewer infrastructure, including major renovation at the county's water pollution control plant. Arlington public schools would receive \$165 million under another bond issue, largely to fund the Career

Center campus and security improvements at various schools.

Other bond issues include \$52.63 million for Metro and transportation improvements, \$22.46 million for parks and recreation improvements, \$53.3 million for general county and neighborhood infrastructure projects, and \$39.76 million for various capital projects for the county's stormwater program.

Work to begin on Abingdon St. sidewalk

Construction was set to begin in late October on improvements to S. Abingdon St. between S. 31 st Rd. and S. 31 st St. The project will install a sidewalk, curb, and gutter along the north side of Abingdon St., diago-

nally across the street from the old Fire Station 7 and STEM Preschool.

As a result of the sidewalk addition, the two existing parking spaces on that side of Abingdon St. will be eliminated. There will be additional temporary parking restrictions during the construction period.

County staff briefed representatives of Fairlington Villages and Fairlington Court, the two adjacent landowners, in early October.

To prepare the site for the sidewalk, crews from the county's Water, Sewer, and Streets Department completed utility relocation work last fall.

The county board approved the project in 2021. FCA endorsed the sidewalk addition as part of the county's Neighborhood Conservation program, which is funded out of county bond issues.

County staff expect construction to be complete in January 2023.

County board seeks comments on ranked choice voting



The Arlington County Board invites the public to provide comments on a proposed Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) method pilot for the 2023 county board June primary election. An online public comment form is available through November 4 on the County's website.

Based on the feedback, the board is considering holding a hearing at its November 2022 meeting for a resolution to make RCV the method of election for the Arlington County Board primary election candidates.

Ranked Choice Voting is an election method that allows voters the option to rank candidates in order of preference (first, second and third choice), though they are not required to do so.

RCV differs from plurality voting, Arlington's current method, in which voters may only select one candidate. If a candidate receives more than half of the first choices, that candidate wins, just like in any other election.

However, if there is no majority winner after counting the first choices, the race is decided by an instant runoff. The candidate with the fewest votes is eliminated, and voters who ranked that candidate as their first choice will have their votes count for their next choice. This process continues until a candidate emerges with more than half of the vote and is declared the winner.



Leave it to the oak trees

During a brisk December walk through any Fairlington community, one may encounter a tree still holding on to its leaves. They are brown and dead looking, so why would they still be on the tree? Could this be a new species? One not yet named? Wishful thinking. More than likely, the tree in question is probably a white oak.

In the Mews, there are pin, red, scarlet, swamp, and willow oaks. Some are in the red oak group, while the others are in the white oak group. Generally speaking, trees in the red oak group have pointier leaves, while those in the white oak group are rounded. Usually it is the white oaks that hold their leaves throughout the winter.

This question has bothered scientists for years. This characteristic is called marcescence, that is, when withered and dry leaves

are attached to the stem well into winter. After years of observation and thought there are several theories. One is that it keeps browsers (deer, elk, others) from chewing off the new buds. Instead they are treated to a mouthful of dead dry yucky leaves.

Another theory is that the dead leaves retain snow that later melts directly below the tree furnishing extra water. Lastly, the leaves, which are tough, break down further when they stay on the tree all winter. When finally shed, they provide nutrition for the tree.

We are lucky to have as many oaks as we do in Fairlington. Not only are oaks long lived, but they also provide habitats and food for countless insects, birds, and mammals. They tend to live a long time, sometimes 900

years, and can sequester a load of carbon.

Of course, the biggest show is in the autumn when the acorns drop like rain. Some years are more abundant than others, producing large quantities of acorns known as mast harvests, or just masting. Not only does one tree produce acorns, but in some cases all the oaks of either white or red do.

Making seeds takes a great deal of energy, so it's not done every year. In 2019, however, red oaks up and down the east coast produced a mast crop of acorns. How? Through communication. Oaks and other plants are able to synchronize their efforts through a system of fungi that surround their roots.

But wait, you ask, don't red oaks take 18 months for their acorns to mature? That's correct. White

oak acorns mature in a season. That means that the red oaks began synchronizing when to flower and to release pollen with each other in the spring of 2018.

This is one way that oaks secure the future of oaks. There are many acorn eaters from squirrels, to birds (blue jays), and deer. Producing so many acorns at one time means that some will become trees.

Is your community pondering new trees for the spring? Plant an oak.



Waypoint at Fairlington opens

Alexandria Mayor Justin Wilson and Fairlington Presbyterian Pastor Juli Wilson-Black joined officials from Wesley Housing September 28 at a ribbon-cutting to celebrate the grand opening of The Waypoint at Fairlington. Located on Menokin Dr. next to Fairlington Presbyterian, the project adds more than 80 units of affordable housing to Alexandria's inventory.

Prior to redevelopment, the land on which the new

apartment community is sited was an underutilized parking lot owned by the church. Following a collaborative visioning process with the church and the Alexandria community, including Fairlington, Wesley Housing and other key partners transformed the land into a housing resource that will serve generations to come.

FCA supported the general concept of the housing development during the permitting process by the City of Alexandria. Representatives of Wesley Housing and Fairlington Presbyterian made a presentation to FCA several years ago.

"Our congregation is thrilled to be realizing our dream of turning spaces for cars into spaces for people," said

Pastor Wilson-Black. "We are grateful to have had the support of many neighbors and community members who realize the value of affordable housing for Alexandria."

According to Wesley Housing, residents of will enjoy community amenities such as free Wifi, a community room, business center, access to a playground/park space, and a shared courtyard plaza with the Fairlington Presbyterian Church.

Apartments feature open floor plans, with 11 percent of the units being fully accessible based on requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The community is built to Energy Star® green building standards and is achieving a National Green Building Standard (NGBS) Silver Certification.

With a total development cost of \$37.2 million, The Waypoint benefited from significant financial support from the City, Virginia Housing, Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development, as well as from Capital One, Freddie Mac, and Hudson Housing.

In addition, upstanding residents may be considered to serve on the Circuit Courts Grand Jury pool of jurors. Those serving in that pool meet approximately once a month to assess the merits of a case and whether it should be brought to trial.

Ferguson encouraged residents who would be interested in serving to contact him.

Ferguson also fielded questions from Fairlington residents and FCA board members. He assured residents that their personal information on all county records was secure, noting that wills themselves are physically kept locked up. On inquiries about property titles, Ferguson noted that all social security numbers had been removed from documents.

The discussion then opened up to larger questions facing the county. He felt that the Missing Middle proposal is more contentious than the Columbia Pike streetcar proposal from the early 2000s. He noted that eliminating all zoning on Single Family Homes (SFH) could have an adverse impact throughout the county.

A Fairlington resident asked whether Arlington should be incorporated, i.e., become a city. While acknowledging that the county is likely one of the most densely populated in the country, Ferguson responded that there were benefits to being designated a county, from fewer tax implications to having more leverage at the state level.

A board member asked about his thoughts on ranked choice voting. Ferguson answered that he has "come around" to supporting this voting structure, even though he admitted that he might not have been able to garner a full 50 percent of the vote at the onset. However, he did say that the system would allow for residents to better express their voting preferences and foster a greater diversity of candidates.

The evening concluded with the County Clerk encouraging residents to contact his office with any concerns or questions they may have. He can be reached at Pferguson@arlingtonva.us



DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



Flowers that linger through the cold months

A lingering guest we'll gladly tolerate is a flowering plant that shows in late fall and into winter. As I walked around in mid-October, I noticed the usual evergreens as well as a few flowering specimens. Plants that historically bloomed in summer now show in October into December. So, think about having the following specimens in your patio next year to ensure 12-month interest in the form of color. As I've mentioned before, you can enjoy a cup of coffee or an adult beverage in your patio during winter while admiring the garden:

Rosa "Knockout" (Knockout

Rose): Atypical from the rose bushes our grandmothers had, this densely foliated cultivar blooms most of the year. It is happy in full sun and tolerates humidity. It rewards us with dynamic red and pink blooms even in winter.

Buddleia (Butterfly Bush): This plant needs full sun and room to spread. It will grow six feet tall but has a spread up to eight feet. At the ends of the branches holding sage-colored leaves are elongated blooms in lavender, purple, or white. Buddleia situates well in a perennial or wildflower garden since it looks wild.

Liriope (Lilyturf): This ideal accent plant likes to be on the edge. It looks just right on a garden perimeter or along driveways or walkways. It's 12 inches tall with a similar width. The foliage (green or variegated in white) shows all year and

forms like a small fountain. From late July into November, purple or white flowers form on vertical stems out of the center of the plant. After the flowers fade, you'll notice beadlike black, shiny fruit on the stem ends.

Canna Lily: This sun-lover reaches six feet tall. Like any lily, it has no width to its shape. The leaves look tropical—almost two feet long and wide like a boat paddle. At the very top of the plant are blooms exploding in orange, red, white, and yellow. It helps mask a facade like your wooden patio fence.

Camellia: The fall-bloomer, sasanqua shows its flowers in fall while the winter-bloomer, japonica shows in winter (December into early April). Yes, April. You can have both

species in your garden to ensure color from September into spring. The flowers are a flat rosette in red, pink, or white. Each eye (or center) is yellow. Camellia is an evergreen with its shiny dark green foliage. It is a vertical grower (six to eight feet tall) with little width. Camellia needs two things: shade and no morning sunlight.

Abelia: This evergreen shrub is dense with a tiny, pointed leaf. Foliage forms on thin, salmon-colored stems. Around its perimeter are white or pink, bugle-shaped flowers offering a faint fragrance. As the plant grows, some branches reach far above its globose perimeter. Abelia gets robust in size so plant one in the back corners of your garden or in the bed at the dining room window. You'll notice a few together on an island where S. Stafford St. meets S. 32nd St. overlooking the Utah St. softball field diamond.

Azalea "Encore": Two decades ago, botanists allayed gardeners' complaints that "My azalea blooms for just two weeks. The rest of the year, it's just green." The encore blooms in late-April and intermittently shows its red, pink, or white flowers the rest of the year (into mid-December). The blooms of the encore hide among its lime-like green foliage but still are noticeable and fat (up to three inches). It needs sun and doesn't perform well in deep shade.


