Remembering the Forgotten

What was here on this land before the Fairlington we all know and love? As you may know, our community of Fairlington was once an eighteenth-century plantation, Torthorwald, which stood here until 1942. Torthorwald, the summer residence of John Carlyle, was where his enslaved people bred horses, farmed, and operated a grist mill. At the time of Carlyle's death in 1780, he enslaved 43 individuals. Through research we know the names of at least two people, Milley and Harry, who were once enslaved here.

The Arlington Historical Society (AHS), along with the Black Heritage Museum of Arlington, are sponsoring the Memorializing the Enslaved in Arlington (MEA) project. With the help of high school students at Arlington Tech, Stumbling Stones memorializing the enslaved have been created and placed in various neighborhoods around Arlington where enslavement occurred.

The Fairlington Citizens Association voted to purchase a stumbling stone to support this project. AHS will coordinate with FCA to to memorialize Milley and Harry with a commemoration event and unveiling of the stumbling stones in

For the Love of Nature

Leave the Flower Seed Heads Over Winter

Winters can be long and gray, but your patio garden can diminish that dreariness and be transformed into a place of natural beauty. Remember that winter interest does not have to be all about evergreens. Look at spent flowers and grasses and see them for their sculptural forms. The dried seed heads not only bring beauty to the garden, but they also provide food and cover for birds and wildlife. When left standing, dried flower stalks and stems can be as striking as the bare trees in winter.

What is more interesting to look at on a dreary day than songbirds enjoying the seeds in your garden? Small birds like chickadees and goldfinches often perch right on the seed heads, while larger birds forage for seeds on the ground. Native perennials provide a cornucopia of seeds for our wintering songbirds plus architectural beauty.

Wait until spring to clean up your garden and enjoy watching the songbirds forage on the seed heads this winter. For more information on which native plant species attract birds visit the <u>Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia</u>.
