Former Fairlington resident Paul Ferguson, Clerk of the Circuit Court of Arlington County and the City of Falls Church, will be FCA's featured speaker at its monthly meeting on October 12. The meeting, which begins at 7 p.m., will be in-person at the Fairlington Community Center, 3308 S. Stafford St.

Ferguson was first elected Clerk of Court in 2007 after serving 12 years on the Arlington County Board, including three years as Board Chair. He was re-elected clerk without opposition in 2017. Virginia court clerks are constitutional officers and serve 8-year terms.

Since becoming clerk, Ferguson has modernized the clerk's office, moving from paper to electronic case files for civil and criminal court records, implementing electronic filing, and reducing the length of jury service from two weeks to one day/one trial.

Ferguson created an information packet in English and Spanish with sample forms for parties without an attorney seeking an uncontested divorce.

In Virginia the circuit court is the general jurisdiction trial court with authority to try all types of civil and criminal cases. Ferguson is the clerk of the 17th Judicial District, which has four judges.

In addition to managing the court, the clerk has a broad range of responsibilities. These include collecting the taxes and fees associated with filing



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Fairlington has a rich history of providing leaders for Arlington County government, either as elected officials or as members of citizen advisory com-

mittees. That, along with consistently high voting turnout in elections, has given Fairlington a reputation for being one of the most politically engaged communities in Arlington.

Our clout is disproportionate to our size. That civic engagement—regardless of party—is one of the things that makes Fairlington such a vibrant community. The spirit of community that pervades Fairlington provides a good context for growing and sustaining civic leaders.

FCA's October speaker, Clerk of Court Paul Ferguson, is a good example. Paul lived in Fairlington for decades and continues to own a unit here. In many respects, he's still part of our community. Before being elected court clerk, Paul served three terms on the Arlington County Board. But he got his start as a community leader, President of FCA.

Paul was followed on the county board in a few years by South Fairlington resident Libby Garvey, who was first elected in 2012 and has twice served as chair. Libby has also lived in Fairlington for decades.

In Arlington much of the work of governance flows through citizen advisory committees, and over the past five years Fairlington residents have played key roles in things like the Housing Commission, the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee, the Community Development Citizens Advisory Committee, and the Four Mile Run Valley planning committee.

Fairlington also contributes major voices to school issues. FCA Vice President Jenn Davies led the citizen advisory committee that oversaw the renovation of Abingdon Elementary.

Often the leader of the Abingdon PTA is a Fairlington resident, as Sharon Burd is this year. As more Fairlington kids go to Gunston Middle School, it's not surprising that the Gunston PTA has also had Fairlington leadership.

And let's not forget that Libby Garvey started her county political career as a member of the school board. One of the school board candidates this fall, Vell Rives, has been a North Fairlington resident for years.

This climate of civic leadership—and it's not limited to formal government entities—is a hallmark of Fairlington. I encourage you to think about a good civic leadership role for you. It will add to our community's vitality.

Experts are predicting that after the last few years of rapid appreciation and low rates, the Real Estate Market is coming in for a "soft landing".

Voting begins for November 8 general election

Arlington voters will choose a member of the Arlington County Board and select a new member of the Arlington School board, while both Arlington and Alexandria voters will cast ballots for the 8th district congressional office in the November 8 general election. Early in-person voting began in late September.

In Arlington, incumbent Democrat Matt di Ferranti is facing a challenge from perennial independent candidate Audrey Clement and newcomer independent Adam Theo.

The county's debate over "missing middle" housing has been the primary topic in the race.

The race for school board features Bethany Sutton and James "Vell" Rives. Current board member Barbara Kanninen chose not to run again. School board races are non-partisan, though Sutton was endorsed by Arlington Democrats. Both Sutton and Rives have been active on school advisory committees. Rives is a long-time resident of North Fairlington.

In the 8th district congressional race, voters will choose among Democratic Incumbent Don Beyer, Republican Karina Lipsman, and Independent Teddy Fikre. The district covers Arlington, Alexandria, Falls Church, and parts of Fairfax County.

Arlington voters will also consider 6 bond issues. The largest is \$177 million for significant improvements to the county's wastewater treatment, water, and sewer infrastructure. Arlington Public Schools would receive \$165 under another bond issue, largely to fund the Career Center campus and security improvements at various schools.

October 28 is the last day to request a ballot by mail for the November 8 general election. All voters are eligible to vote by mail. Applications must be received in the Voter Registration Office by 5 p.m. Applications may be submitted online (http://vote.elections. virginia.gov) or by mail, fax, or email. For Alexandria, email VoteAbsentee@alexandriava.gov; for Arlington it's absentee@arlingtonva.us.

Mail ballots may be returned by mail, in person, or by drop box. Mail ballots must be received by 7 p.m. on November 8.

October 17 is the last day to register to vote in the November election.

Property taxes due Oct 5

The due date for the first installment of real estate taxes is Wednesday, October 5. The same date applies to both Arlington County and the City of Alexandria. Real estate bills were mailed in August.

Residents will not receive a bill if taxes are paid from an escrow account through your mortgage. If you have a mortgage and receive a bill, please contact your mortgage company as soon as possible. For customers who are responsible for paying their real estate taxes, Arlington's Customer Assessment and Payment Portal (CAPP) is a convenient way to pay securely online.

Even if you do not pay via the internet, CAPP has many other benefits, including reminder emails about upcoming due dates. To learn more about CAPP, visit capp.arlingtonva.us or call 703-228-3702.

Rives, Sutton vie for empty APS board seat

Independent James "Vell" Rives and Democrat Bethany Sutton will go head-to-head for the empty seat on the Arlington County Public School (APS) Board this November.

The board is composed of five members who serve overlapping four-year terms. Terms commence on January 1 of the year following the election. The seat opened up when former school board member Barbara Kanninen decided not to run for a third term.

The *Bulletin* caught up with both Rives and Sutton to discuss their position and priorities for APS.

Sutton, a higher education professional with more than 25 years of experience, decided to run for the school board as a result of years spent volunteering and engaging with the schools both as an administrator and as a parent.

"I have a strong track record of community leadership and engagement in our schools," she said. "My kids are in 8th grade (TJMS) and 11th grade (HB Woodlawn) and I spent 7 years on the

PTA Board at Randolph Elementary School, where I still run the food pantry begun during the pandemic."

Rives, an M.D. and mental health professional, was inspired to make the decision to run as a result of seeing the impact of COVID-19 policies on students' and teachers' mental health and the struggles with lost learning due to the pandemic.

"I think my experience as a parent, physician, and mental health professional will bring the perspective we need to address our current problems," he said. "We're still not caught up, and we must not lower our standards to get there. It will be hard. We have to get every child the help they need, and we've got to work to retain our excellent teachers. We have lost too many good teachers in the past two years."

Sutton expressed her priority for focusing on inclusion and diversity in the APS system, citing recent state-

wide policies that she felt hamper efforts to expand opportunity and serve all students equitably.

"I am deeply concerned about the impact of the governor's policies on our LGBTQ+ youth and students of color, all of whom data tells us are more likely to have mental health struggles," she said. "Our best chance of tackling these daunting challenges involves ensuring that all students feel supported and

a sense of belonging in our schools, and in employing best practices in the classroom, not attacking these children or their teachers. We need to amplify our commitment to diversity, equity & inclusion, not diminish or eliminate it."

Rives was also critical of recent policies from the Governor's mansion, including the tip-line established earlier in the year to report teacher misconduct, which he felt harmed relationships between teachers and parents.

A big priority for Rives is keeping classrooms open for in-person instruction, safely, whatever it takes.

"I also want to return to the pre-COVID practice of School Resource Officers (SROs) being assigned to schools where needed," he said.

SROs have been a subject of much discussion lately as local schools have experienced an uptick in student crime after the officers were removed from school hallways in 2021.

While varying slightly in approach and priorities, both candidates are full of passion and commitment to make APS a supportive and healthy learning environment for every child that passes through its classrooms.

Skip the rake, leave the leaves

Have you heard the phrase "Leave the Leaves," and did you ever wonder why? Aren't there too many leaves? They smother the grass, they leave a slippery layer on sidewalks, and they clog sewers. What exactly do all of those fallen leaves do for nature? It turns out quite a lot!

Fallen leaves provide pollinators with nesting and overwintering habitats. Besides planting native plants and not using chemicals, the next most valuable step to support pollinators is to provide them the winter cover they need.

The monarch migrates, but the vast majority of butterflies and moths overwinter in the landscape as an egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, or adult. In our climate, the butterflies and moths use leaf litter (fallen leaves) for winter cover.

For example, the great spangled fritillary and wooly bear caterpillars tuck themselves into a pile of

leaves for protection from cold weather and predators. Red-banded hairstreaks lay their eggs on fallen oak leaves, which become the first food of the caterpillars when they emerge.

Luna moths and swallowtail butterflies disguise their cocoons and chrysalises as dried leaves, blending in with the "real" leaves. Lose the leaves and lose the next generation of some pollinators.

Bumblebees rely on leaf litter for protection. At the end of summer, mated queen bumblebees burrow only an inch or two into the earth to hibernate for winter. An extra thick layer of leaves protects the native bees from the elements.

Many animals live in leaves: spiders, snails, worms, beetles, millipedes, mites, and more—that support the chipmunks, turtles, birds, and amphibians that rely on these insects for food.

Studies have shown that turfgrass is the largest crop grown in the U.S., and this disproportionate ratio of lawn to garden is certainly a reason leaves are raked, mowed, and blown. Too many leaves are not good for turf, but a thin layer of leaves on the lawn has no ill effects.

Leaves can be piled around trees, shrubs, and perennials. The leaves will provide nutrients and valuable organic matter to protect the roots and enrich the soil.

Using leaves as mulch for a planting bed is a free alternative to buying bark mulch. The space under a tree is a critical place to keep leaves in place since many butterfly and moth caterpillars drop down from trees into the leaf litter to pupate and overwinter.

The use of leaves for mulch may not be as tidy to you, but it is so much better for nature. There are several community gardens in Fairlington that do not have the leaves removed in fall. The leaves are the garden mulch. The garden on the hill on S. Utah St. leaves the leaves.

This year, leave the leaves in your patio gardens and forgo the bark mulch. In the spring, watch for a new generation of pollinators to emerge. Feel free to send us questions or comments at fortheloveofnature@googlegroups.com and follow Fairlington Gardening Community on Facebook!



Fairlington Presidents discuss traffic safety, noise violations in quarterly meeting

Safety concerns at King St. and Taylor St. were a main topic of discussion at the recent meeting of the presidents of the various Fairlington condo association boards. They centered on drivers coming out of Bradlee who sometimes turn left onto King into oncoming traffic or do not give the right of way to drivers crossing from Taylor St. into Bradlee Shopping Center. Alexandria is responsible for signage at this intersection and will be asked to increase or adjust signs

to improve safety for drivers and pedestrians.

There have also been individuals living in hidden areas outside the Fairlington fence line along King St. The encampment debris located in the area bordered by the Arbor was removed by Arlington County. Alexandria was also contacted by the Arbor as the grassy area bordering King St. belongs to Alexandria. The city is supposed to trim back the overgrown vegetation to make the fence line clearly visible and less attractive for "campers".

There is a Limited Power of Attorney form that would allow the Arlington County Police Department to access private property to remove trespassers. The Mews has approved and submitted this form and will put up no trespassing signs as required. Some of the other Fairlington associations are considering doing the same.

Fairlington residents have complained of exceedingly loud vehicles along King St. and Quaker Ln. Current Virginia code allows jurisdictions to ticket drivers with excessive exhaust noise vehicles. Alexandria and Arlington will focus enforcement of the excessive noise violations on areas with the most complaints.

The VA legislature passed House Bill 1842 amendment that went into effect this year.

"This new law broadens the rulemaking authority of Boards of Directors, Condominium Association Boards of Directors will have authority to establish reasonable rules that restrict smoking in the Condominium, which includes prohibiting smoking in common elements as well as within the units. Property Owners' Association Boards will have the authority to restrict smoking in common areas and attached private dwelling units (i.e. townhouses). The bills further amend the Virginia Condominium Act by allowing unit owners,

by majority of votes cast at a meeting of the unit owners' association, to repeal or amend any rule or regulation adopted by its Board."

Please contact your association's president if you have topics pertaining to Fairlington that the presidents might discuss at a future meeting.

Helicopter noise complaint system created

A pilot system for reporting helicopter noise is now available for Fairlington residents. They can submit noise concerns via webform, an iPhone and Android-compatible mobile app, or by voicemail at a noise complaint hotline at 877-209-3200.

Residents are encouraged to provide as much information as possible when submitting a complaint. Using available flight track data, the system will accurately identify likely aircraft generating

concerns and all associated data.

According to Cong. Don Beyer, who has long pushed for solutions to helicopter noise in the Fairlington area, the system was developed in collaboration with the Eastern Region Helicopter Council and the Helicopter Association International.

Beyer announced the new system in a press confer-

ence in June, where he was joined by Arlington County Board members Libby Garvey and Takis Karantonis.

"I am hopeful that this pilot program will prove to be a strong first step in carrying out recommendations developed with community input to reduce helicopter noise in Northern Virginia and across our region" Beyer said, "and I will continue to work with colleagues and regional leaders and agencies to reduce helicopter noise in our skies."

The pilot will be evaluated by the FAA for potential permanent adoption.

deeds and acting as a probate judge when a will is presented for probate of an estate. The clerk is also responsible for issuing marriage licenses, processing notary public commissions, and processing business name applications.

As a member of the county board, Ferguson championed environmental issues. He pushed for Fresh AIRE—Arlington Initiative to Reduce Emissions—a five-year initiative to reduce Arlington County government's greenhouse gas emissions by 10 percent by 2012, with annual progress reports.

Ferguson has lived in both North and South Fairlington. He continues to own a unit in Fairlington Arbor.

In speaking to FCA, Ferguson returns to one of the early venues of his community leadership. He was FCA President in 1993-94.

He is a 1992 graduate of George Mason Law School.



DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



Learning from decades of creative Fairlington patios

In 32 years of landscaping Fairlington patios, I've seen some amazing creativity in various homeowners' gardens.

Here is a sampling, from both North and South Fairlington:

Elisabeth—In one of her side beds (18 inches wide by 10 inches long), there is a thick planting of periwinkle. It's a lateral-growing, lustrous evergreen ground cover with, yes, periwinkle flowers in summer. Hovering in the ground cover are two figurines—a rabbit and a cat.

Sharon—She has a dwarf crape myrtle inside a curved stone bed at the back fence. Around the tree are delicate ferns, mostly the Japanese painted cultivar. In a corner, she has an iron trellis draped with a clematis vine. In summer, the fragile tendrils produce star-shaped, lavender blooms, five-inches in diameter. On the fringe of her paver patio are pots filled with begonia and geranium.

Larry—Devoid of flowers, his evergreen garden still is lush and stately. In the back corner is a lyland cypress tree. Beneath it is a vigorous rhododendron. In another corner, there is a dogwood tree surrounded (at the trunk) by a dense planting of pachysandra, an evergreen ground cover showing white flowers in April and May. In one of his side beds, he has a row of nandina domestica 'Harbor Dwarfs.'

Bonnie—When she looks off her balcony, she sees three prominent camellias—two flowering in pink

and another in white. Each one blooms from December to February. In the corner is a beautyberry which offers clusters of glossy purple berries in autumn.

Paula—In her side garden against the brick of the building is a row of forsythia, whose branches become ablaze with yellow flowers in February and March. Come summer, three dwarf crape myrtles show flowers in purple, red and pink.

Mary—Speaking of side gardens, hers is gorgeous. There is a dogwood tree, red cedar tree, Japanese maple dwarfs and a cluster of mahonia—the last featuring fragrant yellow flowers in winter. Setting the landscaping table on the soil is a blanket of lamium, a ground cover

with white frosting (variegation) on the leaves and magenta flowers in summer.

Penny—In front of her home, a lonely lamp post is now comforted by a snuggling ornamental pea vine. Beneath the post is a circular planting of petunia (in summer) and pansy (in winter). Surrounding the bed is a bracelet of decorative rocks.

Tracy—There is a swath of thick grass in the center of her large patio yard. At the back fence is a contained wildflower garden created by her father. On the opposite side of the yard is a curved garden framed by a dry stack stone wall. Inside the wall is a collection of flowering evergreen specimens.

Marion—Outside her patio fence is a dense planting of iris, which forms a flowing lavender shawl draping the wood facade in summer. In the off-season, the bluish-green, sword-like leaves stand tall at almost 3 feet. Around the edge of the irises is a 4-inch-wide, mulched bed that defines it from the vast lawnscape beyond.

Karen—An evergreen lover, when she looks out her dining room, she can't miss seeing her Juniperus virginiana 'Burkii', bursting in wedgewood blue foliage all year long. It's a vertical specimen, reaching 7 feet tall with a modest width of 18 inches. The specimen fits neatly in the back left corner of her patio garden.






