Alexandria considers mobility improvements on King Street near Bradlee



The portion of King St. between Fairlington and Bradlee Shopping Center is the focus of a new transportation study.

The City of Alexandria is seeking community feedback on mobility, safety, access, and stormwater issues along King Street between N. Quaker Lane and Menokin Drive. The purpose of this project is to evaluate existing safety issues and develop concept designs for future improvements.

Sara Brandt-Vorel, Transportation Capital Project Manager with the Alex-

andria Department of Transportation & Environmental Services, will brief Fairlington residents on the King Street project at the October 11 meeting of the Fairlington Citizens Association. The meeting begins at 7 p.m. in the Fairlington Community Center, 3308 S. Stafford St.

The bulk of the study area is the portion of King St. that borders the Bradlee Shopping Center on one side and Fairlington Glen, Fairlington Arbor, and Fairlington Mews on the other.

The first component of the project is a public online survey launched in mid-September to gather community feedback on resident and visitor experiences navigating the study area. The feedback form is seeking input on experiences walking, biking, driving, or taking public transportation in the study area and opportunities to identify improvements.

Responses to the survey will help inform the recommendations the city will outline to guide subsequent design work. The survey will close in mid-October.

This portion of King Street was identified for multimodal improvements in the City's 2021 Alexandria Mobility Plan and is a priority location to install enhanced bicycle facilities and additional sidewalks to complete gaps in the City's existing bicycle and sidewalk network.

Safety improvements along this corridor will help the city reach its Vision Zero goal of eliminating all fatal and severe crashes.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Early voting is now open for the November 7 general election, which will yield a significant number of new officials serving Fairlington.

For the first time in years, Arlington voters will elect two new members to the Arlington County Board. This is the body that FCA most frequently interacts with on behalf of our community.

Our engagement with them ranges from things like the preservation of Park Shirlington, to questions of increased density, to the difficulty some residents are having in securing permits for interior improvements to their units.

It's important that the new board members understand our community. FCA will be reaching out to them after the election and will invite them to attend one of our meetings, stroll through the Fairlington Farmers Market, or consider attending some sort of town meeting with our residents.

The two Democratic candidates, Maureen Coffey and Susan Cunningham, are well known to many Fairlingtonians. Both dropped by our Fourth of July celebration. Independent Audrey Clement has visited Fairlington occasionally, as she has run for the county board multiple times. The other independent candidate is Juan Carlos Fierro.

Because Abingdon Elementary is our neighborhood school and a growing number of Fairlington students go to Gunston and Wakefield, the Arlington School Board has become more important to our residents.

The school board will also see a new member, as Reid Goldstein did not seek re-election. Miranda Turner is the active candidate.

Because of redistricting, most of Fairlington will have new voices in Richmond. We have less engagement with our delegation there, but we always invite them to an FCA meeting, and we occasionally need their help on things like highway and transportation issues.

For the state Senate voters will choose between incumbent Democrat Barbara Favola and Republican David Henshaw. Favola has not represented us in Richmond, but she was on the county board back when it considered the original plans for the redevelopment of Shirlington.

The Arlington part of Fairlington will have a new representative in the House of Delegates. Democratic incumbent Del. Alfonso Lopez faces independent Major Mike Webb.

FCA does not endorse candidates. We encourage you to consider all the candidates carefully. Most importantly, we urge you to vote.

Fairlington residents get update on pedestrian traffic and safety

On September 13, FCA hosted a community discussion regarding pedestrian and traffic safety in Fairlington. As part of this discussion, FCA welcomed participation from Christine Baker, project manager for Arlington County's Vision Zero program, and three officers from the Arlington County Police Department (ACPD).

Baker's presentation focused on Vision Zero's programmatic goals and the school zone retrofit process for Arlington County schools. Vision Zero's overarching

goal is "to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all."

Baker shared that Vision Zero staff recently finalized Arlington's school zone guidelines, which include specifications for setting speed limits in school zones. Per the Vision Zero Action Plan, staff recently updated the county code to allow for permanent 20 mph speed

limits on neighborhood streets within 600 feet of a school access point.

Also, Baker said that Vision Zero recently wrapped up discussions with Abingdon Elementary School staff regarding the planned (2024) school zone retrofit process that will commence to evaluate safety concerns or needs for the area around Abingdon Elementary.

She shared that the school zone retrofit process almost always results in

the deployment of some safety enhancements, which can include signage, crosswalks, and other enhancements, depending on the current safety needs of the school zone.

A point of concern raised by residents and FCA board members was the intersection of Abingdon St. and 29th St., specifically during the morning school drop-off and

Voting begins for November 7 general election

Early in-person voting began in late September for the November 7 general election. Arlington voters will choose two new members of the Arlington County Board and one new member of the school board, as well as selecting members of the State Senate and House of Delegates.

For the Arlington County Board, Christian Dorsey chose not to run again, and Katie Cristol resigned in July to take a position with a new economic development group in Tysons. She was replaced on an interim basis by Tannia Talento, who is not a candidate.

In June Democrats selected Maureen Coffey and Susan Cunningham as their candidates for county board. They are joined on the ballot by independents Juan Carlos Fierro and perennial candidate Audrey Clement.

In the school board race, Reid Goldstein is not seeking re-election. The two candidates for that slot are Miranda Turner, who won the May endorsement of Arlington

Democrats, and James Vell Rives, who suspended his campaign in late summer. In Virginia, school board races are non-partisan.

Redistricting put most of Fairlington into new state House and Senate districts. Control of both bodies in Richmond is at stake, though the races in the Fairlington area are not viewed as being as competitive as some in other parts of the state.

For the House of Delegates, Democratic incumbent Del. Alfonso Lopez is being challenged by independent Major Mike Webb. While Lopez has represented most of Arlington before, this is the first time his district has included Fairlington.


For those voters living in Alexandria, incumbent Del. Charniele Herring is unopposed.

Del. Elizabeth Bennett-Parker, who has represented

What does Indiana Jones have to do with pollinators?

If you are a fan of the Indiana Jones movies, you will remember Harrison Ford's character was afraid of snakes. Ironically, the actor has just had a snake named after him. The official name of Harrison Ford's slender Peruvian snake is Tachymenoides harrisonfordi.

In an interview with *The Hollywood Reporter*, Mr. Ford stated, "In all seriousness, this discovery is humbling. It's a reminder that there's still so much to learn about our wild world—and that humans are one small part of an impossibly vast biosphere. On this planet, all fates are intertwined, and right now, one million species are teetering on the edge of oblivion. We have an existential mandate to mend our broken relationship with nature and protect the places that sustain life."

A biology professor from Illinois Wesleyan University, Edgar Lehr, was part of the team who discovered

Harrison Ford's slender snake on an expedition to Peru.

In an interview with NPR, Professor Lehr when asked about the loss of biodiversity stated, "we as humans are part of biodiversity and if the surroundings are suffering—let's say frogs are disappearing, fewer insects, fewer pollinators—it goes back to us. So we are risking our own survival when we do not care about the health of nature."

If you are a regular reader of this column, you will have read the many articles addressing landscaping practices to support biodiversity. However, if you are not a regular reader, you may be surprised to hear that one practice to support biodiversity that is germane to fall is to leave the leaves.

Each fall the leaf blowers come out to blow away the leaves. The leaf blowers dislodge the leaf litter that is so

essential to insect life and insect life is so essential to birds and other wildlife. The vast majority of butterflies and moths overwinter in the landscape as an egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, or adult.

In our climate, the butterflies and moths use leaf litter (fallen leaves) for winter cover. Native bees burrow into the earth to hibernate and an extra thick layer of leaves protects them from the elements. Lose the leaves and lose the next generation of some pollinators.

Turf grass covers the majority of the land in Fairlington and is certainly one reason leaves are raked, mowed, and blown. Too many leaves are not good for turf, but a thin layer of leaves on the lawn has no ill effects. Leave the leaves around trees, shrubs, and perennials. The leaves will provide nutrients and valuable organic matter to protect the roots and enrich the soil.

Using leaves as mulch for a planting bed is a free alternative to buying bark mulch. The space under a tree is a critical place to keep leaves in place since many butterfly and moth caterpillars drop down from trees into the leaf litter to pupate and overwinter.

How can you protect the places that sustain life? Leave the leaves in your patio and ask your HOA Board to leave the leaves in foundation beds and around trees. The leaves will provide the next generation of pollinators with a nesting and overwintering habitat. most of Fairlington for the past two years, was redistricted into an adjacent district, where she is running unopposed.

For the Senate, Democratic incumbent Barbara Favola faces Republican David Henshaw in a reconfigured 40th District. Favola has not previously represented this part of Arlington in the state Senate.

Voters in the Alexandria part of Fairlington face a Senate choice between incumbent Democrat Adam Ebbin and Republican Sophia Moshasha. Ebbin previously represented all of Fairlington.

For all of the other county offices, the Democratic candidates face no opposition.

October 16 is the last day to register to vote or change your registration.

October 27 is the last day to request a mail ballot. All voters are eligible to vote by mail. Applications must be received in the Voter Registration Office by 5 p.m. Applications may be submitted online (http://vote.elections. virginia.gov) or by mail, fax, or email. For Alexandria,

email VoteAbsentee@alexandriava.gov; for Arlington it's absentee@arlingtonva.us.

Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked on or before November 7, 2023 and received by 12 p.m. November 13, 2023.

FCA asks county for zoning amendment

FCA has written the Arlington County board asking for a zoning amendment that would address the obstacles a number of Fairlington residents have encountered in seeking permits to make improvements to their units. These range from installing egress windows to opening up Clarendon kitchens to building out attics.

Recently when residents have sought permits to make these sorts of improvements, they have been required to go before the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) and seek a

variance from a county zoning requirement that buildings be set back a specified distance from each other.

Although the zoning code was adopted after Fairlington was constructed, it does not contain an exemption for Fairlington. The setback requirement is unrelated to the renovation work homeowners want to do.

Getting a variance adds time and expense to the renovation projects. The BZA now is routinely hearing multiple Fairlington variance requests each month, with owners expected to appear before the body to respond to questions about their request.

At its September meeting, the BZA considered six requests from Fairlington. It approved them by a narrow 3-2 margin, with some BZA members questioning the legal ability of the group to consider the Fairlington applications.

Expressing frustration with being asked to consider a growing number of applications from Fairlington, one BZA member urged Fairlington residents to write County Board members.

FCA's letter, on behalf of the Fairlington community, asks the county board to consider a comprehensive zoning ordinance amendment for the Fairlington area. This amendment should aim to establish guidelines that "align with the character and modernization of condominiums in our community," the letter says.

"By proactively updating the zoning ordinance to accommodate the unique needs of our neighborhood,

we can reduce the need for frequent variances and ensure a smoother permitting process for property owners while maintaining the overall integrity of Fairlington," it says.

FCA believes that a zoning ordinance amendment is the best approach to address the issue because of the need to ensure consistency, predictability, preservation of community character, community engagement, and long-term vision for the community.

According to FCA's letter, a zoning ordinance amendment will not only alleviate the burden on the BZA, but also provide a more transparent and predictable framework for homeowners and contractors alike.

FCA Board member Dianna Bentley, a local realtor, has taken the lead in working on this issue with county staff and county board members.

FCA President Guy Land was scheduled to raise this issue with the county board in the public comment section of its September 23 meeting.

The project will also consider stormwater drainage improvements and enhanced landscaping. FCA had written city officials about the need for drainage work in 2020. "The area suffers from poor drainage, frequent trash, and damaged trees. It is both unsightly and a potential health hazard," the letter said. "It's not a very welcoming introduction to the City of Alexandria and our community."

According to the city the general timeline calls for community engagement and issue identification in fall 2023 and spring 2024, conceptual design from spring 2024 through spring 2025, and detailed design from spring 2026 through 2027, followed by construction.

FROM THE PILE

10 small-sized woody shrubs for Zone 8

Here on the border of Arlington and Alexandria we straddle the 7b-8a hardiness zones. From suburban McLean and Falls Church above the fall line, to Old Town Alexandria, we can see as much as a 4-6 week

difference in frost-free dates along with significantly warmer temperatures in our urban heat islands.

This list of a few small-sized native woody plants that are commonly found in or suitable for USDA Hardiness Zone 8 will do well for you and most have extensive write-ups on the Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia *Tried and True Plants for the Mid-Atlantic* list online.

- **Dwarf yaupon holly** (Ilex vomitoria 'Nana'): this native evergreen shrub stays small and compact, making it a good choice for small gardens or as a low hedge. For a funky and distinctive upright version of this try weeping yaupon holly (I. vomitoria f.Pendula).
- **Dwarf palmetto** (sabal minor): a native palm that forms small clumps and is well-suited to Zone 8 climates. For a bit of the tropics in very protected locations.
- **Sweet Pepperbush, Summersweet** (Clethra alnifolia): a pollinator magnet that naturalizes readily in shady, damp places as well as coastal landscapes. Prefers wetter soils.
- **Dwarf Fothergilla** (Fothergilla gardenia): native to southeastern coastal areas, Dwarf Fothergilla shines three seasons of the year.
- **Chokeberry** (Aronia melanocarpa): this species has bird friendly berries and good fall color.
- Native Azaleas (Rhododendron spp.): there are

several native azalea species that are well-suited to Zone 8, such as the Flame Azalea (Rhododendron calendulaceum). Be sure to mind the pH of the soil for these

- **Dwarf Wax Myrtle** (Morella pumila): a compact version of the native Wax Myrtle, this shrub provides aromatic foliage and berries that attract birds.
- **Virginia Sweetspire** (Itea virginica): a deciduous, spreading shrub with fragrant white flowers and excellent fall foliage color. Also found at entrance to Fairlington Community Center.
- **Lil' Ditty viburnum** (Viburnum cassinoides): a good replacement for your hydrangeas that hate our heat and drought.
- **Sugar Shack® Buttonbush** (Cephalanthus occidentalis): this plant has very cool flowers and prefers wetter soils.

Tips and Tricks for Making the Most of your Landscape!

- For optimal plant performance choose plants that are suitable for your site conditions instead of planning to change your soil or light levels.
- "Full Sun" equals 8+ hours per day and the difference between "Part Sun" or "Part Shade" is huge depending on whether you have afternoon or morning shade. If you aren't sure what you have, do a home sun study.
- Changing soil chemistry is hard. Know your soil's pH level and drainage capacity BEFORE choosing a plant.
- Plant with a goal of having 70 percent of your landscape in native plants
- Group plants that like similar growing conditions together.

afternoon pick-up times. Baker shared that this type of intersection is difficult to address with safety measures, in part because the intersection experiences high traffic volumes primarily during only two times per day and has normal volume throughout the other times of day.

Arlington police have occasionally been monitoring that intersection to improve safety during peak school use hours.

Baker encouraged residents and FCA members to report concerns to Arlington County to help with data tracking and to potentially request an evaluation of the reported area by county staff.

In addition to the Vision Zero presentation, the ACPD Community Engagement Division had officers on hand to answer questions. One question posed to ACPD was regarding school crossing guards for Abingdon Elementary. ACPD shared that current demand and staffing only allows for one crossing guard located at the school crossing on 31st St. (near Park Shirlington).



ACPD informed residents and the FCA that more crossing guards are needed and interested residents are welcome to apply. ACPD noted there are currently 21 crossing guards to serve 23 schools and 35 crossings. More information about school crossing guards and how to apply can be found on the Arlington Public Schools website (https://www.apsva.us/transportation-services/school-crossing-guards/).

Baker reported that the county plans to deploy cameras in some school zones, but she cautioned that these would not be deployed at all schools. Instead, they would be rotated among school zones. "We don't know the locations yet," she said. The program calls for 10 cameras.

The county is currently negotiating over a potential vendor, with the goal of being able to implement the program later this fall.

FCA plans to continue working with county staff, ACPD, the Abingdon PTA, and interested residents in an effort to reduce the risk of accidents in the community.

Fairlington Diners


