Fresh biscuits, pastries, and exotic mushrooms arrive at weekly Farmers Market

Vendors are preparing for a bustling fall season at the Fairlington Farmers Market (FFM) with an abundance of fresh and colorful seasonal produce and foods. Three new vendors have newly arrived on the scene: Freed's Biscuit Company, J'aime Madeleine, and Sweet Pea Farm. Products available for purchase range from biscuits and breakfast sandwiches, to French pastries and desserts, to a variety of fresh-picked exotic mushrooms.

We caught up with Chef

Patrice Olivon, founder of J'aime Madeleine, to learn more about his story and what he enjoys about his craft.

Born in Casablanca, Morocco, Olivon was raised in Marseille, France, and started cooking and baking at home as a child. The first thing he made was a madeleine, a traditional French small cake.

His passion for cooking grew into a career and he spent his early years working in various positions ranging from serving as a cook on a ship route to working as a chef at a four-star hotel in Nice, France.

He immigrated to the United States with a friend and served as chef at Le Maison Blanche in Washington DC, the French Embassy, and the White House, where he cooked for two presidents and at world summits. After that he was program director at L'Academie de Cuisine, a former local cooking school.

"I taught chefs the basics and the tools that will never change," he explained. "I loved sharing my knowledge with the next generation of cooks."

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Have you been to the Fairlington Farmers Market this summer?

During a recent visit, I was captivated by the market's special vibe—dozens of families casually walk-

ing along the row of 20 vendors, home chefs carefully selecting fresh locally grown vegetables, curious kids watching woodblock printmaking, courtesy of the Arlington Art Truck, children and adults learning the essence of delicious madeleines, couples enjoying a breakfast snack. And neighbors catching up with neighbors whom they hadn't seen in weeks.

By almost any measure, the market has become a huge success, a key part of what's special about Fairlington.

Attendance has set records this summer. Almost a thousand people flow through the market on many Sundays. Vendors and market volunteers have noted the number of new market customers, building on the base of returning patrons. This boosts vendors' sales, making it likely they will return.

The market has enjoyed several new vendors this year, including a couple of temporary "pop-up" vendors whose popularity earned them an invitation to become a permanent part of the market.

It has achieved the vision FCA had when we first started talking about creating a neighborhood farmers market in 2013. Back then we thought it would serve several purposes. It would be a convenient source of fresh, local produce for Fairlington residents. It would be a community market, targeting our neighborhood and not the larger DC area. It would support local growers and food entrepreneurs. Most importantly, it would be a community gathering place.

It has done all of these things.

I'm particularly pleased with how it has become the place for people to meet, either just to socialize or to transact a little business. "Let's meet at the farmers market," has become an often-heard quote.

The market's success is due in part to a dedicated group of Fairlington volunteers who work each week. This summer new volunteers joined the stalwart group who have guided the market from its first days, helping spread the work around. All of us who enjoy the market owe the volunteers a word of thanks.

Also critical are the market sponsors, who make cash and in-kind contributions to keep it financially viable.

I hope to see you at the market this month. And I'd love to hear your thoughts about the market.

FCA announces blood drive to support Children's National Hospital

FCA and Fairlington Cares are holding a blood drive for Children's National Hospital (CNH) at the Fairlington Community Center, tentatively on Tuesday, September 21, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Check the FCA website and Facebook page for updates.

Summer is traditionally a time of reduced blood donations, and CNH says blood donations are down 70 percent this summer due to complications from the pandemic.

This is an opportunity to donate much needed blood for the children at CNH, without having to leave your neighborhood.

Donations will be by appointment only, please see the end of this article for eligibility requirements and information on how to sign up for an appointment.

All of the blood collected by the blood drive remains at the hospital to support children with cancer, sickle cell disease, rare disease, surgeries, and other chronic illness.

During FCA's two-day blood drive for CNH last year, Fairlington residents donated enough blood to help 145 children.

To make an appointment you can either contact the blood donor center at 202-476-5437, or schedule online at https://www.cnmcblooddonor.com. It is very important you keep your appointment to ensure we supply Children's National with the maximum amount of blood we can, given the limited number of spots due to COVID-19 precautions.

CNH basic blood donor eligibility requirements:

If you are uncertain of your eligibility, call the donor center during week days at 202-476-5437 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

- You must be 17 years old to donate and can donate whole blood every 56 days.
- Everyone must eat a very good breakfast/lunch on day of donation. Start to hydrate with water the day before and on the day of donation drink 16 ounces

of water to avoid reaction. No fasting before or after the donation.

- Photo ID is required at the time of registration.
- Typically, blood donation is approximately 35–40 minutes.
- Anyone who is not feeling well should refrain from donating blood. We want to reinforce that only those donors who feel healthy on the day of donation and who are completely asymptomatic

should donate, even excluding those who report symptoms from allergies.

Masking and social distancing protocols will be followed. For more information contact Sara Rasmussen at srazzz@aol.com



Art truck visits Fairlington

Emphasizing the theme "Words Matter: Honoring Arlington Educators," the Arlington Arts Truck visited the Fairlington Farmers Market in August.

Justyne Fischer, a DC-based social justice printmaker, distributed positive writing kits to encourage students to reflect on the impact of teachers, mentors, parents, and community members.

She selected five prominent educators and activists of varying backgrounds that reflect Arlington's diversity: Hazel Mahler, Dorothy Hamm, Dr. Evelyn

Reid Syphax, Dr. Phoebe Hall Knipling, and Dr. Emma Violand-Sanchez. Farmers market patrons picked up free prints of Fischer's woodcut portraits of these noted Arlington leaders.

Fischer maintains a printmaking studio at the Blue Studios Art Underground in Crystal City. She is best known for carving large woodblocks and printing by hand on sheer fabric. For the Art Truck project in Fairlington she used her smaller portable Conrad etching press to make impressions of the woodcut portraits.

The Arlington Art Truck is sponsored by the Cultural Affairs division of Arlington Economic Development. FCA is exploring ways of bringing the Art Truck or

other arts activities to Fairlington more frequently. FCA's recent online survey showed that residents would like to see a greater emphasis on the arts in Fairlington.

He then created Cooking Live!, an online cooking class, to fulfill his dream of making the home chef a better cook.

"All along, I always had the idea for J'aime Madeleine," he reflected. He dreamed of adding his own twist to the traditional madeleine recipe by adding different, natural flavors.

Three years ago, he opened his first booth at the Lubber Run farmers market, and was eager to be part of Fairlington's market.

"I love talking with customers and getting instant feedback. I listen to people and make what they want. I'm the one who makes the food and sells it, and I have to be proud of what I'm putting on the plate."

Each week Olivon brings 8 different flavors of mad-

eleines, elephant ears, cookies, and will soon offer jelly rolls. He is featured in the September issue of Arlington magazine, and you can follow him on Facebook and Instagram.

In addition to pastries, the FFM is a great place to pick up healthy choices for after school snacks and prepared meals for a quick breakfast, lunch, or dinner. The market is open each Sunday through November 21 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Fairlington Community Center (FCC).

The market also now offers To Go, a service shoppers can use to pre-order food from up to eight participating vendors (see the website for full list) with one payment, and pick up their products at each vendor's tent. For more information visit https://woso.co/fairlington.

ART and DASH to boost service in September

Arlington Transit (ART) and DASH, Alexandria's transit service, will implement new bus service options in September.

ART will return to full bus service on Tuesday, September 7. ART 53, 61, 62, and 74 will resume operating after being out of service since March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The ART 72 route will continue to operate on a modified weekday schedule. Riders are required to wear face masks when riding all ART buses.

DASH will launch a full overhaul of its bus service and start free service on September 5. The changes will touch all routes in the system, including the route that travels along King Street from Northern Virginia Community College to the Braddock Road Metro station. All DASH routes will be completely fare free.

The improvements mean that buses will run every 15 minutes or less throughout the day, seven days a week.

The new Line 31 runs from NOVA to Park Center, the Bradlee Shopping Center, and Alexandria City High School to the King Street Metro. It then continues through Old Town to the Braddock Road Metro. It replaces Routes AT5, AT6, and AT9.

The new Line 36A/B will connect Bradlee Shopping Center with the Shirlington Transit Station and Potomac Yard, going through Parkfairfax and along Glebe Road.


Alexandria estimates that making transit free for everyone could expand ridership by an estimated 23 percent, bring riders back to transit following the COVID-19 pandemic, help achieve the City's environmental goals, and benefit Alexandria's lower-income residents.

For the love of NATURE

The secret to healthy plants: it's all about the soil

Healthy soil means healthy plants. The first step to improving soil and keeping it healthy is understanding that healthy soil is alive. A teaspoon of healthy soil contains billions of microorganisms, like bacteria, fungi, nematodes, and other invertebrates, each of which plays an important role in the soil ecosystem.

Healthy soil is also about half solids and half pore space, which helps roots to penetrate and facilitates the exchange of oxygen, water, and nutrients. Protecting life in the soil and the soil structure is the starting point for healthy growth.

Roots have a hard time growing in compacted soil, and have a harder time taking up water and nutrients. Limit foot and equipment traffic. Instead create walking paths between plants. Till the soil as little as possible—tilling damages the networks of fungus, the open space, and the texture that helps keep plants healthy.

Here are a few best practices for making sure your soil is in its best shape.

Test your soil

Get in the habit of testing your soil regularly, when you are planting a new garden and then every 3 years or so. Soil tests from the Virginia Cooperative Extension report pH and nutrient content, plus soluble salts and percentage of organic matter, for around \$16. Test results include recommendations for improvements if needed, based on what you are growing. Soil test boxes and instructions are available for free at the Fairlington Community Center.

Add organic matter and keep soil covered

Add 2-3 inches of organic matter like organic mulch, leaf mold, or arborist wood chips once or twice a year. Organic matter decomposes and microorganisms work down, improving the soil and helping it retain water. You don't need to till it in—just put it down on top of the soil and leave it. September or October is a good time to add organic matter and let it work over the

Minimize or eliminate the use of pesticides

Pesticides don't just kill the pests targeted, they can also kill many other beneficial insects and microorganisms, including the ones in the soil. Instead, use garden fabric (or row cover) or other barriers on vegetables. Try hosing insect pests off with a blast of water, or just picking or scraping them off. Use lower impact insecticides (e.g., insecticidal soaps or neem oil or other horticultural oils) if necessary. But remember, insecticides, even low impact ones, kill more insects than those targeted. If insects are eating your plants, you are providing them food. Some 40 percent of insect species worldwide are declining. Living with damage that is only cosmetic helps them and our environment.

Healthy soil is the starting point for healthy plants and vegetables and beautiful gardens. Care for the soil, and the soil will care for your plants.



DOWN TO EARTH patio gardening



A guide to common landscaping terminology

Landscaping has its own language and sometimes the vocabulary is confusing. Here, I will share common (well, to me) terminology and what it means.

Ground cover: Refers to plants that grow laterally to cover the soil. Some of these plants (pachysandra) can reach six inches tall but most are prostrate (periwinkle, ajuga, some sedum and ivy). Many types of ground cover flower. Periwinkle and ajuga have blue flowers while sedum and lamium have pink flowers. Pachysandra flowers are white.

Dwarf trees: Are usually between 8-10 feet tall which really is on the small side for a tree. Dwarf trees fit well in patios and courtyards since they don't get too tall or wide. Japanese Maples come tall (Bloodgood) or small in the shape of a mushroom. These get wide but only about 3-4 feet tall. Crape myrtle trees come in three sizes. Dwarfs reach 9-feet tall and about 4-feet wide. Look for tonto (fuchsia flowers), hopi (light pink) or zuni (lavender). The styrax or Japanese snowbell is another small tree with fragrant, white flowers and yellow stamens.

Adaptability: Usually refers to sun and shade specifications. Some specimens need sun (lilac, crape myrtle, salvia) and others prefer shade (mahonia, aucuba, camellia) but some take full sun or shade (cherry laurel, weigela, euonymus 'green spire,' astilbe, nandina and azalea).

Herbaceous: Means non-woody. Think of herbs (root word of herbaceous) which have no woody parts (aside from a mature rosemary plant). Perennials are herbaceous, meaning their stems are pliable and flimsy, not stiff and rigid. Since their parts are softer and stems/branches thinner, their root balls are smaller and easier to handle and plant in the soil. When it comes to shrubs and trees, most are woody and non-herbaceous.

Low-maintenance: This is an ideal landscaping trait in today's busy world. If you travel and have nobody to water, then low-maintenance plants are a necessity. Such plants are drought and heat tolerant and thus, need less watering. They

also keep their shapes and don't have branches that become leggy and need regular pruning. These plants seldom die (liriope, hosta, salvia, euonymus, laurel, abelia) so you don't have to dig them out and replace them. Low maintenance means less work for the gardener.

Perennial: As it sounds, it returns every year, though most have periods of dormancy (in winter). Perennials are good for DIY gardeners since they weigh little and are easier to pack into the trunk of your vehicle. Most grow about one foot tall with a similar spread. Some perennials are evergreen (coral bells, lenten rose and salvia) though their appearance degrades in cold weather. Others are referred to as tender perennials which means they overwinter modestly. That means they keep their shapes but may get brownish and scraggly looking until the warm temperatures of Spring arrives. Some like full sun (salvia, phlox, day lily, columbine) whereas other perennials like shade (mazus, brunnera, bleeding heart and fern).

Espalier: Think vertical, like a vine. This can be any plant that has a modest width or that needs the support of a trellis. Espaliered plants look beautiful against a fence or brick wall. And they take up minimal space in the garden since their habit is "flat and narrow." Espaliered plants are perfect if you have narrow beds with little soil space.






