Now that school has started, Fairlington's roads will once again include multiple school bus routes across the community. Please drive slowly and carefully. Last month's community engagement meeting by the Arlington County Police Department (ACPD) and Vision Zero at the Fairlington Community Center (FCC) highlighted the importance of all of us helping keep residents safe: look both ways before crossing at marked crosswalks, wear a bike helmet, and never pass a school bus while stopped and lights flashing (it's also illegal). We can all do our part.

This month, FCA will coordinate two events. We will hold our annual Outdoor Movie Night on the FCC field on Saturday, September 27. All Fairlintonians are invited to bring blankets, chairs, and snacks and watch together.

Julius D. "JD" Spain, Sr., will speak to the Fairlington community at the FCA monthly meeting on Wednesday, September 10, at 7 p.m. at the Fairlington Community Center, 3308 S. Stafford St. Spain was elected in the 2024 November County Board General Election, the first to use Ranked Choice Voting. He visited Fairlington recently for the July 4th Parade.

Spain is a decorated retired combat veteran of the United States Marine Corps with 26 years of service. He has held operational and diplomatic roles overseas and for key U.S. officials, including the U.S. President. Spain served in other capacities for the U.S. Senate, Marine Corps Office of Legislative Affairs, and DoD Office of Inspector General.

With deep civic roots in Arlington and a commitment to fostering equitable communities, Spain was appointed by the County Board to serve on the Civil Service Commission to advise on county policies. He was elected president of the Arlington branch of NAACP, as well as regional VP for Virginia NAACP. He and his wife of 32 years have lived in Arlington since 2009; their three children are graduates of Arlington Public Schools.

Spain will speak on county-related issues of interest to Fairlington, as well as take questions and listen to concerns. All Fairlington residents are welcome.



ACPD & Vision Zero Brief Community on Safety

On August 7, ACPD's <u>Community Engagement Team</u>, led by Sergeant Sarah Butzer, and representatives from the County's <u>Vision Zero</u> through the Department of Environment (DES), presented jointly on transportation safety and other public concerns. This new community outreach initiative will occur quarterly countywide and replace neighborhood or civic association briefings, as ACPD no longer has adequate staffing for smaller meetings.

Vision Zero focused on back-to-school safety tips and measures including speed cameras in certain school zones (Abingdon is not currently one), wearing a biking helmet (it is the law for 14 and under), looking both ways before entering marked crosswalks, and using designated school pick-up and drop-off zones. Presenters also reminded residents that using a hand-held communication device while driving is illegal in Virginia and e-scooter riders must be 18 years or older.

ACPD cautioned residents about scams, particularly those using texts. Common ones circulating now involve requests to pay unpaid tolls and send upfront money to contractors. Residents should always be suspicious if messages include demands or pressure to send money or gift cards quickly.

ACPD also warned against "spoofing" calls that look like official county telephone numbers including those impersonating ACPD officers. ACPD will never request money in lieu of an arrest warrant.

In response to resident concerns about immigration enforcement in Arlington, ACPD stated they do not participate in these procedures. ACPD will always be clearly identified with names and badges. If residents are concerned about enforcement without clearly identifiable credentials or are concerned for their safety, they can call 911.

For the Love of Nature

Fairlington Villages Leads the Way in Sustainable Condo Landscaping

Fairlington Villages is a <u>leader among area condo associations</u> in the use of environmentally friendly landscaping practices. The Villages adds native trees each year via Arlington's Tree Canopy Fund, installed 10 rain gardens to manage stormwater, discontinued herbicides on lawn, uses organic compost tea as fertilizer, added native plant gardens in common areas, and leaves snags (partial trunks of dead trees left standing) where safe and feasible, to support birds and wildlife. In 2014, the Villages was even certified as an Audubon at Home Wildlife Sanctuary.

Other Fairlington associations are adopting more sustainable practices too. A few highlights include:

• The **Commons** pulls invasive species, installs native trees and plants in common areas, and leaves snags where safe and appropriate.

- · The Glen does not use herbicides.
- The Green mulches grass clippings back into turf for a natural slowrelease fertilizer.
- · The Mews uses organic herbicides and fertilizers.
- The Meadows uses an organic iron chelate to manage weeds in turf.

Government Updates

Voter Registration & Early Voting

The next important Virginia election is Tuesday, November 4, and all eligible adults are encouraged to vote. Voter registration is easy: Register on the <u>Virginia Voter Information – Citizen Portal</u>, using your Virginia DMV-issued ID, or check your registration status. If you moved since the last time you voted, you must update your registration with your current address. **Voter registration ends on Friday, October 24, which is als the last date to request a ballot by mail.** (If you miss the deadline, you can go to your polling place, register, and cast a provisional ballot.)

On November 4, Arlingtonians will be voting for Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, three House of Delegates members (district-specific), one County Board member, and one School Board member.

Alexandria races will include Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, House of Delegates, Commonwealth's Attorney, and Sheriff

In-person early voting starts Thursday, September 19. Please check full details and times/places to vote early: <u>Arlington</u> or <u>Alexandria</u>.
